Street (inaudible - 7:45:33) -- the opportunity to go to a

Nutley Planning Board meeting in reference to 113 East

Centre Street (inaudible - 7:45:43).

I was -- I'm within two hundred feet of this

project (inaudible - 7:45:46) and I picked up the

resolution. I thought that -- I wasn't too happy with the

outcomes and what was conducted at the meeting. So I got a

copy of the resolution (inaudible - 7:46:09) every site plan

from the Planning Board (inaudible - 7:46:12)s

It had letter "Q" subject to approval by the Board of Commissioners so I'm here to address what I noticed about this resolution (inaudible - 7:46:28) -- came to the signature sheet (inaudible - 7:46:33) -- my understanding that there is supposed to be a quorum vote which in this case there's, I guess you would say, nine board members and if one is absent, there are alternates.

I checked out the sheet to see who approved it and on the sheet, four members signed. If the meeting was on March 27th, 2013, then I guess they had a meeting on April 3rd and, like I said, four people had signed this and then I went even a little deeper into checking it out. It appears

(inaudible - 7:47:27) requests on valid board members, term expirations, two out of the four members' terms have expired.

So, you know, I -- I'm against the project because I feel that (inaudible - 7:47s45). I don't want to totally get into (inaudible - 7:47:50) time consuming. Like I said, letter "Q" says it's subject to approval by the Board of Commissioners and (inaudible - 7:48:\$1) an invalid resolution, I think that's a problem.

And I also noticed another thing. This isn't (inaudible - 7:48:45) the thing is in accordance with the (inaudible - 7:48:20) law, quorum vote (inaudible - 7:48:26) -- 55-D23. So (inaudible 7:48:30-1) that but (inaudible - 7:48:34) was that (inaudible - 7:48:37) abide by and (inaudible - 7:48:42) valid.

MAYOR PETRACCO: So let me just be clear. Let me just be clear. So you're saying that you don't think that resolution is valid because there was only four board members there that signed off on it that night that the meeting was there?

MR. ALESSIO: Yeah, and two of their terms (inaudible - 7:49:50) --

MAYOR PETRACCO: Well, I --

1 MR. ALESSIO: (Inaudible - 7:49:505) to the 2 municipal land law, an alternate voter could be on the board 3 for two years. 4 MAYOR PETRACCO: Uh-huh. 5 MR. ALESSIO: Alternate one (inaudible - 7:\$49:15) 6 before alternate two but (inaudible - 7:49:20) board member 7 is not there like Mr. Scarpelli wasn't there so to have a 8 quorum of nine (inaudible - 7:49:28) -- Well, let's make it 9 easy, because seven usually vote but four out of seven wins. 10 Two of these people (inaudible - 7:s19:43) valid as far as 11 their (inaudible - 7:49:\$46) --12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Well, let me say this to 13 you. Go --14 MR. ALESSIO: (Inaudible - 7:49:50) 15 MAYOR PETRACCO: I'm glad (inaudible - 7:49:51). 16 Thank you. MR. ALESSIO: (Inaudible - 7:49:54). 17 18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible - 7:49:56) and 19 I'll be happy to check with him. Depending on what the 20 terms were, we need to find out who (inaudible - 7:50:97) 21 there may be holdovers (inaudible - 7:50:50) according to 22 the statute, they may still be able (inaudible -7:50:42). 23 MR. ALESSIO: I think you you'd better --24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I heard this was yesterday 25 (inaudible - 7:50:19) Mr. Alessio?

MR. ALESSIO: But I did send Mr. Cozzera (ph) a certified letter two weeks ago so I wouldn't have to make the appearance here because I'm not a public speaker. I'm, you know --

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's fine.

MR. ALESSIO: Not my forte but I get by with it and he didn't address the issue. And I --

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: He never responded?

MR. ALESSIO: He never called me or -- I asked for a written, you know, explanation. In fact, his term has expired 12/31/2012. So maybe his term should be looked at too. Now, as far as a voter, I don't think he votes but my interest is in the voting, the class of the voters, which on March 27th, we did have a 6 to 1 vote for the project. But when it -- there something wrong with that because alternate voters don't cast their vote when the panel has class four, class two and different classes that are above them.

They're supposed to sit on the board and ask questions and, like I said, if one member is missing, like Mr. -
Commissioner Scarpelli wasn't there that particular time, the alternate would be allowed -- alternate one would be allowed to vote.

And alternate one was Mr. Naughton (ph) on the paperwork side, which is a legal document. Mr. Naughton did not vote and Mr. Paratacco (ph) voted. He's alternate two.

So, you know, there's different things that are legal here that -- like, you know, are above me but common sense tells me that there's something wrong here. When you have a quorum, like I said, and four people vote in the quorum and two terms are expired. Mr. Jack Barry's (inaudible - 7:52:33) expired and (inaudible - 7:52:36) Paratacco.

You know, I mean, I opened this stuff and, you know, I'm sure you could find every excuse to say they're not outdated or what not but I believe that it's a valid complaint from me because I believe that although two out of the four people seemed to be legit, the other two weren't and that still doesn's t make up, in my opinion, the amount of people that should have signed this particular document. And that's basically all I have to say about that.

And I would hope that you would consider like, you know, checking this out because, you know, I have my reasons why I come here and why, you know, I believe that -- what I believe is different than what the Planning Board actually believe. They actually voted for this.

But there are a couple of other issues and one of the other issues that I'm concerned with, (inaudible - 7:53:45) they call it an easement, quote, unquote, call it (inaudible - 7:53:52) Lane (Inaudible - 7:53:55) industrial tract of land (inaudible - 7:54:64 - 7:54:62).
