### **Mosquito Spraying**

The Town Council has chosen to proactively spray this year on a monthly basis to curb the amount of mosquitoes in the area. The upcoming spray schedule will be at 9:30 PM as follows:

**June 25<sup>th</sup>** (alternate June 26<sup>th</sup>) \* **July 23<sup>rd</sup>** (alternate July 24<sup>th</sup>) \* **August 27<sup>th</sup>** (alternate August 28<sup>th</sup>)

The treatment will take approximately 2 hours and will be applied throughout the Town. It is recommended that residents stay inside during this time frame. Continue to check the newsletter and Town website for future application dates.

### **Mosquito Trapping**

In cooperation with Tarrant County Health Department, Town staff has been setting mosquito traps since the first week in April. Trapped mosquitoes are then taken to Tarrant County for testing. Tarrant County has had one mosquito trapping pool test positive for West Nile Virus this year in the North Richland Hills area.

### **Mosquito Control**

The most important and effective form of mosquito/West Nile Virus control is to take a personal stake in the process. To prevent the breeding of mosquitoes, ensure that the areas on your property have no standing water. Check your buckets, flower pots, trash containers, or other likely collection areas and dump them out on a regular basis. When going outside, especially from dusk to dawn, wear clothes that cover as much of your skin as possible and use insect repellent.

**Mosquito dunks (one package per resident) are available at Town Hall to treat standing/stagnant water that cannot be emptied (i.e. ponds, fountains, etc.)**

### UPDATES: W Park Row Waterline & Wagonwheel Projects

The contractor for the W Park Row Waterline Replacement Project has been working at a steady pace with an average completion rate of 250 ft per

day. Thankfully, the rain has not been a factor. Again, your patience is appreciated as the project continues.

The Wagonwheel Waterline, Wastewater & Bridge Project is in final plan review to go out for bid with an anticipated bid opening in mid-July.



### Storm Water

Pesticides, insecticides and fertilizers are one of the most challenging categories of storm water pollutants to address. They are carried to creeks, rivers and lakes in the runoff from rainfall, and are toxic to fish as well as to the humans who eat the fish. Whether you do the yard work yourself or hire a landscaper, keep these products out of the storm water system. Never throw pesticides, insecticides, or fertilizers in the trash or into a storm drain. Take the unused product to a household hazardous waste collection center.

product will not be absorbed into the soil, it will be carried off into the storm water system when it rains.

2. Don't over-water your lawn. Excess water can be discharged into the street from the sprinkler system carrying these pollutants to the storm drain system.
3. Use non-toxic alternative products to control weeds and add nutrients to your lawn.

### Best Management Practices for Lawn Products:
