Arlington Independent School District Board elections will be held in the Town Council chambers at Town Hall on May 10th from 7am-7pm.

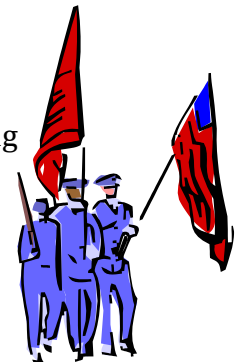
Free mosquito dunks are available at Town Hall for residents.

Memorial Day Event

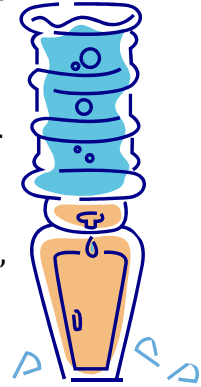

Tips for Water Conservation

- When waiting for cold tap water to warm up, capture wasted water in a pitcher or watering can to water plants.
- A faucet that drips can waste up to 3,820 gallons of water per year. A leaky toilet can waste 200 gallons of water per day. Most leaks are easy to repair. Fix that leak!
- Want to save 3-5 gallons per minute? Turn off the tap when brushing your teeth.
- Install water-saving fixtures. Aerated faucets, efficient toilets and shower heads can save you thousands of gallons of water per year.
- Only run the dishwasher or washing machine when you have a full load.
- Limit outdoor water use by ensuring that you are only watering the lawn, not sidewalks or the road.
- Reduce lawn watering by planting native, drought-resistant plants.

Register your pet with the Town!



The Public Works Department enforces the Town's ordinances regarding unrestrained animals, vicious animals and nuisance animals. Unrestrained animals are ones that are not inside a fenced yard or cage or at the end of a leash or chain. The state law requires all animals to be vaccinated against rabies annually; the Town requires all animals to be licensed. In order to do so, a copy of the rabies inoculations is required. The fee for registering your pet is \$10.00 if they are spayed or neutered. Otherwise, the fee is \$15.00. Our Animal Control has a chip reader so if your pet has been chipped, please note that number on your application. To register your pet, fill out the pet registration form and submit to Town Hall.
