2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Madam Clerk.

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO, what do you have on the
4 agenda tonight?

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I have one ordinance for,
6 it looks like stop signs and yield signs on Crestwood and
7 Hope Street, and then I have a couple of resolutions. I
8 know one is for the property room. Let me see. Let's see.
9 I have a contract for E-Ticketing. I have a -- authorize
10 online auction for propertyroom.com, and authorize the
11 shooting range with the Borough of North Arlington. That's
12 all I have.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you.

14 Commissioner Evans.

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I have a report for the Code
16 Enforcement Department, the December yearly report of the
17 operations. I have a public hearing on ordinance 3278 which
18 is the digitizing of the records in the code department,
19 \$200,000, which is fully funded ordinance. And then I have
20 five resolutions which it's the beginning of the year, which
21 establishes the temporary budget authorization till we adopt
22 the 2018 budget, and then some refunds and cancellations of
23 taxes.

24 I do have a need for (indiscernible) executive.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Rogers.

1 removal services. And I'm looking for authorization to
2 advertise sealed bids for the ADA Alterations to the Police
3 Department from the Community Development Block Grant.

16 non-compliant bid from Gaeta Recycling on the commingled. I
17 have to award the bid to Basso for the collection of
18 commingled. We can extend the contract of Rotondi & Sons for
19 the acceptance of vegetative waste. We have a change order
20 from Stanziale Construction for Hancox. It's a decreased
21 amount of \$3,491.66. I have an award of a non-fair and open
22 contract to Inglesino, Webster, Wyciskala & Taylor for the
23 redevelopment and I have authorization to go out to bid for
24 the CDBG roadway projects Princeton, Hunt, Bayard and
25 Witherspoon.

1 That's all I have.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Madam Clerk.

7 MADAM CLERK: Thank you, Mayor.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Madam Clerk, we're going to go
3 right to the proclamation before the minutes. All right?

4 MADAM CLERK: Great.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: You guys have waited long
6 enough. We apologize.

7 We're very happy to have the Nutley High School
8 Raider Marching Band with us tonight. And they did a great
9 job down in Florida at the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl in winning
10 down there and coming home with \$10,000. So we're very
11 proud of you and we have this proclamation that I'm going to
12 read.

13 WHEREAS, the 2017 Nutley High School Raider
14 Marching Band enjoyed a highly successful season that
15 culminated in the band's invitation to compete and perform
16 at various TaxSlayer Gator Bowl activities in Jacksonville,
17 Florida; and

18 WHEREAS, the Raider Band was one of only 11 bands
19 from across the country invited to participate in the
20 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl performances; and

21 WHEREAS, the Raider Band competed against two
22 other bands in the "Contest of Champions Field Show
23 Competition" on December 28, 2017, where it won 1st Place
24 Overall and Caption awards for Best Music, Percussion, Color
25 Guard, Marching and Maneuvering, and Overall General Effect;

1 and

2 WHEREAS, the Raider Band earned a Grand Prize of
3 \$10,000 and the honor of a solo performance on its field show
4 "Ascent" during the Gator Bowl Pre-Game Program and also
5 performed with the other high school bands during the game's
6 Pep Rally and Half-time Program; and

7 WHEREAS, the Nutley High School Raider Marching
8 Band was led by John Maiello, Band Director; Vincent
9 Vicchiariello, Assistant Band Director; and also received
10 administrative support from Dr. Julie Glazer, Superintendent
11 of Schools; Dr. James Riley, District Coordinator of Fine
12 and Performing Arts; and Principal Denis Williams; and

13 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of
14 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
15 State of New Jersey hereby commends and congratulates the
16 members of the Nutley High School Raider Marching Band and
17 staff for their exceptional success at the TaxSlayer Gator
18 Bowl, and for representing themselves, Nutley High School,
19 and the entire Nutley community with such distinction
20 through their talent, hard work and determination.

21 We congratulate you.

22 (Applause)

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioners, would you like to
24 say a couple of words before I turn it over to Mr.
25 Carnicella?

1 Commissioners.

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Sure. Sure, I'll start. We don't want
3 to be remiss. We want to congratulate you again, all right,
4 because this is a repeat performance of capturing this
5 championship and getting this -- the additional funding that
6 I'm sure will go right back into the band program. You guys
7 are awesome. All right. You make us proud every time you
8 pick up those instruments and you -- you start playing.
9 There's just not enough we can say to tell you how proud of
10 you we are and how we want you to continue to do this, and we
11 hope to see you back here next year so we can do this again.

12
13 Congratulations.

14 (Applause)

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I'll just add briefly, you know, no one
16 does this alone. So, you know, congratulations to all of you
17 for your fine work. It's great to -- for it -- to have you
18 bring home Nutley pride which we're so, so very, very proud
19 of. I congratulate all the parents as well because your
20 dedication and support to allow your students to engage in
21 these activities. I know there's a financial obligation to
22 that as well.

