

RESOLUTION NO. 2895

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE
DESIGNATING HANGTOWN'S GOLD BUG PARK AS A HISTORIC SITE

WHEREAS, the City of Placerville leases from the Bureau of Land Management a 60 acre park site known as HANGTOWN'S GOLD BUG PARK; and

WHEREAS, this park site contains much of the Gold Mining History of the Placerville area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has formed the Bedford Park Improvement Committee to continue the planning, developing and preservation of the park for the public; and

WHEREAS, the Bedford Park Improvement Committee desires to establish HANGTOWN'S GOLD BUG PARK as a Historical Site; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Placerville wishes to promote and preserve the gold mining history of our community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Placerville designate HANGTOWN'S GOLD BUG PARK a Historic Site.

The foregoing Resolution was introduced at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Placerville held on April 28, 1981, by Councilmember Borelli, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Tustin and a poll vote was taken which stood as follows:
