The Spring Clean Up Pantego Day will include two different collection sections. Please be sure to bring your ID or water bill to verify your residence

Bulk and Large Trash collection: This will be held from 8am-4pm in the southwest parking lot at the intersection of Winewood Ln. and S. Bowen Rd. Brush collection will stop at 3pm.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronics Recycling (E-waste): The HHW and E-waste collection will be held from 8am-12pm in the parking lot at Town Hall. The collection will continue until a contract specific amount of waste is collected and will be handled on a first come - first serve basis.

** Materials NOT Accepted: Medical waste (pills, needles, etc.), smoke detectors and tires.**

Zoning Ordinance

The Town Council, Planning and Zoning Commission, and staff have conducted a complete revision of the Zoning Code (Chapter 14 of the Code of Ordinances). The revised Code can be found on the Town's website. Prior to adoption, the Town Council will be soliciting public opinion at the April 10th Regular Town Council meeting. Bowen Road Pavement Repair Project:

Memorial Day Essay Contest

The Community Relations Board is sponsoring a essay writing contest for all 7th & 8th grade students. The topic is "Why Is Memorial Day Important to Our Country Now? Essays must be typed in 12 font Times New Roman, be double spaced and be 1 to 1 -1/2 pages in length. Submit your essay to Town Hall between 8am and 5pm, Monday through Friday or drop it in the night drop box in the Town Hall parking lot. The deadline is Monday, May 1st. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners will be notified by May 15th and will receive a monetary award. They will also be asked to read their essay at the Memorial Day event on May 29th.



The Town Council approved Ordinance 17-798 on January 9th which changed the requirements for parking motor homes, campers, boats and trailers in residential areas. This ordinance replaces the previous version, which was enacted in 2011, and required that such vehicles be parked where they are not visible from the street. That ordinance had been suspended while the Council worked to resolve concerns about its implementation.

The new ordinance allows for the parking of motor homes, campers, boats and trailers on the side or rear of a home, including on a driveway, where they may be visible from the street. They are still prohibited from parking on a driveway in front of the home. It also requires that they be parked on an all weather surface, and not be closer than five (5) feet from the property line. The ordinance does allow such vehicles to be parked in the driveway for periods of less than seventy-two (72) hours for loading and unloading purposes. Another feature is that homeowners may apply for an exclusion if the configuration of your home does not allow for you to park your vehicle on the side or rear yards. Homeowners have until July 9th to apply. This exclusion applies for the duration of the time that you own/reside in your home.
