

THE CITY CLERK PRESENTED CERTIFICATES OF THE JUDGES AND CLERKS OF THE ELECTION HELD AUGUST 2, 1960, together with the ballots cast at said election, the ballots spoiled, unused ballots, registration books, duplicate registers kept by the Clerks containing the record of the election, including the names of all persons who voted thereat, and all other material returned to her by the judges and clerks of election. The Council canvassed the ballots and the results of the election and found the Certificates of the Judges and Clerks to be accurate and complete. A motion was made by Mr. Cushing, seconded by Mr. Peterson, that the reports of the Judges and Clerks contained in their Certificates be accepted, approved and found correct and that the Council find the tabulation as follows:

PROPOSITION

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska, as more specifically provided in Ordinance #244 of said City be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed **\$225,000.00**, said bonds to bear interest at a rate of not to exceed six percent per annum, to mature serially in not to exceed 30 years from date of issue and to be payable, both principal and interest, from City of Sitka tax revenues, without limitation, for the purpose of paving, improving, widening, beautifying and relocating Peschouroff Street, that portion of Lake Street between Sawmill Creek Blvd. and Lincoln Street, relocating Swan Lake Creek, constructing and relocating such sewer, water and utility lines as may be feasible, acquiring such lands as may be necessary, and paying all expenses incidental thereto with said City of Sitka using the proceeds of said bonds either to perform said capital improvements directly itself, or to acquire them by means of matching said proceeds, or matching construction financed from said proceeds or with funds of or construction by any cooperating governmental agency.

PROPOSITION

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska as more specifically provided in Ordinance #245 of said City, be authorized to issue its General Obligation Bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed **\$100,000.00,**

said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum to mature serially in not to exceed 30 years from date of issue and to be payable, both principal and interest, from City of Sitka tax revenues, without limitation, for the purpose of improving, paving, widening (with necessary land acquisition therefor) and reworking, along with such sewer construction as is advisable prior to paving, that portion of Katlian Street between the Pelican Packing Co. Cannery and the Sitka Cold Storage Co., that portion of Lincoln Street between Peschouloff Street and Baranof Street, The Sitka Community Hospital Access Road, Barracks Street, Cathedral Way, Seward Street, Maksouloff Street, Jeff Davis Street, Monastery Street and paying all expenses incidental thereto.
