MINUTES

PRESENT:

Recreation & Parks Commission: Jerry Barton, Andrew Mathews, Jackie Neau, and Peter Nolan.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Mr. Nolan made the motion to approve the agenda with the addition of adding trail rules. Mr. Barton seconded the motion. Motion approved unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Mr. Barton made the motion to approve the minutes of May 21st. Mr. Mathews seconded the motion. Motion approved unanimously.

STATUS REPORTS:

Youth Assistance Fund: Mr. Lishman reported that there were 18 requests since our last meeting in the amount of \$435.00. There was \$76.00 received in donations. The projected fund balance is \$2,651.32.

Park Signs: Mr. Youel reported the Park Rule signs have been installed throughout the parks and doggie bags are being installed with assistance from the Hangtown Kennel Club. The new signs have been a great tool for the Police Department.

World's Largest Swim Lesson: Mr. Youel thanked the Commission for attending the World's Largest Swim Lesson special event.

Trail Rules: Mr. Youel shared his findings regarding strategies to promote newly established trail rules for the City's portion of the El Dorado Trail. Although Mr. Youel could not find a formal "Trail Rules" formal campaign he did observe that many communities have posted rules and a trail map that includes the rules. Commissioner Barton suggested that there may be grant funding available in the near future that could be used to promote the newly established rules.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Youth Basketball: Mr. Lishman reported that staff is seeking the Commissions support on a recommendation to increase participant fees for the upcoming Youth Basketball program. The proposed increase is from \$87 to \$90 for the early bird fee and from \$97 to \$100 for the non-early bird fee. Mr. Lishman shared with the Commission that on July 1st, 2014, minimum wage increased from \$8.00 per hour to \$9.00 per hour necessitating the proposed increase.

Mr. Mathews made the motion to approve the recommended fee increase. Mr. Nolan seconded the motion. Motion approved unanimously.