23 So -- so, just congratulations to all of you, and
24 as Mauro said, we are very proud. Bring home the Nutley
25 pride. Thank you.

1 (Applause)

2 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: You're not only known in this
3 state, but you're known nationwide and perhaps around the
4 world. One of the benefits of having such a great group of
5 young people like yourselves and the parents in this township
6 is that you've become an anchor for this community. You've
7 become a drawing card for people to move here and to get
8 their children involved in something as great as this. And
9 that's something that we'll all be proud of for not just
10 today and in the past, but many years to come.

11 So I want to congratulate you. It really makes me
12 really proud that I live here and that I'm a commissioner
13 here and I'm your friend. Thank you so much. God bless
14 you.

15 (Applause)

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I would just like to add,
17 you know, I have to say kudos to the directors, the families,
18 everybody that makes this happen year in and year in (sic).
19 I just can't believe the stretch that you guys have had.
20 It's amazing. It's year after year. I know when I was in
21 high school I played basketball, believe it or not, and, you
22 know, a couple of years the team was good, then it was
23 rebuilding years. And with the band it just seems like year
24 after year it's unbelievable.

25 So it's really good to have you guys here.

1 Congratulations. To go out of state and to -- especially
2 Florida and bring home the money and the trophies is
3 unbelievable and you make your township really proud and you
4 put us on the map. So congratulations.

5 (Applause)

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: As a former band parent I know
7 all the hard work that you put in, you know, days and nights
8 you're out on the Oval with the lights shining on you when
9 it's dark out. So there's a lot of -- a lot of hard work
10 that goes into this and a lot of support from your parents
11 and your family and the music boosters.

12 So congratulations again. I'm going to bring up
13 Mr. Carnicella. You want to say a couple of words?

14 MR. CARNICELLA: (Indiscernible). I would also
15 like to have our superintendent, Dr. Julie Glazer come up as
16 well. We have a resolution that we're going to read tonight
17 and (indiscernible).

18 (Pause)

19 MR. CARNICELLA: Okay. That's a little bit better.
20 So just wanted to let everyone know we are actually going to
21 do a presentation ourselves. It's Monday at our next
22 scheduled board meeting and we're going to ask the
23 commissioners as well to please join us if you can.

24 We couldn't be more proud. I mean, we really are.
25 This is amazing. I know last year we were working on band

1 uniforms. I know we didn't have them this year, but I'm
2 hopeful that when we do get them you're going to have a
3 three-peat and that we're going to do great things again.

4 I know I heard from some of the parents that they
5 were concerned that maybe the -- you know, we were concerned
6 whether we were going to be as competitive as we thought we
7 would be down there, and we nailed it. I didn't expect
8 anything less. It's a great group of kids. It's a great
9 group of parents. We have great leadership and hopefully we
10 continue everything that we -- we've been doing in this
11 district. You all make us proud with everything that you
12 guys do and we really, really appreciate that.

13 MS. GLAZER: I'm just glad that I got to be there
14 with you. It was cold and wet and you guys were amazing.
15 And -- and I don't need to say much more. I got to speak to
16 you all down in Jacksonville. I couldn't be any prouder and
17 I'm looking forward to everything that comes next.

18 MR. CARNICELLA: And I also just wanted to thank --
19 we had some coordination the night that the students came
20 back. The police department was able to coordinate an
21 escort that brought our kids back into Nutley. I know myself
22 as well as our -- one of our trustees, Brenda Sherma, was out
23 there in the bitter cold. And I will tell you that the
24 temperature did go up when that bus came down with the police
25 lights. The kids were in the bus with their --

1 with their phones out videotaping. We had sparklers. We
2 had signs. We were in the middle of the street. We had
3 done everything wrong, by the way.

4 (Laughter)

5 MR. CARNICELLA: Everything we did wrong. We
6 blocked the street ourselves. We didn't need police once
7 they got to the high school. But it was just -- it was just
8 a memorable moment and I'm -- and I'm hopeful and I'm -- and
9 I'm thankful that we've had the opportunity to be a part of
10 it. And I -- and I hope that you had the same appreciation
11 that we felt knowing that you guys did such a wonderful job
12 down in Florida. Okay.

13 And we do have a resolution that I'm going to
14 read. It's a long one, a lot of whereas so just bear with
15 me.

16 Recognition of the Nutley Marching Band and Color
17 Guard for winning the Tournament of Champions at the
18 TaxSlayer Bowl competition:

19 WHEREAS, Nutley High School Marching Band and
20 Color Guard competed in the TaxSlayer Bowl Tournament of
21 Champions in Jacksonville, Florida in December 2017; and

22 WHEREAS, the marching band and color guard won
23 caption awards for best percussion, best color guard, best
24 music, marching and maneuvering and overall general effects,
25 and

1 WHEREAS, the marching band and color guard won
2 best overall for Group 2A, and

3 WHEREAS, the marching band and color guard won
4 \$10,000 and the honor of performing live at the Taxslayer
5 Bowl pregame show, and

