BOND PROPOSITION NO. 1

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska, as more specifically provided in Ordinance No. 431 be authorized to increase the rate of interest from not to exceed 6% per annum to not to exceed 9% per annum on the \$1,100,000 unissued portion of its \$1,900,000 Water and Electric Utility Revenue Bonds authorized by Special Election of July 6, 1965, which election ratified the provisions of Ordinance No. 345, said bonds to be payable only from the unpledged revenues of the municipal water and electric utility systems, to mature in such amounts and at such times as determined by the Council but not later than forty years from date of issue for the purpose of providing funds to pay all or any part of the cost of renovating, improving and constructing additions to the City water and electric utility systems, all as shown on the water and electric utility rehabilitation and improvements plan on file in the office of the City Director of Public Works and all expenses incidental thereto.

BOND PROPOSITION NO. 2

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska, as more specifically provided in Ordinance No. 433 be authorized to issue its General Obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$220,000 and bearing interest at a rate of not to exceed 9% per annum, to mature in such amounts and at such times as determined by the Council but not later than 30 years from date of issue and to be payable both principal and interest from annual levies of taxes to be made upon all taxable property within the City without limitation as to rate or amount for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of constructing, acquiring and equipping a new fire hall to be built on land already owned by the City all as shown on the plan thereof in the office of the City Director of Public Works.

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO. 2

Shall Section 6.9 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Sitka, Alaska be amended to read as follows:

Section 6.9 Nominations: A qualified elector who shall have resided continuously in the City during the 12 months immediately preceding the election may be nominated for an elective city office.

Nomination shall be by petition specifying the position sought on a form prescribed by the Council. But the right to elect a qualified candidate by write-in votes shall not be limited. Such petition shall be signed by not fewer than 20 electors. No elector shall sign more than one petition for each office to be filled. If he does so, his signature shall be valid only on the first sufficient petition filed for the office. The signatures to a nomination petition need not all be appended to one paper. But to each separate paper of the petition shall be attached an affidavit of the circulator thereof, indicating the number of signers of the paper and stating that each signature appended thereto was made in his presence and is the genuine signature of the person whose name it purports to be. With each signature shall be stated the signer's place of residence, identified by its street and number or other sufficient description.

All nomination papers comprising a petition shall be assembled and filed in person with the City Clerk during office hours as one instrument not earlier than 90 days nor later than 25 days before the election. The City Clerk shall make a record of the exact time at which each petition is filed and shall take and preserve the name and address of the person by whom it is filed. If the petition is not signed by the required number of qualified electors, the City Clerk shall notify the candidate and the person who filed the petition within five days after the filing in person or by registered or certified mail or similar special mail. If the petition is insufficient in any other particular, the City Clerk shall return it immediately in the same manner to the person who filed it, certifying in writing wherein the petition is insufficient. Such deficient petition, may be amended and filed again as a new petition, or a substitute petition for the same candidate may be filed within the regular time for filing nomination petitions.

The City Clerk shall notify an eligible person of his nomination, by registered, certified or other special mail, and such person shall file with the City Clerk his written acceptance of nomination, in such form as the Council may require, within five days of receipt of notification of nomination. Upon receipt of such acceptance of nomination, the City Clerk shall cause the nominee's name to be printed on the ballots. The petition of nomination for a successful candidate at an election shall be preserved in the office of the City Clerk until the term of office for which the candidate is elected expires.
