The City of McCall, Idaho, and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) announce that a Draft Environmental Assessment Supplement (Draft EA Supplement) has been prepared in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 and the following FAA Orders: 1050.1E, Environmental Impacts: Policies and Procedures; and 5050.4B, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Implementing Instructions for Airport Actions.

The Proposed Action of this Draft EA Supplement is the acquisition of 59.11 acres of land adjacent to the McCall Municipal Airport. The land is required for future development of airport facilities including aircraft hangars, Fixed Base Operator, and a terminal building as well as associated taxiways, taxilanes and aprons. This additional land also protects the airport from encroachment of incompatible land uses. This Draft EA Supplement evaluates potential environmental impacts of acquiring the land. This Draft EA Supplement is intended as a supplement to the original EA for the proposed acquisition of land adjacent to the McCall Municipal Airport. The original EA was prepared in September, 2011, and addressed acquisition of land required for relocation of the parallel taxiway (16.7 acres). The 59.11 acres included in this Proposed Action is in addition to the 16.7 acres.
