Chair Carolyn Duhaime called the Special Meeting to order at 7:18 p.m. All rose and pledged allegiance to the flag.

PUBLIC PORTION

<u>Brad Tobin, 114 Hawthorne Avenue, Derby, CT</u> – Mr. Tobin informed the board members that he was asked by Sheila M. Parizo, Chairwoman, of the Board of Education to read her statement into the record:

Due to the speed in which this process has come to light to the public, I am unable to change my plans for this evening and submit this letter to be read into the record. Further, I reiterate my concerns that a preliminary vote on this budget was held on Friday evening, May 23^{rd} just before a long holiday weekend and the public was not made aware of this meeting until 24 hours prior. I also question the "selective" use of phone votes utilized throughout the vote that evening.

IT TAKES A CITY...

Since the inception of this great country, the architects of the American society deemed it necessary to ensure a fair and equal education of our children.

Gone are the days of: One-room school houses; one teacher and one curriculum for all grade levels; children walking to school; wood burning stoves to heat the building and candles to read by; sports being played on sandlots.

Today, in 2008, a student's education is driven by society, government mandates and success. In order to achieve these goals, money must be spent. The voters of this great City of Derby have been shouting for changes in the education system to improve test scores and give our

students the abilities to compete in the academic and professional realms. We can't do that without the support of City funds!

Curriculum improvements have been the focus of the past three years and Derby has made great strides in this area under the leadership and guidance of Dr. Meg Boice. A State mandate requiring that all students be computer literate by Grade 8 has been a major improvement in the district. Our children are participating in virtual classrooms on an AP level and some students are taking pre-college credit courses, through the efforts of two teachers who have taken on the challenge of becoming adjunct professors for UConn. Curriculum development is a fluid process and is always in motion, seeking to challenge our students and prepare them for college and beyond.

Budgets are driven by salaries and student needs. Government, both state and federal, imposes mandates on school districts with little or no financial backing. "No Child Left Behind" is a shining example of forced requirements on school districts to address/improve performance levels of students, with no remuneration of the increased costs to implement such regulations and procedures. Special Education is a major portion of any BOE request, as it is mandated to provide special services to those students requiring them in order to succeed.

Transportation for students within the district is also required, and quite costly, especially in light of recent gas price hikes. Utility costs for all of our buildings, much like each of our own homes, are rising at perilous rates.

Salaries for teachers, administrators, and support staff rise at a rate lower than the cost of living. These educated professionals are our neighbors, making a living like most of us, and deserve a raise for the hard and sometimes thankless work they give to the education of our children.

Most recently, our school district had many discussions regarding the competitiveness of our athletes in certain leagues. The Derby Board of Education is more concerned with the competitiveness of our students in the academic and professional realms, because that is where their impact will have the most influence in our society!

Salary increases for part-time City Hall Administration, fishing derbies that net six participants and fireworks displays are all included in this current proposed budget and does not appear to be a "tightening of the belt." Perhaps the part-time employees should be placed on hourly wages, being held accountable for their time spent "on the job", and the families of those children fishing should take it upon themselves to do family things together, without the City funding their recreation. \$10,000 for fireworks will only be a memory on July 5th but imagine how many books that money could supply and give a child a lifetime of knowledge!

It does take a City to educate a child. And it costs money – Tax payer money – because, as a society, we are obligated to do the right thing when it comes to children. Children are our legacy for the future of Derby. Let's set an example for them to come back and take the lead and keep Derby moving in the direction of progressive education!

I ask this Board of Apportionment & Taxation to look hard at the numbers and invest in the future of Derby citizens. Shelia M. Parizo, Chairwoman, Derby Board of Education

<u>Dina Weissman, 26 Caldwell Drive, Derby, CT</u> – There were comments last evening that the public didn't participate as much as maybe the Tax Board had hoped for their input. One of the things that I became aware of after the meeting is that there was no preliminary budget

available within City Hall. There were a number of people after the meeting who mentioned that they had made phone calls and sought it out so for next year's budget you might want to consider having them available. I do want to thank the Town clerk for staying after hours last night to accommodate several taxpayers and provide copies of it. I also don't believe that there are copies available for the public even tonight but I have to take a look at it. I would like to say that the copy that I have doesn't have all the pages to it. So that might be one reason why you didn't have as many comments as you had hoped. Now that I have a line item copy of it the one item that I want to speak to would be the Corporation Counsel legal services department. I know you've done a great job of keeping the mil rate low and belt tightening but I don't know if you ever did the calculations on it. There's been overall a 24% increase in the Corporation Counsel's budget, which also includes nearly a 30% increase in just the legal services alone. Now I'm a lawyer and I'll be the first one to say lawyers are high paid but I don't understand a 30% hike in legal services fees. An additional line item of \$5,000 for Marshal Fees. Typically Marshal Fees are already included in a line item that is there for legal expenses. So if you're looking for money to give education you might want to look at what kind of priorities you're setting if you're spending all of this money on something that we're not going to get much of a return on for legal services the money could be spent on educating the kids.

