BASIC REQUIREMENTS

- For young men and women who are at least 14 years old (and have completed the eighth grade) or 15 years of age but not yet 21 years old.
- Be currently enrolled or have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 (letter grade "C") or higher.
- No felony convictions or certain misdemeanor convictions.
- Good driving record.
- Agree to complete a background investigation.
- Willing to conform to the Placerville Police Department policies and procedures manual.
- Willing to volunteer a minimum of 8 work experience hour per month and attend scheduled meetings.
- Willing to purchase and maintain a uniform.
