JEFFERSON COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT 2018 RUBENZAHL. KNUDSEN & ASSOCIATES CONTRACT

We are requesting a Board of Legislators resolution to be allowed to enter into a new contract with Rubenzahl, Knudsen and Associates for Court-ordered adult and juvenile sexual offender evaluations, assessments, treatment, and counseling.

For the juveniles, treatment components consist of individual and group therapy for the youth; and family therapy to include all or parts of the family. They also stress group therapy for the parents to provide a support network and a forum to teach them the information that the youth are learning. The program coordinates with any available home-based therapy to assist the family in using the skills they have learned, address issues that exist for the family in the community and school, and be available for crisis intervention services.

Part of the program's purpose is to identify which elements of the family system contributing to sexually abusive behavior are not working, and to help the family modify these dysfunctional elements in order to heal the pain of sexual abuse.

A relapse prevention approach is specifically designed to increase the youth's awareness and range of choices concerning their behavior, and to develop specific coping skills and self-control to prevent a return to the offensive conduct.

Rubenzahl, Knudsen and Associates is also certified for the treatment of adult sexual offenders and the program will now be utilized to provide court-ordered evaluations, assessments and treatment for adult sexual offenders.

In order to provide these services, we have a Professional Fees line in our budget. This line is also used for Rubenzahl, Knudsen and Associates psychological evaluations.

2017 COSTS:

From January 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017, we had 35 juvenile and adult Probationers receive services from RKA for evaluations and counseling at a cost of \$59,877.50 for the period. We request that parents and adult Probationers make full payment or a reasonable co-payment if possible. We are requesting to renew our contract with Rubenzahl, Knudsen and Associates to provide these services for the period January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018.

2018 PROPOSED CONTRACT:

The Rubenzahl, Knudsen and Associates rates for 2018 will be \$80.00 per hour for evaluation and individual counseling; \$47.50 per hour for group counseling; \$350 for requested juvenile evaluations, and \$75.00 per hour when providing testimony in court relative to the services performed under the contract. The total compensation for the period of this contract shall not exceed the sum of \$95,000.00.

Re-Authorizing an Agreement with Jefferson County Stormwater Municipal Coalition

Whereas, The United States Bureau of the Census has designated an area of Jefferson County as an "urbanized area" in excess of 50,000 residents based on the 2010 Census population data, and
Whereas, The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency requires that municipalities which operate a municipal storm water sewer system (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)) within said area are required to obtain a permit through the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), to discharge stormwater, for the purpose of reducing pollution, and
Whereas, The DEC has informed the County that it must obtain said permit and develop and implement a plan for those areas within the urbanized area in which it is responsible for a stormwater system, and
Whereas, The Towns of LeRay, Rutland and Watertown, the Villages of Black River, Brownville, Carthage and West Carthage, City of Watertown and Jefferson County have formed a coalition to combine their resources for the purpose of developing and implementing their plans, and
Whereas, The Jefferson County Soil & Water Conservation District is acting as staff consultants to said coalition, and
Whereas, There is a membership fee of \$1,500 annually for said coalition members, and

2017 Planning Department Report September and October

The overall service objective of the Department of Planning is to provide quality technical assistance to the County and its local municipalities within the Department's four established workplan areas: County Planning and Economic Development, Community Planning and Development, Resource and Environmental Management, and Information, Demographic, and data Services.

COUNTY PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

2015 Award Year. During September and October \$94,684 was drawn down in support of nine projects and program development. The Annual Performance Report was submitted to NYSHCR.

2016 Award year. During September and October \$1,410 was drawn down in support of three projects.

North Country HOME Consortium. The County continues to serve as the lead entity to administer the multi-county (Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence) Consortium, which acts as a direct entitlement community for Federal HOME housing funds. During September and October \$80,179 in Federal HOME funds were expended; representing activity on five housing assistance projects.
