Subject: Adopt a resolution accepting \$4000.00 in Homeland Security Grant Funding for monitors for downtown camera project.

Discussion: The City of Placerville was awarded a grant for \$4000.00 from Homeland Security Grant Funding in fiscal year 2016 to purchase monitors/equipment for the downtown camera project. This project provides surveillance cameras on Main Street from Cedar Ravine to Sacramento Street and replacement cameras in the parking garage. The project is to be completed in two phases, with phase one providing the structure for the internet service for each camera in the system and a few cameras placed along Main Street. The second phase is the replacement of cameras in the parking garage and three other cameras on Main Street.

The City of Placerville, by resolution, will agree to purchase and install the equipment necessary to view the surveillance system and request reimbursement from El Dorado County for no more than the \$4000.00.

Cost: \$4000.00

Fiscal Impact: None, due to reimbursement from grant funding.

Recommendation: Adopt a resolution accepting \$4000.00 in Homeland Security Grant Funding for monitors for downtown camera project.
