### **Traffic Stop ends assault in progress, captures wanted man with drugs.**

Smyrna Police stopped an assault in progress while also seizing drugs packaged for delivery and arresting a man wanted in 2 states during a traffic stop late Friday night. On 3/25/16 at approx. 2302 hrs an SPD officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling on S Carter Rd in the area of Dorchester Ct that had it's passenger door open and it appeared as if the passenger was attempting to get out of the moving vehicle. SPD performed a traffic stop of the vehicle and made contact with the male and female occupants. It was determined that a physical altercation was occurring inside of the vehicle at the time of the stop. The male driver, later identified as Delquan Shakir, 21 of Smyrna was detained. At the time of his detention Mr. Shakir provided SPD officers with a false name in an attempt to conceal his identity. Investigation determined that Mr. Shakir had assaulted his female passenger while driving and she was attempting to exit the vehicle to get away from him. Further investigation revealed that Mr. Shakir was in possession of a quantity of marijuana packaged for sale as well as illegal controlled prescription drugs. It was also determined that Mr. Shakir did not possess a valid driver's license. Mr. Shakir was transported to the Smyrna Police Department where his identity was confirmed. It was also learned that Mr. Shakir was wanted by the Dover Police Department for shoplifting as well as on several Delaware court capiases. Mr. Shakir was further found to be wanted by the Delaware County (Pennsylvania) Sherriff's Office for failing to appear for trial on drug dealing related charges. Smyrna Police charged Mr. Shakir with Possession with intent to deliver a controlled substance, Assault 3rd degree, Criminal Impersonation, Possession of a controlled substance, and driving while suspended/revoked. Mr. Shakir was presented before JP#7 via video court on his SPD charges as well as his Dover PD warrant. Mr. Shakir was committed to

the Dept. of Corrections in lieu of \$106,550 cash only bond for his SPD charges and capiases and \$500 secured bond for his Dover PD charge. Mr. Shakir has a pending extradition hearing for his fugitive status in the state of Pennsylvania.
