#4	<ul> <li>A Land Conservation report and update was provided by Jim McCauley.</li> <li>Scott Godfrey provided a monthly Planning and Zoning report.</li> </ul>	Departmental Reports
#5	<ul> <li>Motion by Sup Griffiths, second, Sup. Meek to list the Fountain Street Property at \$139,000 as well as ask Administrator Kephart to also offer "attractive" lease to draw in a new business from inside/outside the County and/or negotiate a structure a "Land Contract". Motion adopted.</li> <li>There was committee consensus that Administrator Kephart should prepare a Request For Proposals for land rent at the county farm.</li> <li>Corporation Counsel reported that the Sylvan Road property is still in litigation and the purchase offer has been extended with Prairie Enthusiasts.</li> <li>Administrator Kephart reported that Judge Dyke shared concerns on the proposed Courthouse Security Renovation plan and asked that they be addressed. The Architects have met with the Public Safety team and are working on suggested modifications (fees are included in original proposal). Committee consensus is that the full board should be updated on the status of this proposal at either the December or January meeting.</li> <li>Committee reviewed a document drafted by the Bloomfield Environmental Services Director detailing large capital maintenance needs at Bloomfield</li> <li>Motion by Sup Weaver, seconded Sup Meek to decline an offer to permanently place a large (historic) mural in the Courthouse. 	presented a resolution requesting it be passed and sent to the state legislature	Development
	in support of legislation that would allow private investors to produce and	
	lease "on site clean energy" without being classified as Public Utilities.	
	Motion by Sup Weaver, 2 <sup>nd</sup> Sup Meek to adopt a resolution in support of	
	Clean Energy Choice for Wisconsin and forward on to the County Board.

	The Planning Director updated the committee on the regional CDBG Housing	
	Program and current publicly funded housing options.	
	Planning Director Godfrey presented a Wisconsin Economic Development	
	Association proposal offering economic development training for elected	
	officials. Central to the discussion was a "rumor" that the Iowa County	
	Economic Development Corporation might cease to function at the end of	
	2013 due to funding shortfalls. (Though in 2014 Iowa County budget	
	provides more funds for economic development than was budgeted in 2013	
	but it is less than they requested. IACEDC has been unable to secure significant funding from grants, municipalities or private sources.) Some	
	members suggest that little or no county funds should be allocated to	
	economic development. Other members believe that the county should play	
	an important, if limited, role in aiding and directing entrepreneurs to	
	resources. Some members of the committee did suggest that the Iowa County	
	Administrator should plan for the possibility that the IAEDC could cease to	
	function and determine how County Government might provide any critical	
	economic development services that were once provided by IACEDC. The	
	committee did not act on the proposal for elected county board supervisors to	
	participate in the Wisconsin Economic Development Association training.
