Whereas, NYS Public Health Law charges municipal public health services with promoting health and preventing illness while controlling and mitigating the extent of infectious diseases of an active and chronic nature, and

Whereas, The rabies outbreak continues and challenges the non-outbreak baited areas, while cases in the fourteen year outbreak baited areas have decreased, and

Whereas, Studies have shown that wildlife oral immunization is a cost effective and successful means of impeding the progression of the rabies virus into unaffected areas of New York State and eliminating rabies in affected areas, and

Whereas, The U.S. Department of Agriculture is proposing the continuation of the wildlife rabies oral vaccination baiting program commenced in this region in 1995 under the auspices of Cornell University, and is requesting Jefferson County continuing financial participation in the program, 36% of which cost is eligible for state aid reimbursement under Article 6 of the Public Health Law, and

Whereas, Funding for Jefferson County participation in the wildlife rabies oral vaccination program was included in the 2009 Adopted County Budget in order to purchase vaccine baits instead of providing funding.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That Jefferson County enter into an agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture for continuation of the wildlife rabies oral vaccination program for the period August 1, 2009 through July 31, 2010, at an initial operating expense of up to \$30,000, with provision for a one year renewal contingent on continued funding by the County, and be it further

Legislator Gray said he is opposed to the resolution, not the appointee, because he does not believe an executive director of an agency should serve as a voting member on the board of another agency. He felt it would be more appropriate for this individual to serve on an ex-officio basis.

Legislators Burto and Zando advised that they would not be supporting the resolution because they had received the resume of another individual and gave their word that they would support that individual, but commended Legislator Ormsby and the selection committee for their due diligence.

Legislator Fitzpatrick stated that she also received a call from another candidate and received the resume right away, but she would support Mr. LaFave's appointment.

Legislator Ormsby stated that both candidates were worthy of the position and the Committee did go through a very open, objective interview process and there was a strong consensus to recommend Mr. LaFave. As the two agencies are not conflicting or competing for funding with each other, he did not envision Mr. LaFave's position being problemmatic in serving on the TIBA Board. He said it was agreed that if there ever became a situation where there was a conflict Mr. LaFave would not participate. He added that out of respect for Dutch Grant whose passing provided this opening Mr. LaFave did wait for a while to submit his resume for consideration.

Legislator St.Croix, a member of the interview committee, stated that there is no doubt in his mind that the right candidate was approved. While they both were highly rated Mr. LaFave was very thorough, spoke well and won the appointment in the interview process.

Resolution No. 172

Supporting the Construction of a Four Lane Highway in Clinton, Franklin, Jefferson and St. Lawrence Counties and Urging Elected Officials to Promote Said Project

Whereas, The economic impact of North Country transportation improvements is a key finding of the Northern Tier Expressway Corridor Study, and

Whereas, The economic development impact analysis has measured the value to the regional economy of efficiency gains through user benefits such as reductions in travel time, reductions in operating costs, and reductions in accidents due to improved safety, and

Whereas, The gains through increased social and economic development opportunities due to improved transportation access will reduce unemployment rates, reduce government transfer payments such as social welfare and unemployment insurance, and increase employment in the region, and

Whereas, The transportation improvements can enhance access to labor, customer, tourism and supplier markets, as well as to intermodal transportation facilities, making the overall region more attractive to transportation-dependent industries, and

Whereas, The construction of a four-lane highway within the boundaries of Clinton, Franklin, Jefferson and St. Lawrence counties will begin to address the transportation improvements necessary to foster such economic growth.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, That Jefferson County urges New York State Acting

Commissioner of Transportation, Mr. Stanley Gee, to cooperate with the involved counties to push for the construction of a four-lane highway within Clinton, Franklin, Jefferson and St. Lawrence counties, and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Acting Commissioner Gee, Governor Paterson, Senator Aubertine, and Assemblywomen Scozzafava and Russell.

Legislator Burto said he would not support the resolution due to a lack of information on what impact this project will have on our region.

Legislator Zando said he would not be supporting the resolution because he did not have information on the economic benefit this would have for his district.

