For clarification purposes, question 15 was checked "yes" for Indiana Brown Bat which is listed as endangered; this species may be found on the Jefferson Community College site/property where there are trees larger than 6" DBH onsite. The source if this information is the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Potential impacts to this endangered species as a result of this project will be mitigated by only allowing cutting of trees 6" DBH or larger between October 31st and April 1st. This note has been placed on the site construction drawings.

2015 Tax Apportionment Summary

Attached please find the 2015 Apportionment Grand total report along with a copy of the same from 2014 for comparisons.

A couple of items to look at:

- 1. There was \$125,000 less sales taxes applied in 2015 by towns to lower the county levy. This year the Town of Leray was the only town to apply sales tax.
- 2. The total amount of relevied, or returned School and Village Taxes rose by \$343,770.53 or approximately 8%
- 3. While we are all aware about the County Levy increase, the total amount of town taxes levied countywide rose by \$384,943 or 4.5%. Please remember this is a snapshot looking at the countywide total.
- 4. Under special districts, water delinquent and sewer delinquents are the amount of unpaid water and sewer bills that towns have added to the tax bills. Districts are made whole by the County for those that remain unpaid after collection period and become part of a tax lien moving forward.
