7	And the last is the state hasn't approved yet their
8	budget, the state budget and the revenue stream, I guess,
9	their state budget, which is holding up the certification of
10	the tax rate. They may have to do that
11	(inaudible). So we could anticipate some resolution on that
12	(inaudible). That's all I have.
13	MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Rogers?

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah, they cannot -- it says 11 12 here that, "Commercial vehicles shall not be permitted to be 13 parked within the PRD between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. 14 15 ALAN GENITEMPO: Isn't there a weight limit 16 on that? I thought that my recollection was that over a 17 certain tonnage. COMMISSIONER ROGERS: There is. 18 There is a weight standard. 19 COMMISSIONER EVANS: 20 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.