6 WHEREAS, the Nutley High School Marching Band and
7 Color Guard competes against the most successful and
8 respected programs in both the United States and abroad,
9 exposing our students to the type of competition that forges
10 character, teamwork and determination, and

11 WHEREAS, by participating in the program Nutley
12 band and guard members learn to balance a variety of
13 responsibilities, maintaining the highest level of academic
14 achievement while committing their physical and mental
15 endurance to a strenuous training and competition,

16 WHEREAS, the students have gone on to find success
17 in premier colleges and universities, both in the classroom
18 and in competition, and

19 WHEREAS, the program continues to impact our
20 students so positively that alumni and their children have
21 returned to the program to play, march, coach and contribute
22 to our district as staff members, teachers and
23 administrators, and

24 WHEREAS, the Nutley High School Marching Band and
25 Color Guard has benefited from the unwavering support of the

1 Board of Education, the Board of Commissioners, and the
2 Nutley Music Boosters.

3 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of
4 education of Nutley Public Schools, in the Township of
5 Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, recognize and
6 congratulate the commitment of the Nutley Marching Band and
7 Color Guard for this competition and renew its unwavering
8 commitment to support the program and its continued success
9 in the future.

10 Thank you, again, and let's have one more round of
11 applause for our -- our children. Thank you.

21 say that Nutley is a really special place. It kind of is
22 the -- was the perfect storm when I came here 14 years ago
23 where you were looking for someone that -- that wanted to
24 achieve big and great things. You know, what we do here
25 between music boosters and the town is just truly amazing.

1 It's -- it's a partnership that just doesn't happen. And I
2 know this because, you know, the band director world is a
3 very small world. So I'm good friends -- well, I've been
4 around forever so I'm good friends with a lot of other band
5 directors in Northern New Jersey and these things just don't
6 happen by themselves. They don't happen in isolation and
7 they don't happen in any other place.

8 So I -- I would like to extend, if you guys

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

4 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

5 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans.

9 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: That's it for bills, Mayor.

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Public comment on agenda items
16 only.

17 Madam Clerk.

18 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

19 All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners
20 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone
21 and provide their name and address for the record. Unless
22 further time is granted by the board each person shall limit
23 their address to three minutes. All remarks to the board
24 and its individual members must be addressed to the Mayor.
25 The Mayor may defer citizens comments to the appropriate

1 member of the board.

2 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing
3 the board shall be allowed unless the Mayor or presiding
4 officer or the majority of the membership of the board shall
5 determine if the interest of decorum and/or the expeditious
6 conduct of municipal business are being adversely affected
7 by such dialogue.

8 MS. CELENTO: Hi. I'm Amy Celento and I live at
9 70 Newman Avenue in Nutley. And in regards to Agenda Items,
10 it looks like a contract is being signed with Basso for
11 collection of commingled recycling. And I'm curious. Does
12 that replace the work that's currently being done by both
13 water and sewer and the Department of Public Works in terms
14 of collecting recyclables?

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yes, it does.

16 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So that will be outsourced?

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We're going to outsource the
18 commingled pickup. Yes.

19 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So does that change anything
20 in terms of staffing, budgeting, overtime --

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yes, it does. As --

22 MS. CELENTO: Oh.

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- you know we're going through
24 a detailed review of all our departments and one of the
25 things we're looking at is how we can reduce to become more

1 efficient and reduce our staffing and our manpower. And
2 that is going to help us reduce our manpower going forward.

3 MS. CELENTO: Thank you for that.

4 So I guess is there a timeline to report that
5 back? Like will there be some sort of information that's
6 presented here in terms of the net savings or --

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, we have a lot of net
8 savings that Commissioner Evans is going to detail in the
9 coming weeks. So, yes, that will be.

10 MS. CELENTO: So thank you so much for that. The
11 overtime report. There's a significant amount of overtime
12 for water operations. I mean, 44 percent of the payroll in
13 this two-week period was -- overtime was 44 percent on top
14 of the general salary for water operations. That just seems
15 like an extraordinary amount of --

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We had --

17 MS. CELENTO: -- overtime.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- 19 water breaks between
19 December 5th and today.

20 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So this is for payroll paid
21 it looks like January 16th so I don't know what that
22 timeline is, but I'm assuming that's the December -- the
23 last two weeks of December potentially?

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

25 MS. CELENTO: In terms of I don't know what the

1 timing is for reporting overtime and then processing and
2 making the payment.

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. It would be in that
4 period.

5 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So you might have had 19
6 during that period or you could have had fewer. So -- okay.
7 That's interesting to know.

8 Additionally, the Department of Public Safety, six
9 percent overtime. It seems like there are a number of staff
10 in the Department of Public Safety that could be scheduled
11 accordingly. I mean, I read the police blotter. I'm not
12 sure if the emergencies, you know, warrant significant
13 overtime. It just seems like a lot of money to be paying
14 in overtime.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Traditionally, we -- I --
16 that caught my eye tonight also and traditionally the police
17 department I would say would run about 4,000 every two weeks
18 for their overtime.

