Counts are up at every site except Highland where they remain steady. 2017 meals are already exceeding 2016 meals by 500. Based on this, donations have increased as well. Meal prices also increased by 25 cents. Meals on Wheels program has been in the news a lot but this doesn't affect SUN as most of their grant money comes from the Older Americans Act (OAA), which is a different funding source. State of Wisconsin is more generous than other states and matches federal funding up to 45%, which helps tremendously. SUN received a \$625 donation from the American Legion after their brat sale. They also received a generous donation from the Presbyterian Church in Muscoda to go towards the Avoca community. Candy Wilson is the new full-time cook/manager at Arena Manor. She had been a substitute for a number of years and was hired permanently when Mona Summers retired.  b) L&A: Report provided.
