Whereas, The Board of Legislators formally received notification from the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets to commence the Eight Year Review of the Jefferson County North Agricultural District, No. 2, and
Whereas, In accordance with the provisions of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law, Article 25AA, as amended, a review notice was published and the Jefferson County North Agricultural District, No. 2 was placed on file in the County Clerk's Office for a thirty (30) day review and modification period, and
Whereas, During the review period, 31,068 acres of land was requested to be added and 19 acres of land was requested to be removed from the District, and
Whereas, The District and proposed modifications were referred to the Jefferson County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board for its review and recommendations, and
Whereas, The report of the County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board with its recommendation to modify and re-establish the district for eight years, including a total of 31,060 acreas, have been duly received by this Board of Legislators, and
Whereas, A public hearing was held on September 8, 2015 at which time consideration was given to the original Agricultural District, the recommendations of the County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board, and the proposed modifications to the District.

July / August 2015 Highlights

The overall service objective of the Department of Planning is the provision of quality technical assistance to the County and its local municipalities within the Department's four established workplan areas: County Planning and Economic Development, Community Planning and Development, Resource and Environmental Management, and Information, Demographic, and Data Services. (Note: GIS tasks are now listed under the appropriate workplan heading.)

July/August project status and highlights within these major categories were as follows:

COUNTY PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

2013 Award Year - \$750,000. During July and August, more than \$132,328 was drawn down in support of thirteen owner occupied housing rehabilitation projects across the County. During this same time period, seven new projects were approved for funding.

Over 165 owner occupied housing rehabilitation projects have been funded to date throughout the County utilizing the 2007- 2013 award year grants.

2014 Award Year - \$750,000. The County was notified in July by the New York State Office of Community Renewal of its eighth consecutive successful award for owner-occupied rehabilitation. The funds will once again be used to assist income eligible homeowners rehabilitate homes at scattered sites throughout the County.

Staff with Avalon Associates submitted the County's ninth consecutive CDBG application for housing rehabilitation funds. Applications were due to the NYS Office of Community Renewal on September 25, 2015.

Staff also began coordination with Avalon Associates for the completion of the County's Environmental Review for the 2014 CDBG award.

North Country HOME Consortium

The County continues to serve as the lead entity to administer the multi-county (Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence) Consortium, which acts as a direct entitlement community for Federal HOME housing funds. During July and August, \$34,814 in Federal HOME funds was expended representing activity on four housing assistance projects in the Jefferson and Lewis County area.

Staff began preparation of the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) to HUD for the 2015 funding year.

Staff conducted a HOME monitoring at Frontier Housing, Inc.

Staff attended a Fair Housing workshop in Lewis County in support of their Analysis of Impediments process.

Staff mapped HOME project sites for July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

County Planning Board

Staff assisted the County Planning Board in preparing for the July and August meetings through the review of seven NYS General Municipal Law zoning actions and project reviews. The Board transmitted advisory and technical assistance comments back to the referring municipalities. July projects reviewed included: a planned development district and special use permit for a seasonal mobile home park in the Town of Lyme; site plan review for a retail store in the Town of Theresa; and zoning text amendments for solar energy regulations in the Town of Watertown.

August projects included: area variance for a transmission line in the Town of Champion; site plan review for an office building in the Town of Watertown; and a site plan review to replace the McDonald's in the Village of West Carthage.

Other Activities

Attended Tree Watertown committee meeting.

Staff attended two meetings of the Transit Advisory Committee, part of the newly formed Watertown Jefferson County Transportation Council, as well as updated the Jefferson County Coordinated Transportation Plan.

COMMUNITY PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Municipal Project Assistance

Clayton (T) – Staff met with the joint Town/Village Comprehensive Plan Committee. The Committee reviewed summaries of current plans that have an impact on land use.

Hounsfield (T) – Staff met with the Planning Board, Town Board, and Zoning Board of Appeals members, to discuss zoning districts in and around the airport. Staff mapped zoning overlaid on aerial imagery, created a map showing potential changes to the industrial zone within the airport footprint, and created two maps of the proposed industrial zone showing potential changes versus current zoning, and new zoning districts with aerial imagery.

Lyme (T) – Staff met with the Zoning Committee to discuss potential definition clarifications, new definitions for common uses, and the need for updated definitions. The Waterfront Zoning District potential updates were also discussed to help clarify the district where needed.

Wilna (T) - Staff made revisions to a draft zoning map as requested by Town.

Municipal Land Use Training

Staff coordinated the September training session conducted by staff from the NY Department of State. There were 52 participants.

RESOURCE AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Agriculture and Agricultural Districts

Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board – Staff coordinated a meeting and presented reports on the North Agricultural District Review and the 2015 Annual Inclusion Process.

Agricultural and Farmland Protection Plan update - Staff continued to review the draft plan.

North Agricultural District Review – Developed the report on the 9-yr Review and presented it at the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board meeting on August 3. Maps were created showing land in proposed North District versus prime farmland cited in the Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board Plan, development pressure in the North District, and proposed North District versus agriculture value assessments or assessed land uses. The public hearing was held on September 8th.

2015 Annual Inclusion Process – Developed a summary of the requested inclusions and presented the requests at the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board meeting. Staff checked parcel requests against current districts for redundancy, mapped individual inclusions for site visits, and mapped proposed southern districts for County. The public hearing was held on September 8th.

Snowmobile Grant-in-Aid Program

Staff compiled and submitted the annual application which allows clubs to continue to receive reimbursement funds through NYS OPRHP.

Miscellaneous

Staff attended the bi-monthly Jefferson County Municipal Separate Stormwater Sewer Systems (MS4) Coalition meeting as well as the Stormwater Coordinator sub-group meeting.

INFORMATION, DEMOGRAPHIC, AND DATA SERVICES

General Technical Assistance

Responded to callers, emails, and walk-ins with requests concerning municipal zoning maps, parcels, election districts, the county map viewer, and agricultural districts.

Other Geographic Information System (GIS) Tasks (not associated with projects above)

For various requests and projects, created or refined the following GIS maps: Locator for the County Planning Board meeting place, individual parcel maps for proposed Emergency Management Department radio tower sites, and population centers within minority population