19 However, during the holidays we put anticrime
20 units out there. We put extra staffing out. Traditionally,
21 we have a lot of burglaries, home burglaries this time of
22 year. We put a presence out there on the corners also, and
23 I'm very happy to report, yes, we did spend some money. We
24 did not have one house burglary through the holiday season
25 in Nutley because of what we prevented. And that you can't

1 gauge. You can't put -- you know, you don't -- having these
2 guys out there you don't know what you're preventing out
3 there. But I think the facts speak for itself with these
4 anti-crime units and spending a few dollars. I would rather
5 have a safe community and no burglaries than -- you know, be
6 conscious of the money, you know, but this time of the year
7 I do have a free hand in it.

8 MS. CELENTO: All right. I appreciate that. And
9 I'm curious. There are things -- and I understand that
10 police outside duties are usually covering for construction,
11 PSE&G, et cetera. So is there -- is this expense -- I mean,
12 is it netted out? Is there income that offsets the police
13 outside duties expense of --

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The out --

15 MS. CELENTO: -- 26,877.50?

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: The outside assignments when
17 they're doing road construction or anything with an outside
18 assignment, it's usually outside of this. Okay. It's not
19 in that summary that you see there.

20 However, I'm going to check this tomorrow morning
21 because it does seem a little high and we've -- I believe we
22 had an instance where it got mixed in one time or another.
23 But I'm going to look into that tomorrow.

24 But as the rule is, is that's done separately. So
25 there's no -- I mean, when they -- when you see the road

1 construction going on, and right now public service has a big
2 push that we've actually had to invite Belleville in to cover
3 all the, you know, the development that Roche is doing right
4 now. That does not come out of the taxpayers' dollars at
5 all.

6 MS. CELENTO: Right. That's what I was assuming.
7 So there's an offsetting income or it's a pass through
8 payment. And I guess I'll ask you, Commissioner Petracco and
9 you, Commissioner Evans, is this really kind of a pass
10 through payment?

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes.

12 MS. CELENTO: Okay. And so along those lines in
13 the water sewer department they did numerous markouts for
14 PSE&G on many dates. So does PSE&G pay the Town of Nutley to
15 do those mark outs?

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They didn't pay us to do
17 the mark outs. No. That's part of our duties.

18 MS. CELENTO: Okay.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They weren't done on --they
20 were done on town time.

21 MS. CELENTO: And so we're obligated to do that
22 for --

23 MAYOR SCAPRELLI: Yes, we are.

24 MS. CELENTO: -- PSE&G?

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yes, we are.

1 MS. CELENTO: Okay.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We received some paint from
3 the --

4 MS. CELENTO: All right.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- (indiscernible).

6 MS. CELENTO: So then I just wanted to say I
7 appreciate the reports. One or two are double-sided and the
8 rest are single-sided. It would be really great to see
9 cost-savings of paper and the environment to just print them
10 double-sided.

11 Thank you.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address the
13 Board of Commissioners on agenda items only?

14 MR. MOORE: Rory Moore, 462 Chestnut Street.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO, can you explain the E-
16 Ticketing? Do you have that on the (indiscernible) tonight?

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What would you like to know
18 about it?

19 MR. MOORE: What is it? Could you explain --

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: E-Ticketing, we started
21 when John Holland was still the chief here. It's really just
22 an electronic form of ticketing. We do outsource that. It's
23 -- that is a revolving door and how we do that as far as the
24 money collected, the fee that we pay. We budget for
25

1 it, but we get reimbursed for that.

2 MR. MOORE: (Indiscernible).

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You're very welcome. And
4 all it -- all it is is
5 electronic ticketing.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address
7 the board of commissioners on agenda items only?

8 Seeing none, let's -- any board of commissioner
9 announcements?

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Just -- just one, Mayor, if
11 I might. Unfortunately, I was not able to attend the first
12 meeting in January so I just want to wish everyone a very
13 happy and healthy new year.

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else?
15 Thank you, Commissioner.

16 Ordinance introductions, Commissioner Petracco.

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yes. I have Ordinance
18 Number 3379, an ordinance to amend an ordinance codified in
19 the code of the Township of Nutley, Chapter 228, Entitled
20 Vehicles -- I'm sorry. I didn't have my mic on. And
21 Traffic, particularly Article V, and the -- this is yield to
22 intersections. This is an ordinance introduction for Hope
23 Street to add a stop sign on an intersection.

24 After -- I move this ordinance be passed to the
25 second reading and advertised in the Nutley Sun together

1 with the notice required by law, and that the further
2 consideration of said ordinance for final passage by the
3 Board of Commissioners to be held at its second reading on,
4 is it January 25th, correct, Madam Clerk?

