

The following summary of legislation passed by Dover City Council at its regular meeting the 21st day of November 2016 is published once to comply with the Ohio Revised Code. A full copy of the text can be obtained or viewed at the Office of the Mayor of the City of Dover. Emergency ordinance 40-16. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Mayor and the Director of Public Safety to enter into a “Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Medical Service Agreement” with Dover Township, a copy of which is on file with the office of the Safety Director. Emergency ordinance 41-16. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Safety to participate in the Tuscarawas County Grant Application to replace the digital mobile and digital portable radios used by the police department and to authorize funding in the amount of \$14,149.00. Emergency ordinance. An emergency ordinance making supplemental appropriations and authorizing the transfer of funds to meet current obligations of the City of Dover and the departments therein. Emergency ordinance 44-16. An emergency ordinance accepting the recommendation of the Dover Planning Commission to annex approximately 9.730 acres of property into Dover owned by Dover Land Development and the City of Dover, as approved by the planning commission on October 11, 2016 and providing notice of its intent to zone the property R-4, which will be heard when Dover accepts the annexation as approved by the Commissioners. Emergency ordinance 48-16. An emergency ordinance to approve an additional expenditure not to exceed \$28,200 for the city of Dover’s share of the improvements authorized in ordinance 10-15 and 38-15. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee to apply for the 2017 ODOT grant cycle of the transportation alternatives program for improvements for the Canal Dover Riverfront Area. Emergency ordinance 42-16. An emergency ordinance to create the position of part time technology office support worker. Emergency ordinance 45-16. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee to apply for the Clean Ohio Recreational Trails Program funds for improvements for the Canal Dover Riverfront Area and other areas that would enhance the trails, access to the trails of the Canal Dover Park, and trails throughout Dover that will be designed to ultimately connect to the park and trails. Emergency ordinance 46-16. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Safety to enter into a contract with the Tuscarawas County Board of County Commissioners for housing inmates in the Tuscarawas County Jail. Emergency ordinance 50-16. An emergency ordinance approving and setting cemetery rates for the Dover Burial Park and cemetery commencing with January 1, 2017. Emergency ordinance 51-16. Temporary appropriation ordinance for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2017 for the City of

Dover, Ohio. Emergency ordinance 52-16. An emergency ordinance making supplemental appropriations and authorizing the transfer of funds to meet current obligations of the City of Dover and the departments therein.
