Remarks:

- 1. The main event this month was the 32d Annual Senior Appreciation Picnic at Westcott Beach State Park. We had to exercise the rain date and move the event from the original date of 7/23 to the rain date of 7/24. Fortunately, the weather on the 24th was beautiful and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. We raffled off about 65 gifts that were donated by local merchants. As I had hoped, the nurse did not have to respond to any health issues and the Summer Youth participants from the WorkPlace did another great job.
- 2. NY Connects staff (Sheila) participated in an informational session about agency/senior services with the Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired Support Group in Adams.
- 3. During the Jefferson County Fair, the agency manned a booth and distributed a range of information related to agency/senior services.
- 4. The agency received 640 Farmers Market Coupon booklets. Each booklet allows the holder to purchase \$20.00 of fresh, locally grown, produce from select vendors at Farmer's Markets throughout the County. The Coupons are available at the agency and staff have distributed them at various sites throughout the County. Distribution of the remaining Coupon Books continues in to August.

Behavioral Health Update

August 13, 2014

Meeting with NYSOMH Commissioner Sullivan: Community Services Directors from St Lawrence, Jefferson, and Chemung counties were joined with NYS Conference of Mental Hygiene Directors representatives, to meet with Ann Sullivan, Commissioner of the NYS Office of Mental Health and senior staff. The meeting was set to discuss the redeployment of state workers as the NYS Psychiatric system reduces capacity. The discussion was very frank and included addressing the process, which bypassed local plans, and the consideration of community based services to address the expected increase in intensive patient needs. Further discussions are planned as well as an additional meeting with the Commissioner scheduled for early September.

Therapeutic Respite for Youth: The Children's Home of Jefferson County has been awarded a 1.54 million dollar grant from New York State to create a program that will serve the St Lawrence, Lewis and Jefferson county area. The program is designed to prevent hospitalizations through a short term respite and intervention process. It will be located on the CHJC campus.

2014 Athena Award: Community Services Board member Erika Flint has been selected as the recipient of the 2014 Athena Award which recognizes an individual for providing valuable service to the community and for actively assisting woman to reach their full leadership potential. Erika is a valuable member of our Mental Health Committee and the Full CSB. Congratulations to Erika.

PAR Applications Approved: Applications submitted by Samaritan Medical Center for additional inpatient beds, and by Transitional Living Services for a Satellite Outpatient Clinic have been approved by the NYS Office of Mental Health. Both applications will help strengthen the local Mental Health Service system of care.