Legislator Boice overwhelmingly supported the resolution and reminded legislators that this highway has been on the back burner for close to 40 years, was initiated in the north country, would bring a higher level of economic development to the north country, and is in the best interests of the north country.

All members present voted aye except Legislators Zando and Burto who voted nay.

Chairman Blankenbush entertained a motion to waive Standing Rules 35, 60 and all other appropriate standing rules to allow for the consideration of four additional resolutions. Such motion was made by Legislator Ormsby seconded by Legislator Burto and unanimously carried.

Resolution No. 173

Increasing Taxes on Sales and Uses of Tangible Personal Property and of Certain Services, on Occupancy of Hotel Rooms and on Amusement Charges Pursuant to Article 29 of the Tax Law of the State of New York

Be it Resolved by the Board of Legislators of the County of Jefferson, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 4-A of Resolution No. 113 adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Jefferson on July 12, 1965 imposing sales and compensating use taxes, is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4-A. Imposition of additional rate of sales and compensating use taxes.

Pursuant to the authority of section 1210 of the Tax Law, in addition to the sales and compensating use taxes imposed by sections 2 and 4 of this resolution, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional three-quarters of one percent rate of such sales and compensating use taxes, for the period beginning September 1, 2004, and

ending November 30, 2011. Such additional taxes shall be identical to the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 and shall be administered and collected in the same manner as such taxes. All of the provisions of this resolution relating or applicable to the administration and collection of the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 shall apply to the additional taxes imposed by this section, including the applicable transitional provisions, limitations, special provisions, exemptions, exclusions, refunds and credits as are set forth in this resolution, with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been incorporated in full into this section and had expressly referred to the additional taxes imposed by this section.

- SECTION 2. Paragraph (c) of subdivision (1) of section 11 of Resolution No. 113 adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Jefferson on July 12, 1965, imposing sales and use taxes, is amended to read as follows:
 - (c) With respect to the additional tax of three-quarters of one percent imposed for the period beginning September 1, 2004, and ending November 30, 2011, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this county prior to September 1, 2004.
- SECTION 3. Subdivision (c) of section 14 of Resolution No. 113 adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Jefferson on July 12, 1965 imposing sales and use taxes, is amended to read as follows:
 - (c) One hundred percent of net collections from the additional three-quarters of one percent rate of tax imposed for the period beginning September 1, 2004, and ending November 30, 2005, shall be set aside and used solely for County purposes and shall not be subject to any revenue distribution agreement entered into pursuant to section 1262(c) of the New York Tax Law. Net collections from the additional three-quarters of one percent rate of tax imposed for the period December 1, 2005, through November 30, 2011, shall be set aside for County purposes or allocated and distributed pursuant to the agreement pursuant to Section 1262(c) of the New York Tax Law between the County of Jefferson and City of Watertown dated January 10, 2005.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect December 1, 2009.

Resolution No. 176

Authorizing Facilities Lease Agreement with Watertown Savings Bank for Employment & Training Programs, and Authorizing Sublease with NYS Department of Labor

Whereas, With the completion of the Jefferson Community College (JCC) new five year Facility Master Plan, it was determined that the on campus modular building would best fit JCC's immediate needs for developing an innovative Higher Education Center in time for new course work to commence in January, 2010, and

Whereas, Jefferson County was therefore tasked with finding a new location for its Employment & Training Department functions administered through the One Stop Center, which would also include sufficient space to house its NYS Department of Labor partner, and

Whereas, After extensive review of viable locations for the approximate 9,000 sq. ft. workforce development program, which also enjoys a longstanding relationship with both local economic development and education institutions, a suitable building has been identified, and

Whereas, A former bank building located immediately adjacent to JCC on Coffeen Street could continue to serve the training needs of residents throughout the County as efficiently as has historically been the case within the on campus modular building, and

Whereas, The owner of that currently vacant building, Watertown Savings Bank, is willing to lease the space at \$12/sq. ft. for three years, with an option for one additional year at \$14.00/sq.ft., and