<u>Dan Waleski, 21 Elm Street, Derby, CT</u> – Looking at your budget here \$34 million – if you divide that into a population of about 12,000 you'll find that the budget amounts to about \$3,500 per capita. Also the heavy emphasis falls on the residential taxpayers so I would like to urge the Tax Board and the Administration to do whatever it can to increase commercial and industrial development in this City to relieve the residential property owners of some of this taxation. Thank you Madam Chairman.

Sharon Renaldo(Teacher in Derby Public School System, not a resident) – I'm just going to ask the Board – I'm not aware of what the budget was - the dynamics of how this was all distributed and how it unfolded – it didn't lend itself to a lot of public input. And I was at last night's board meeting and I was very shocked that no one really talked about the education budget (inaudible) dialogue around that. So I'm glad for the opportunity to come tonight and I'm not sure if I'm out of order or what the consequences will be but I do need to ask the board to search yourself. You know a \$289,000 increase in education seems remiss at best and I understand totally that the times of economics are very difficult for all cities, not just Derby; however I would ask you to really search your souls. This school system is in transition and has been in major transition for several years now and right now it seems like the time is right for the transition of a brand new board, the transition of a Superintendent, the transition of Principals – so we're in the state of transition. And I wonder if you have done your best in searching your souls to do the best for education that the City can afford to do. Or and quite frankly I'm going to be honest if you're taking advantage of a situation that's in transition so I leave it to you (inaudible.)

<u>Carolyn Duhaime</u> – Ms. Duhaime read the following letter from Board of Aldermen President Ken Hughes into the record:

Dear Chairwoman Duhaime and members of the Board of Apportionment & Taxation:

I would like to clarify some comments made by several residents during the public hearing on the 2008-2009 Budget. It was mentioned about the waning fund balance, and I would like to clarify where that money was spent. Over the last two years, this Board of Aldermen and the Tax Board decided to spend 1.3 million dollars of the fund balance as an investment in downtown Derby to remove the blighted buildings along Main Street. This money will eventually

come back to the City, possibly tenfold. The Board of Aldermen and the Tax Board also used some of the fund balance to settle two inherited lawsuits, one which has been hanging around since the 1970's. Although some opponents would like you to believe that we are wasting away the fund balance, the truth is we are making fiscally sound decisions in order to stabilize the financial future of this City.

As always, I am consistently available to this board and to the public to answer any questions and rumors which may arise.

Thank you and congratulations on the end of what I view as a very successful budget season.

<u>Carl Yacobacci</u>, 10 <u>Lombardi Drive</u>, <u>Derby</u>, <u>CT</u> – Just as a clarification on that and I'm glad that the buildings are gone in downtown but it really wasn't a total investment in downtown that was voluntary. If anybody remembers we had a special meeting and the State of Connecticut came to the town and stated that the town had to take the buildings down or I believe the term was somebody was going to jail. So although the buildings are gone and it makes it look better that was one of the reasons that the buildings were taken down not because we were looking towards the future at that particular time because we were still waiting for the developer to put up the money. PUBLIC PORTION CLOSED

BID WAIVER - DERBY/SHELTON FIREWORKS DISPLAY

Ms. Duhaime informed the board members that the City received two bids. The low bid was from Bay Fireworks with a cost of \$12,000. She said the City must notify Bay Fireworks before the next regular meeting of the Board of Apportionment & Taxation, which is the reason this is being addressed this evening.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Nichols with a second by Mr. DeFala: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept the bid from Bay Fireworks in the amount of \$12,000 for the Derby/Shelton Fourth of July Fireworks Display. **Motion carried**.

ADOPTION OF 2008-2009 BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF DERBY

Ms. Duhaime stated for the record that with regard to Police Department items Mr. Kurtyka and Mr. DeFala will recuse themselves from voting, Mr. DiSorbo will abstain from voting. Regarding Fire Department and Health Matters Mr. Varsanik will recuse himself from voting. It should be noted they have done this in prior votes.

DEPARTMENT 1100 – MAYOR'S OFFICE

Mr. Schlesinger informed Ms. Duhaime the board has requested that the Chief Administrative Assistant's wages of \$72,844 be removed from the Mayor's Office and placed in the Special Working Balance line item.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Nichols with a second by Ms. Romano: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation remove line item 110-0113 Chief Administrative Assistant Wages in the amount of \$72,844 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

A MOTION was made by Ms. Getlein with a second by Mr. Varsanik: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 1100 – Mayor's Office – All Line Items totaling \$188,922.00 as amended on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

• DEPARTMENT 2300 - RETIREMENT

A MOTION was made by Mr. Varsanik with a second by Ms. Getlein: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 2300 – Retirement – All Line Items totaling \$819,772.00 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

DEPARTMENT 2400 – EMPLOYEES BENEFITS

A MOTION was made by Ms. Getlein with a second by Mr. Kurtyka: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 2400 – Employees Benefits – All Line Items totaling \$2,258,240.00 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

DEPARTMENT 2500 – FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Schlesinger noted that line item 110-0113 needs to be reduced to \$62,400.00 from \$65,000.00. Ms. Getlein stated that it should be \$62,000 since the \$400.00 was never approved by the Board of Aldermen.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Kurtyka with a second by Ms. Getlein: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation change Line Item 110-0113 Finance Director Wages from \$65,000 to \$62,000.

