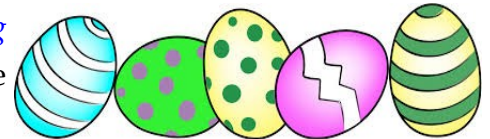

Payment Processing Services Update!

The nCourt credit card system has been delayed until further notice. While we cannot currently accept credit card payments on-line, we can still accept payments over the phone and in person without incurring the \$4.95 fee for utility bills or the 3.5% fee for other general bills including fire inspections and permit fees.

*The Public Works Department has scheduled Clean Up Day for Saturday, April 14th. Normal household trash, debris, furniture and brush collection will begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. **BRUSH will not be accepted after 3:00 p.m.** This event also includes Household Hazardous Waste such as batteries, paint, solvents, etc. This will begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at approximately 12:00 p.m. or until the contracted amount of waste is collected. It is on a first come-first serve basis.*

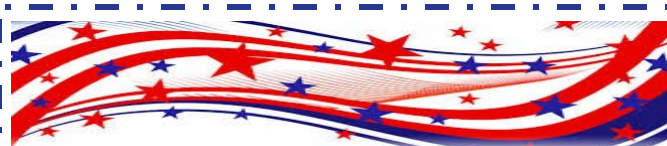

Pantego Police Department Best Practices Recognition

The Pantego Police Department is proud to announce that it has achieved Texas Police Chiefs Association, Best Practices Recognition Status. Pantego PD is now the 144th law enforcement agency in Texas to receive this status. There are 2667 law enforcement agencies and approximately 78,000 licensed peace officers in Texas.

The Law Enforcement Recognition Program is a voluntary process where police agencies in Texas prove their compliance with 166 Texas Law Enforcement Best Practices. These Best Practices were carefully developed by Texas Law Enforcement professionals to assist agencies in the efficient and effective delivery of service, the reduction of risk and the protection of individual's rights.

A Committee of Chiefs of Police and Command level officers from across Texas assisted in the development of standards that were believed to be necessary for proper functioning of Texas law enforcement agencies. They reviewed Texas law and other State Accreditation Program standards to determine which were most appropriate. An appointed Committee of professional Police Chiefs from across the state then reviewed these standards and approved them for testing.
