

Absentee ballots for the Special Election of September 17th were then opened with a tally of 7 for and 0 against the bond issue and 6 for and 1 against the Sales Tax. Certificates of the election judges and clerks for the election were then presented showing 227 had voted for and 65 against the bond issue and 379 for and 101 against the Sales Tax with both propositions carrying. Mt. Calhoun moved that the reports of the election board be accepted. Mr. McClain seconded and the motion carried.

Proposition

Shall the City of Sitka, Alaska, incur indebtedness in a sum not to exceed \$75,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring Alaska Public Works Project No. 50-A-276, a combined public work project of a permanent nature located in the Halibut Point Road area of the City of Sitka consisting of trunk and auxilliary sewers and low pressure water mains in said area to be constructed by the United States of America and sold to the City of Sitka at a price not in excess of \$75,000.00 said indebtedness to bear interest at 2% per annum, to be evidenced by a project construction and sales agreement between the City of Sitka, Alaska, and the United States of America and by general obligation bonds to mature in not to exceed twenty (20) years; pledge the full faith and credit of the City of Sitka; and levy a tax or taxes sufficient to pay the interest and principal of said bonds when due, all as provided by Ordinance No. 191, of the City of Sitka, Alaska, passed and approved the 13th day of August, 1957.