DISCUSSION ON MOTION

Mr. DeFala asked if this is going to be moved to the Special Working Balance. There was a discussion as to whether or not the motion needs to indicate that change. Mr. Schlesinger said we don't have to do that now; we can wait until we get to that line item. Hearing no further discussion...

MOTION CARRIED.

- DEPARTMENT 2600 PAYROLL TAXES

A MOTION was made by Mr. DeFala with a second by Ms. Getlein: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 2600 – Payroll Taxes – All Line Items totaling \$420,334.00 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

DEPARTMENT 2800 – TAX COLLECTOR

A MOTION was made by Ms. Getlein with a second by Mr. Nichols: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 2800 – Tax Collector – All Line Items totaling \$97,000.00 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008. **Motion carried**.

DEPARTMENT 2900 – ASSESSOR

Mr. Schlesinger informed the board that Line Item 110-0110 - Assessor Wages needs to be changed to \$44,816.00 from \$37,347.00. He explained that the Deputy Finance Director, Joan Williamson, has informed him that the Assessor is going to be working 24 hours per week instead of 20 hours per week. Ms. Duhaime asked if this change needs to be addressed through the Board of Aldermen. Mr. Schlesinger said he didn't believe so.

A MOTION was made by Mr. DeFala with a second by Mr. Kurtyka: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation change Department 2900 - Line Item 110-0110 - Assessor Wages from \$37,347.00 to \$44,816.00 due to a change in hours that was incorrectly calculated.

DISCUSSION ON MOTION

Ms. Getlein asked why the hours are being increased. Mr. Schlesinger explained that his office was under the assumption that the Assessor was working 20 hours per week and that's how they calculated the amount. They discovered that they miscalculated the amount since the Assessor has been working 24 hours per week. Hearing no further discussion...

A MOTION was made by Ms. Getlein with a second by Mr. Kurtyka: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation accept Department 5100 – Parks, Recreation, Community Center – All Line Items totaling \$251,795.00 as shown on the run dated May 29, 2008.

DISCUSSION ON MOTION

Mr. Varsanik asked if we could discuss changing the following Line Items:

Mr. Varsanik noted this would increase Parks & Rec by \$2,300.00. He said he would also like to include Line Item 390-0007 - Girls Softball and have it restored back to the original \$2,500.00. Mrs. Szewczyk said if we are looking to restore the line items back to their original amounts shouldn't Line Item 390-0011- Pop Warner also be changed? Ms. Romano also noted Line Item 480-0484 – Youth Basketball – restore back to \$9,000.00.

DISCUSSION ON AMENDMENT TO MOTION

Ms. Getlein said she understands the fees haven't been raised in three years and we have discussed this issue and she doesn't see the need for the increases, especially for Pop Warner. Pop Warner does a ton of fund raising – where does that money go? Mr. Kurtyka said if the director really wanted the changes then he should be here in person to make the request. Ms. Romano said the director presented his budget, as did every other department head. Hearing no further discussion on the matter a roll call vote was taken:

There was a lengthy discussion as to the action to take. DEPARTMENT 6000 – REVENUES

Mr. Schlesinger said the changes that he has been requested to make by the board for your solicitation is at 26.25 mils in what you adopt in your preliminary budget you have property tax revenue of \$23,219,579. At 26.35 mils as an option is \$23,308,025, which would increase the Fund Balance Replenishment by \$88,456. If you go to 26.4 mils, a .9 mil increase, you would have \$23,352,263, which would increase the Fund Balance Replenishment an additional \$132,684. Mr. Schlesinger noted with the changes that were made this evening he has a Fund Balance Replenishment of \$267,865. He said everyone needs to keep in mind that the \$267,865 and the \$232,279 that was adopted did not include the potential liability of the City losing the fight on the change in health benefits to an HSA System. He said if that money would have to go into the Special Working Balance we would actually be running a deficit at the current mil rate that's been preliminary adopted. He said the \$267,865 with the increase expense of losing the medical coverage would be \$345,000 - we would be about \$80,000 short if that happens. Mr. Schlesinger said the worse case scenario if everything stayed the same and if we lost the health care and we had to pay out the entire Special Working Balance for all the items that it is there for we would run a deficit of \$80,000. He said at 26.35 if we lose the medical and if everything else is paid out as per the Special Working Balance we would run a balanced budget. At 26.4 if we lose the medical and if everything else is paid out as per the Special Working Balance we would have a \$44,000 surplus. At 26.4 the Fund Balance Replenishment would be .9 mils increase. Mr. Schlesinger said he would recommend going with 26.4 mils.

A MOTION was made by Mr. DeFala with a second by Ms. Romano: Move that the Board of Apportionment & Taxation set the Mil Rate at 26.4 for a .9 increase with property taxes of \$23,352,263.00.
