WHEREAS, in October of 1949, Al joined Nutley

Scout Troop 147 at the age of 12, under the leadership of

Scoutmaster James Swan; and

WHEREAS, he entered the United States Navy and served as a radioman, advancing to Second Class Petty

Officer. Discharged in 1958 at the age of 21. Welenofsky -am I closer? -- began planning his first great adventure
which included a cross-continental canoe trip with his
partner, Ted Nothaft; and

WHEREAS, in April of 1958, he started his trip from the mouth of the Columbia River which took one year and four days, canoeing 4,300 miles. On April 9th, 1960, they paddled their canoe Endurance up the Passaic River to the Dock Street Marina boat landing in Nutley, where Mayor Harry W. Chenoweth presented the canoeists keys to the Town of Nutley, followed by a parade up Centre Street with Scouts and Nutley citizens. Al has canoed 11,027 miles throughout his career; and

WHEREAS, after his enlistment in the Navy, Al earned a bachelor's degree in special education and a master's degree in reading specialization. He started teaching handicapped students in 1965 and last taught at the MLK School No. 6 in Passaic before he retired in 2012; and

WHEREAS, Al is also an avid mountain climber. He has reached the highest point in 49 of the 50 states, two territories, Washington, D.C. and the highest point of 12 countries, including 19,340-foot Mt. Kilimanjaro in Africa and Japan's Mt. Fuji;

WHEREAS, he is a recipient of the Nutley Jaycees
Young Man Award and the Mattia Distinguished Community
Service Award for his commitment and service to scouting.
In 2011, he was inducted into the Nutley Hall of Fame.

In April, 2014, Al received the Unit Leader Award of Merit from the Northern New Jersey Council, Boy Scouts of American. He also has been the recipient of the Silver Beaver Award, and the highest Council recognition; and

WHEREAS, he has never lost his passion for scouting. In 1965, he became a Scoutmaster of Troup 147 and held that position until February, 2000.

In February, 2008, he again became Scoutmaster and has totaled more than 43 years in this position.

His lifetime dedication to scouting has brought him through over 60 years of his life.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Board of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, that Alfred -- I'm sorry, again -- Welenofsky be recognized and congratulated on his lifelong achievement and commitment to the Boy Scouts of America.

WHEREAS, tens of millions of Americans face mental health conditions like depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia or post-traumatic stress disorder.

During National Mental Health Awareness Month, we reaffirm our commitment to building our understanding of mental illness, increasing access to treatment and ensuring that those who are struggling know they are not alone; and

WHEREAS, over the course of a year, one in four adults will experience a mental illness yet less than half will receive treatment. Too often mental health is regarded as different from other forms of health yet, like any disease, mental illness can be treated. However, left untreated, mental illness can become worse; and

WHEREAS, by building an open dialogue, we can encourage support and respect for those struggling with mental illness. Part of that dialogue involves training police officers, who are often the first responders to a situation involving a person in psychiatric crisis.

Essex County Crisis Intervention Team, also known

WHEREAS, the Nutley Police Department has been active in CIT training, with Officers Mathew Canova, Sergeant Michael Kraft, Sergeant Tiffany McDermott, Detective Tom Perrota, Officer Gerard Tusa, Officer Carla Vitale and Lieutenant Kevin Watts receiving instruction in CIT procedures;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners for the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, does hereby proclaim May, 2016 as Mental Health Awareness Month and recognize the important contributions made by the Essex County Crisis Intervention Team and the Nutley Police Department working to improve and possibly save lives affected by the illness.

I would like to bring up Patricia Keenan, who's Director of the -- Assistant Director of the Essex County Hospital Center, and Lieutenant Richard Cavanaugh (ph) for the Montclair Police Department. These two run the CIT training in the County. They do a tremendous job. It's a volunteer effort. They don't get paid to do it.

CIT is a 40-hour training for the officers. It takes a whole week. I'm involved a little bit in it and

it's a great collaboration between mental health and the police departments.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you for coming and being the public safety director here in Nutley, I appreciate all the training and, obviously, we're seeing more of mental health issues around our town and around the County and, obviously, around the State.

So we appreciate the friendship that we've built with the County in order to get that job done.

Would you guys like to say a few words?

LIEUTENANT CAVANAUGH: Sure. Thank you, Mayor.

First of all, I -- I really need to thank you for assisting us with this program. Without you and without the -- the administration stepping forward and saying; you know what? We want our police department to know about it. We wouldn't have a program to put out and -- and we would not be able to help the citizens of Nutley in the way that -- in (inaudible) much as we're giving cutting edge training to these officers.

So I -- I really thank you very much for the opportunity to come here today. Thank you for the Proclamation and thank you for recognizing that, you know, mental health is something that really does affect all of us one way, shape or form.