5 MADAM CLERK: February 20th. Is that the date you
6 have on there, February 20th?

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You know what? I've got
8 to get a different power of glasses. You are correct.
9 February 20th, 2018. I move the ordinance.

10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Second.

11 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

12 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

13 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

24 that was introduced on December 19th relating to the
25 digitizing and archiving of records in the code enforcement

1 department. The amount of the ordinance is for 200,000.
2 It's not new debt. We have canceled old outstanding
3 balances to provide the money to pay for the need for this
4 expense.

5 MR. MOORE: (Rory Moore, 462 Chestnut Street.

6 COMMISSIONER EVANS, there's is a very technical
7 term for what you do in a digitization. It's called vendor
8 lock. Everybody's very aware of it. When you hire your
9 first vendor (indiscernible) going to convert that data
10 (indiscernible).

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Correct.

12 MR. MOORE: And that format may not be able to be transferred
13 if we decide to change vendors or they go out of business or
14 buy a different company. Are you going to have the data
15 converted to a universal where it can be changed in time?

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: So my understanding is yes.
17 The vendor we're using is under state contract and the format
18 fits with Spatial Data which is the main system that we use
19 in the town. So, yeah, I appreciate the concern about having
20 -- the grasp of having to do this again if we did it. But
21 we're guarded against that.

22 MR. MOORE: That's very -- that's very
23 (indiscernible).

6 the Board of Commissioners this evening?

7 MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive.
8 At the last meeting it was noted by Commissioner Evans
9 (indiscernible) zero based budget process. Is there an
10 explanation for the change in budgeting process?

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: The budgeting process is --
12 follows the state guidelines under the law that we have to
13 do that. The zero base approach basically says that it's
14 not about just looking at the money that we had --

15 MS. LANDRY: Can you --

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes. Can you hear me now?

17 MS. LANDRY: Yes.

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: So when you -- I hit the
19 button. When you do a zero base approach it's not about
20 just looking at the money that you have in the account.
21 It's about actually going back fundamentally to say what do
22 I need. So it's as if I had a zero balance and that I was
23 actually going to determine fully what was the money that
24 was necessary to spend that -- in that year.

25 So it's just a fundamental way of looking at

1 budgeting to make sure that you craft an efficient budget.

2 MS. LANDRY: Okay. And you had said at the last
3 meeting that you had reduced the budget by I think 2 million
4 and there was still a half a million to go. Have --

5

6 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Roughly.

7 MS. LANDRY: Have we made any --

8 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. The potential
9 increase for 2018 in the budget was almost \$3 million and we
10 had moved to a point where we have made adjustments to
11 reduce that amount to two million -- by two million four
12 which left us roughly \$600,000 left to address which we're
13 still working on.

14 MS. LANDRY: Still working on. And have we applied
15 again for 2018 for transitional aid and do you anticipate any
16 transitional aide and how much?

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I -- that's just a variable
18 right now. We have to make application. Applications are
19 due by the end of February, given the timing, and then we
20 won't hear -- as we -- as consistent with prior years we
21 won't get a determination of what our aide will be probably
22 until the May/June time frame.

23 MS. LANDRY: May/June to find if --

24 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. It just gets us to

25 --

1 MS. LANDRY: -- we will get any
2 transitional aide?

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: -- within each year. Yeah.

4 MS. LANDRY: So you have no anticipate -
5 - I mean, it was 5.5 and then last year it was 3.5. You
6 anticipate any aide from the State ongoing for --

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Absolutely.

8 MS. LANDRY: -- the road?

9 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Absolutely. I anticipate
10 the aide. As to the amount of the aide, that still has to
11 be negotiated.

12 MS. LANDRY: Okay. All right. And then
13 you had also said and I know that Superintendent Glazer had
14 reached out to you about doing a joint meeting with the
15 superintendent and yourself a town hall for the people who
16 were interested in the budgeting process and better
17 understanding the process that a joint public meeting be
18 held. Have you spoken with the superintendent about
19 scheduling that meeting?

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS We are in discussions.

21 MS. LANDRY: You're in discussions? Do
22 you --

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes.

24 MS. LANDRY: -- anticipate it will
25 happen before the 2018 budget?

1 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I -- I'm still talking with
2 her about what she wants to accomplish because I'm not fully
3 clear yet. My understanding at this point is that she would
4 like to hold a session to explain to the public the different
5 rules that apply to the school board under the school
6 district budgeting rules versus the municipal budgeting
7 rules. It's not -- from my understanding it's not about
8 talking about the budget for 2018, just the differences in
9 the rules.

10 MS. LANDRY: And in 2015-2016 I had made requests
11 that the Board of Commissioners schedule minimally two town
12 hall meetings a year for input outside of the Board of
13 Commissioners' meetings, just more of a town hall open
14 forum. And I would once again like to make that request
15 that in the year 2018 at least two town hall meetings for
16 public input on all issues be scheduled.

