Exempting Certain Public Water System Tax Parcels from County Real Property Tax
By Legislator:
Whereas, Pursuant to Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) Section 406(1), real property owned by a municipal corporation within its corporate limits held for a public use shall be exempt from taxation, and
Whereas, Pursuant to RPTL Section 406(3), real property owned by a municipal corporation not within its corporate limits used as part of a water or sewer system may be exempt from taxation if the municipality within which it is located agrees to do so in writing, and
Whereas, In Jefferson County, the large majority of water and sewer systems are either wholly contained within the municipalities which own them, are owned by a State authority which is wholly exempt from taxation, or are exempt by the application of RPTL 406(3), and
Whereas, This Board of Legislators believes that it is good public policy to encourage the availability of safe public water and sewer services to those members of the public who desire them, and
Whereas, Toward that end, the Board does not believe it is appropriate to levy taxes on such municipally owned property, and
Whereas, There are two known parcels within the County that could be exempt through the application of RPTL but are not, and
Whereas, Through RPTL Section 406(3), the County has the authority to exempt such property for the purposes of its own levy even when the local municipality does not, and
Whereas, It is the desire of Jefferson County to exempt such property from County real property taxes.
Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the real property tax parcels 225089-46.00-1-1.1-501 (owned by the Village of Theresa and assessed at \$800,000) and 225089-47.00-2-1501 (owned by the Village of Philadelphia and assessed at \$46,671), in the Town of Philadelphia are hereby exempt from County real property taxes in accordance with Real Property Tax Law Section 406(3).

ARTICLE I

Modify B. Compensation to read as follows:

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Employees shall receive a salary increase of 1% effective January 1, 2011; a 2% increase effective January 1, 2012; and a 2% increase effective January 1, 2013; in accordance with Appendix A. Permanent full-time employees employed on or before January 1, 2012 will receive a one -time payment of \$600 in the first full payroll period in June 2012 (not added to Appendix A). In addition, employees not at the top of the grade shall move to the next step on January 1, 2011, and January 1, 2012 and January 1, 2013 No employee may exceed the maximum of the grade. Employees hired after July 1st in each year shall not be eligible for step movement the following year. Retroactive salary payments shall be made to current employees only.

ARTICLE VII - HOSPITALIZATION

Modify Section A. to read as follows:

The Employer will provide the Jefferson County Government Employees Health Benefits Program in accordance with the plan document as amended in the document "Health Benefit Amendments II". Group Health Incorporated, Pomco Group, or Excellus BlueCross BlueShield will act as third party administrator for the program.

Effective with the first full payroll period following ratification of this agreement, the employee cost of individual coverage is \$74.00 per biweekly pay period. The employee cost of family coverage is \$124.00 per bi-weekly pay period. Effective January 1, 2013, the employee cost of individual coverage is \$74.00 per bi-weekly pay period. The employee cost of family coverage is \$130.00 per bi-weekly pay period.

Modify Section B. to read as follows:

An employee shall be entitled to enrollment in the Health Insurance Plan after ninety (90) days of continuous employment.
