

**Resolution No. 6-0511**

**Resolution Recommending Budget Amendments for 2011  
Transfer of \$480,000 from the General Fund for the  
Public Safety Communications Project**

**TO THE HONORABLE IOWA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

**WHEREAS**, at the May 3, 2011 Justice Committee and at the May 10, 2011 Administrative Services Committee meetings, the committees recommended the funding of \$480,000 for the Public Safety Communication Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Public Safety Communications Project has a projected cost of \$1,500,000 and the funding for this project consist of \$800,000 from a grant funded through the Office of Justice Assistance, \$221,575.34 from 2010 recommended carryover funds, and the \$480,000 recommended transfer of funds from the general fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the Justice and Administrative Services Committee recognizes that the Social Services Department returned funds in excess of \$900,000 to the General Fund as of December 31, 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, the Justice and Administrative Services Committee recommends transferring funds from General Fund to the Capital Projects Fund for the Public Safety Communications Project in the amount of \$480,000; and

**WHEREAS**, the Administrative Services Committee does hereby recommend to the Iowa County Board of Supervisors a transfer of funds from the Iowa County General Fund to the Capital Projects Funds to fund the Public Safety Communications Project:

The Iowa County Board Supervisors adopts the recommendations of the Administrative Services Committee and approves the transfer of funds from the General Fund to the Capital Projects Fund to fund the Public Safety Communications Project. The Board further directs the County Clerk to publish this Resolution pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute number 65.90 (5)(a) for the statutory requirement.