17 Thank you.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address the
19 Board of Commissioners this evening?

20 MS. CELENTO: Hi. Amy Celento, 70 Newman
21 Avenue and I have a number of comments and questions.

22 So in the water sewer report from November and
23 December there's a mention of starting to fix the parking
24 lot by Ciccolini's. I know that in previous meetings there
25 has been money allocated to have an outside service do

1 a study on what to do with the Ciccolini property, and there
2 was a timeline. I'm sorry. I did not get my hands on that
3 specifically, but is there a date when there will be a report
4 presented on what to do with the Ciccolini property?

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Genitempo, you want to
6 handle that?

7 MR. GIANTEMPO: Sure. There's no -- there's no
8 calendar in terms of a schedule yet. We're working with the
9 planners to kind of repurpose that at least on a temporary
10 basis until we know how we're going to develop it. So we're
11 -- that's part of the process was to clean up the parking
12 lot and then come up with some ideas, and we're working with
13 the planners on that right now. We don't have anything
14 definitive, but we are working with them.

15 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So when you say the planners
16 are you referencing the outside company that we've hired or
17 are you talking about --

18 MR. GENITEMPO: Just the --

19 MS. CELENTO: -- other --

20 MR. GENITEMPO: No. I'm talking about topology.

21 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So we don't have a timeline
22 and we don't -- but we know that there have been some
23 repairs already made in anticipation of a temporary use?

24 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm not sure what the repairs were
25 for so I can't speak to that. But I know the parking lot

1 and cleaning it up and getting it in order is part of the
2 overall plan, and I think we're going to be meeting with
3 them shortly to talk about more specifics.

4 MS. CELENTO: Okay. Thank you.

5 So in relation to that at the last meeting there
6 was a request that the master plan be reviewed and that it
7 be reviewed in a town hall forum, maybe similar to what
8 Penny was just suggesting. And I'm wondering is there a
9 timeline for that, the master plan --

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The master plan --

11 MS. CELENTO: -- update or review?

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The master plan by law has
13 to be reviewed every ten years. So --

14 MS. CELENTO: Well, I understand --

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So the last one was --

16 MS. CELENTO: -- by law --

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- 2012.

18 MS. CELENTO: Right.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So --

20 MS. CELENTO: So there's no -- there's no thought
21 of --

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: There's no --

23 MS. CELENTO: -- giving an interim review? I mean
24 --

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: There's --

1 MS. CELENTO: -- it's 2018.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- no thought at this
3 point. No.

4 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So along the lines with the
5 planning board it's my understanding that the public comment
6 section of the planning board meetings are limited to agenda
7 items. It seems like there's no open public hearing for
8 non-agenda items at the planning board. And that doesn't
9 seem like in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I would have to look at the
11 agenda and what's done on that.

12 MS. CELENTO: If you could because it's been
13 consistent the last few agendas that have been posted online
14 that it is limited to items being presented that evening.

15 Thank you so much.

21 I think, Commissioner Evans, you mentioned something to the
22 effect of we're trying to keep people employed. So I'm not
23 clear if that's related to this revision in the budget plan
24 and you're just trying to balance employment or -- you know,
25 I wasn't quite clear. I mean, unemployment in the state is

1 at 4.9 percent. It's just slightly above the U.S. rate of
2 4.1 percent and it's on par with New York City. So I wasn't
3 quite sure what that was referencing.

4 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Just say that again. I
5 didn't quite hear your first part.

6 MS. CELENTO: Oh, I'm not really clear from the
7 last meeting you had mentioned something to the effect of
8 we're trying to keep people employed, but I couldn't hear
9 everything that you said. So I wasn't sure what that meant.
10 Is that --

11 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah.

12 MS. CELENTO: -- related to town employees or --

13 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I'm not -- the context of
14 that I don't recall so I would have to go back and review
15 the minutes so that I would better understand it and be able
16 to answer your question.

17 MS. CELENTO: Okay. So just circling back to when
18 I spoke just before in this meeting tonight you did mention
19 that it looks like there might be some staff reductions in
20 terms of, you know, outsourcing jobs, et cetera.

21 So, you know, I guess that will be revealed with
22 the budget process.

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: That's correct.

24 MS. CELENTO: Okay. Thank you so much.

25 Additionally, I know there was a mention at the

1 last meeting from Commissioner Petracco about the numbers of
2 fires are increasing. Along the lines of transparency it
3 would be great if we could get reports like we got for the
4 shade tree department and the water department. It's like
5 how many fire calls were there. I mean, if you read the
6 police blotter it leads you to believe thankfully not -- you
7 know, there aren't that many.

8 But it would be really helpful from a citizens'
9 perspective to see similar types of reports in terms of fire
10 calls, police calls, et cetera. It would help us understand
11 overtime.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, I mean, it's the
13 second time you've brought up overtime. Public safety
14 overtime has been held to a minimum for sure, and I can
15 furnish you that information at any time.

