# 7. BUDGETARY AND FINANCIAL ANALYSIS FOR THE SEWER ENTEPRISE FUND AND WATER ENTERPRISE FUND (Mr. Warren):

The Staff Liaison presented the revised draft Fiscal Year 2011/2012 Operating Budgets for the Sewer Enterprise Fund and Water Enterprise Fund, a revised analysis of the potential reduction in sewer rates or water rates, and augmentation to the capital improvement program budget that could be afforded by the Measure H sales tax in Fiscal Year 2011/2012. The presentation was followed by discussion by the Committee.

### 8. RECOMMENDATION(S) TO THE CITY COUNCIL:

The Staff Liaison summarized the forecasted Measure H sales tax revenues available in Fiscal Year 2011/2012 and the uses for such revenues as discussed by the Committee. Following the Staff Liaison's comments, the Committee discussed its recommendations to the City Council for Fiscal Year 2011/2012. Following discussion by the Committee, it was moved by Chairperson Rodman and seconded by Committee Member Cumpston to adopt the following recommendations to the City Council for Fiscal Year 2011/2012:

## Uses for Measure H Sales Tax Revenues in Fiscal Year 2011/2012:

- 1. Appropriate \$541,300 in Measure H Sales Tax revenues to provide a discount to sewer charges based on a formula effective April 16, 2011; and
- 2. Discount should be shown as a separate line item on the utility bill that reads, "Measure H Discount"; and
- 3. Discount Formula should be the equivalent dollar amount of a 10% decrease in forecasted Fiscal Year 2009/2010 sewer user rate revenue allocated by the aggregate weight (as a percentage) of residential revenues in Fiscal Year 2009/2010 divided by the number of residential accounts and the aggregate weight of non-residential revenues in Fiscal Year 2009/2010 divided by the number of non-residential accounts; and
- 4. Discount should be a flat dollar amount rounded down to the nearest five dollars (\$5.00) that will remain static for the next six billing periods; and
- 5. Remaining Measure H revenues (approximately \$211,793) but not less than \$200,000 should augment the existing Sewer Enterprise Fund Capital Improvement Program as recommended by the Director of Public Works.

### Roles and Responsibilities of the Alternate Committee Member:

An Alternate Committee Member who is either a residential Member or a commercial property/business owner Member should be authorized to vote in the absence of either a residential or commercial property/business owner Member.