Whereas, The Director of Employment & Training has determined that funding is available to accommodate leased space costs within the Departmental budget, and

Whereas, Given the uncertainty of Federal funding for the Employment & Training Program, it is in the best interest of the County to lease space in lieu of constructing a new facility or undertaking major building space renovations to provide adequate space compliant with ADA and current building codes.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That Jefferson County enter into a three year agreement with Watertown Savings Bank to lease the 8940 square foot former bank building at 1000 Coffeen Street, Watertown for classroom and office space and appropriate parking space at a cost of \$12.00 per square foot, with an option to extend the lease for one additional year at \$14.00/sq.ft., and be it further

Resolved, That Jefferson County enter into an agreement with the NYS Department of Labor whereby the County agrees to sublet to NYSDOL classroom and office space in the above referenced building subject to NYSDOL paying to the County a proportionate share based on square footage occupied along with such direct expenses as incurred by the County in connection with its lease of the referenced building, and be it further

Resolved, That the Chairman of this Board be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the above referenced agreements on behalf of Jefferson County, with the approval of the County Attorney as to form and content.

Seconded by Legislator: Barry M. Ormsby

Legislator Gray stated that he would not support this resolution as he did not believe complete due diligence was followed to reach this conclusion, and it is in the County's best interest to find the best options out there so the most money can go into the departments programs.

Legislator Boice stated that at one time this department was going to be located in vacant space at the County Office Building, asked for clarification as to why they can no longer occupy their current space, and wondered how renovations will be accomplished on top of the rental fees.

Administrator Hagemann advised that the County was notified in mid-May by the College that we needed to vacate the modular building by October 1 or sooner, as the College needed the space to house the Higher Education Center. With regard to Employment & Training relocating to the County Office Building space, he said the department requires approx. 9,000 sq ft. because of its partnership with DOL and there was only about 6,000 sq ft. available, and even if they could fit into the space, extensive renovations would have been needed. That being said, within 30 days 13 outside locations were identified and by process of elimination it came down to tonight's recommendation. He advised that the criteria in determining the right building included: location to main partners JCC, SBDC, BOCES, and accessibility by car and public transportation, which narrowed it down to two buildings and this building was much closer to both those standards. He stated that the two buildings were about the same price, but this building is newer and is ready for the County to move into as soon as possible because the only renovations needed are the removal of the bank tellers. Mr. Hagemann said he was not involved with the discussions the College had with this building owner when they were potentially

looking at it to house the Higher Education Center but understood the price per sq ft. was significantly greater because major renovations would have been needed.

Legislator Ormsby appreciated Legislator Gray's comments about due diligence, but said he supports the resolution as he feels looking at the data in terms of the modernization of the building, a portion of the insurance and taxes being included in the \$12.00/sq ft., its proximity to the College, and the minimal renovations needed he has a comfort level with this recommendation.

In response to questions from Legislator Behling, Mr. Hagemann advised that there are no local dollars involved, it is all federal funds; the Department of Labor utilizes approx. 3,000 sq ft. which we will sublease to them for the same term as the County's lease which coincides with the stimulus funding; utilities are not included in the per sq ft charge but in examining past utility expenses of the building and figuring in the government rate, they should run about the same as current bills; a vacant IDA building was not considered as it needed extensive renovations and did not meet the criteria identified; and the three year lease with a one-year extension is the desire of the County as the time frame is ideal for our programming purposes. He further advised that until this stimulus funding was received both the Employment & Training Department and the Department of Labor were experiencing reduced funding from the Federal government, and this arrangement works for everyone as the bank will have a very marketable piece of property that has not been significantly modified at the end of the lease, and the County will not have invested significant funds to renovate adequate space to house the Department.

All members present voted aye except Legislator Gray who voted nay.

Mr. Hagemann advised that a picture of the Board of Legislators for the 2008-2009 term will be taken immediately prior to the September Board meeting.

Mr. Hagemann reminded members to contact Torri Pierce if they wish to attend the Fall NYSAC Conference so the appropriate arrangements can be made.

There being no further business of the Board, on a motion by Legislator Boice seconded by Legislator Gray and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