16 You know, when you look at this cycle and you say
17 well -- and, you know, I can kind of see your body language
18 all -- it's \$28,000 for just -- you know, for this pay
19 period. That's not the norm in public safety. Like I said
20 we do that, you know, through the holiday season because of
21 the (indiscernible)burglaries, stolen packages and so forth.
22 And I'm very proud of the police officers for preventing a
23 lot of stuff here.

24 As far as the reports for the fire department and,
25 you know, the police department I could work on some of

1 that. I can tell you, you know, fires are contagious I'll
2 say. You know, you have three or four. We have a string of
3 three or four fires this year and then you know what, it
4 gets a little quiet. But it's -- it's, you know, definitely
5 a need that I think that we need in the town. Our fire
6 department responds anywhere in the town in two minutes. I
7 think it works well with the hybrid system that we have
8 volunteers.

9 But if a report is what you would like a report is
10 what I'll furnish for you.

11 MS. CELENTO: Thank you.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: All the calls of service I can put on
13 there as well. Did you want the police department or --

14 MS. CELENTO: I think it would be really helpful
15 and very interesting to the citizens. I mean, we have a very
16 safe town and you have an effective department and --

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you.

18 MS. CELENTO: -- it would be great to see, you know, really
19 what's happening. And not just related to overtime, but
20 truly, you know --

21
22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. I'll tell you

23 --MS. CELENTO: -- what happens.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- I mean, even when I
25 became a commissioner back in 2008 your eyes will open. You

1 can't -- you won't believe how busy it is in -- you know, in
2 both those departments. Even with the fire department
3 doings inspections and life hazards and fire prevention and
4 the police calls are incredible. And what we drag into this
5 police department would make your hair stand up.

6 So thank God we still have good buffers out there,
7 like Bloomfield, Belleville even Clifton and Lyndhurst. But I
8 have to tell you, you know, public safety is worth the
9 investment in my eyes and I live here, too. You know, you
10 don't hear about stores getting robbed and, you know, too
11 much stuff. So you never know what they're preventing is --

12 MS. CELENTO: Oh, I agree with you. And I'm
13 saying it would be a nice public relations story in terms of
14 saying everything that is being prevented. It would be
15 fantastic to hear.

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I appreciate that. Thank
17 you.

18 MS. CELENTO: Thank you. Thank you for your time.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address the
20 Board of Commissioners this evening?

21 MR. BROWN: Hi. Matthew Brown, 26 Woodland Ave.

22 Actually, I'm onto (indiscernible) regarding the
23 Master Plan. I do understand that (indiscernible)
24 reviewed till 2022 I guess it is. But given the current
25 situation which includes redevelopment of On3, the Roche

1 private property, the Ciccolini property (indiscernible)
2 addition of a lot of multi-family dwelling units across the
3 town just sort of (indiscernible). I would just encourage
4 this chamber to not wait until 2022 to review that
5 (indiscernible)important threshold and the future of the town
6 right now. And I would encourage you to review that sooner
7 rather than later and to open that process up to the public
8 to provide some transparency to town hall meetings
9 (indiscernible).

10 Thank you.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Mr. Brown.

12 Anybody else like to address the Board of
13 Commissioners this evening?

14 MR. MOORE: Rory Moore, 462 Chestnut Street.

15 Mr. Scarpelli, I have two questions tonight, one
16 for Mr. Petracco and one for Mr. Evans. OPRA responses
17 (indiscernible) responds cell phone bills, the town. And on
18 here we clearly see there's double billing because the same
19 number appears on two separate bills. And it happens twice.
20 I called AT&T and they explained it to me. And it seems to
21 be that there's something wrong the way it's being done. And
22 I have seen this on other ones. I just printed these out --

23 MR. GENITEMPO: What's your point, Mr. Moore?

24 What's wrong? Why don't you tell us what's wrong?

25

1 MR. MOORE: I guess I thought -- I thought I just
2 did.

3 MR. GENITEMPO: In other words, what did they say
4 was wrong?

5 MR. MOORE: They said that they looked at bills
6 because I had faxed these over to them because I asked their
7 opinion on it and they said that one number appeared twice on
8 two separate bills.

9 MR. GENITEMPO: Who did you speak to at AT&T? I
10 would like to call them.

11 MR. MOORE: I'm not going to tell you my sources.
12 Please.

13 MR. GENITEMPO: Well, how do you expect us to --

14 MR. MOORE: (Indiscernible).

15 MR. GENITEMPO: Wait. How do you expect us --

16 MR. MOORE: Would you like (indiscernible) papers?

17 MR. GENITEMPO: I'll take your paper in a
18 second.

19 MR. MOORE: Okay.

20 MR. GENITEMPO: But how do you expect us to
21 address it if we -- if you won't give me the name of the
22 person?

23 MR. MOORE: I -- I would look at the paper and I
24 would look at the telephone number --

25 MADAM CLERK: Thank you.

1 MR. MOORE: -- and it seems to be quite evident
2 that it happened on more than one occasion. This is just
3 the three I printed off (indiscernible).

