

Christmas in Lindsborg, just like in Sweden, is a very special time. Lindsborg embraces the traditions and history behind many of Sweden's most cherished symbols. Visit Lindsborg and *start your own traditions this Christmas!*



St. Lucia Day is one of the most popular Swedish traditions both in Sweden and Lindsborg! St. Lucia's Day is celebrated by a local girl dressing in a white gown with a red sash around her waist and a crown of candles on her head. The crown is made of Lingonberry branches which are evergreen and symbolize new life in winter.



The Julbock (Goat) is one of Scandinavia's oldest Christmas symbols and traditions. Historically people thought of the Julbock as an invisible creature that would appear some time before Christmas to make sure that the Jul preparations were done right. In modern times, the Julbock stands guard under the Christmas tree keeping watch for mischief!



It wouldn't be Christmas in Lindsborg (or Sweden) without yummy treats and delicious sweets. Pepparkakor is a ginger cookie made traditionally during the Christmas season in Sweden. The smell of fresh-baked goodies fills the air during the Christmas season in Lindsborg! Perfectly paired with a hot cup of coffee or cider, our treats are sure to please!
