

1 RESOLUTION NO. 5496

2 RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
3 OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE
4 DESIGNATING THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH
5 AS A HISTORIC BUILDING

6 WHEREAS, the Methodist-Episcopal Church building was
7 constructed in 1851 on a side of a hill above Cedar Ravine near
8 Main Street on the southeast corner of this intersection; and

9 WHEREAS, sometime after, a brick church was built in 1865
10 or 1866 at ground level, and the original church was placed on top
11 of and became a second story to the building which sat next to the
12 brick Methodist Church at the corner; and

13 WHEREAS, the building served as the residence for the
14 pastor and for other church uses; and

15 WHEREAS, when the El Dorado County Federated Church built
16 their new facility in the present location on Thompson Way and sold
17 the site of the brick church the site was cleared; and

18 WHEREAS, the 1851 church structure was dismantled and the
19 materials were saved; and


20 WHEREAS, in 1961 the El Dorado County Historic Society,
21 the members of the El Dorado County Federated Church, and the El
22 Dorado County Chamber of Commerce dedicated the reconstructed
23 church building and designated it a point of interest at its
24 present location on Thompson Way on the properties of the El Dorado
25 County Federated Church; and

26 WHEREAS, the City of Placerville has received a letter
27 from Marilyn Mills, Chairperson of the Historic Committee of the El
28 Dorado County Federated Church requesting that the City of
29 Placerville designate the church as a historic structure;


30 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the
31 City of Placerville does hereby designate the Methodist-Episcopal
32 Church building on its present location on the properties of the El

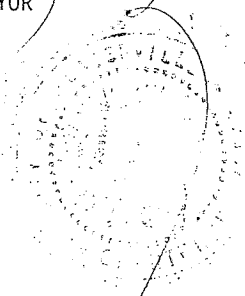
1 Dorado County Federated Church on Thompson Way as a historic
2 structure.

3 The foregoing Resolution was introduced at a regular
4 meeting of the City Council of the City of Placerville held on
5 April 28, 1992 by Councilmember Borelli, who moved its adoption.
6 The motion was seconded by Councilmember Tustin. Carried and
7 so ordered.
