ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION OF JULY 6, 1965 were opened and tabulated and canvass of election made. The Clerk presented certificates of the election judges, together withthe ballots cast at said election, the ballots spoiled, unused ballots, registration books, duplicate registers kept by the judges containing the record of the election including the names of all persons who voted thereat, and all other material returned to her by the election judges. PROPOSITION

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska, as more specifically provided in Ordinance No. 345 of said city be authorized to issue its Revenue Bonds in the total principal amount of not to exceed \$1,900,000 to be payable only from the unpledged revenues of the Municipal water and Electric Utility Systems, to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum, to mature in such amounts and at such times as determined by the Council but not later than forty years from date of issue for the purpose of providing funds to pay all or any part of the cost of renovating, improving and constructing additions to the city water and electric utility systems, all as shown on the water utility rehabilitation and improvements plan on file in the office of the City Director of Public Works and the electric utility program on file in the office of the Electrical Superintendent, and all expenses incidental thereto.

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