4 MR. GENITEMPO: I'll take a look at it, Mr.
5 Moore, but if you really are claiming to be helpful why
6 don't you give me the name of the person you spoke to so
7 that I can get right to the heart of it instead of wasting
8 time?

9 MR. MOORE: Because (indiscernible) looked
10 everything up and --

11 MR. GENITEMPO: Oh, so you're using --

12 MR. MOORE: -- (indiscernible) --

13 MR. GENITEMPO: -- one of your --

14 MR. MOORE: -- (indiscernible) --

15 MR. GENITEMPO: So you're using one of your
16 friends at AT&T to check up on Nutley. Okay.

17 MR. MOORE: Yes. Yes, I did.

18 MR. GENITEMPO: All right. Well, if he's a
19 friend of yours let him be a friend of ours.

20 MR. MOORE: I'm not sure that I want to do that.

21 MR. GENITEMPO: Okay.

22 MR. MOORE: COMMISSIONER PETRACCO, I have an OPRA
23 response and apparently had another accident to a fire
24 truck?

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I don't -- I don't know
which one you have.

1 MR. MOORE: Would you like to see it?

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Sure.

3 MR. GENITEMPO: Do you have a date of it, Mr.
4 Moore?

5 MR. MOORE: Pardon me.

6 MR. GENITEMPO: The date of the accident?

7 MR. MOORE: It's on -- it's -- all of it is right
8 on there. It's from the collision specialists. I mean, you
9 (indiscernible).

10 MR. GENITEMPO: You're basing it off of a bill for
11 repair of a truck, right?

12 MR. MOORE: It's replacing where they said this is
13 an accident --

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Counsel, I think I can
15 answer -- I can clarify this.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay. Thank you.

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you. Yeah.

18 MR. MOORE: Was that an accident?

19 MR. GENITEMPO: Only, Commissioner, I've
20 been dealing with a lot of these OPRA (sic) requests so I
21 may have some knowledge, but maybe not all of it. Maybe

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO Mixed them up maybe.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Maybe.

24 I believe I could definitely give you a precise
25 answer. Unfortunately, we had I think in one of the

1 volunteer houses someone backed into the fire station. You
2 know, with these trucks you have to understand, Mr. Moore,
3 these fire houses were built over a hundred years ago I
4 think it's fair to say and these trucks have gotten bigger
5 and bigger and they're in -- entering or exiting in a hurry.
6 So I believe this is the one that we had an issue with when
7 a volunteer backed into something, actually the fire house.

8 MR. MOORE: Okay.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So I think that's the one,
10 but I could give you a better answer. That's the one that I
11 recall off the top of my head.

12 MR. MOORE: Thank you. So it --

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: My pleasure.

14 MR. MOORE: -- (indiscernible) accident
15 (indiscernible).

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address the
18 Board of Commissioners this evening?

19 Can I have a motion to close the public portion of
20 the meeting?

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Move it.

22 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Second.

23 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

24 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

25 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

1 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

2 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans.

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

4 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

8 Before we break I -- you know, the fire department
9 was brought up today. And I was in Shop Rite on Sunday and
10 one of the workers came up to me and he lives near the corner
11 of Beech and Bloomfield. And he said he saw the smoke and
12 within seconds it seemed like the fire department was there.
13 And he said and he watched from his window and the precision
14 that went from the time they got there, everybody knew what
15 they were doing. And they were able to save that house and
16 he was most -- most impressed they saved his house.

17 So I wanted to -- he asked me if I would pass that
18 onto you and I wanted to pass that onto you, Commissioner.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you so much. I
20 appreciate the compliment. We have a great staff here in
21 Nutley. Like I said our neighboring communities, you know, I
22 know they're not what they were when I was growing up here in
23 Nutley and they're having difficulties with -- in their
24 public safety. I think public safety is an essential
25

1 service, a well investment because you can't put a price on
2 safety.

3 As far as the firemen, Mr. Mayor, you know, I --
4 my store is right over there and I ran over there as well.
5 It's amazing. The paid guys, the career guys, the
6 volunteers, how they coordinate together and they really
7 save a lot of structures here in town.

8 I had a business in another neighboring town where
9 it was all volunteer. Unfortunately, I was a professional
10 at triggering the smoke detectors in that place as a false
11 alarm and I can tell you it was 20, 25 minutes before
12 anybody got to that building. So I think that we strike a
13 good balance here and I think it's money really well spent.

14 Thank you.

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner.

16 Anybody else?

17 Motion to adjourn.

18 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Make a motion to adjourn.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

20 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

24 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans.

25 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Aye.

1 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

3 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

5 Goodnight, everybody.

6 (A chorus of goodnight)

7 MADAM CLERK: The time is 9:09.

8 (Whereupon, at approximately 9:09 p.m. the meeting
9 concluded.)


