14 total bill of \$4,306,465.72. And that's for bills this
15 evening, Mayor.

4 And they're actually federal police officers. And these
5 gentlemen are men of very high rank and have different areas
6 and different types of zones that they enforce, you know,
7 one is the Mafia. Then they have drugs. They're in charge
8 of different zones and areas and what they actually police
9 for. And these men are very highly decorated men and they
10 do a wonderful job and they come out here and they embrace
11 us and they welcome everybody to visit them as well. So,

20 Certain Streets, Section 14 entitled Parking Prohibited
21 During Certain Hours, to add the location Bank Street.

25 said ordinance for final passage by the Board of

7 Lane, Old Bridge, New Jersey, not to exceed \$3,523.00.

14 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: "Aye". Okay. We'll open up the
16 meeting to the public but just a couple reminders before we
17 do. We have a special general election Wednesday,
18 October 16th, 2013 from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Please get out and
19 vote. And we have a general election Tuesday, November 5th,
20 2013. The time is 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. And the next Board of
21 Commission meetings will be held on Thursday, November 7th,
22 2013 at 7 p.m., right here, third floor, commissioner
23 chambers.

24 Okay. Thank you. Is there anyone this evening
25 that would like to address the Board of Commissioners?

1 Please state your name. Excuse me one second.
2 We're going just going to read our little five minute rule.

3 MADAM CLERK: Yeah. All persons addressing the
4 Board of Commissioners regarding community concerns should
5 approach the microphone and provide their name and address
6 for the record. Unless further time is granted by the
7 Board, each person shall limit their address to five
8 minutes.

9 All remarks to the Board and its individual
10 members must be addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer
11 citizen comments to the appropriate member of the Board.
12 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing the Board
13 shall be allowed unless the Mayor or presiding officer or
14 the majority of the membership of the Board shall determine
15 that the interests of the (indiscernible - 8:20:39) and/or
16 expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
17 adversely affected by such dialogue.

18 Name and address for the record please.

19 MS. SMITH: Deborah Smith. I live at 341 East
20 35th Street in Patterson.

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Good evening.

22 MS. SMITH: Good evening. I come before you
23 tonight as a representative of the North Jersey
24 Developmental Center Family Association.

25 Back in August of 2012, the Governor's Task Force

1 on developmental summer closures decided to close two of the
2 seven developmental centers. Both North Jersey
3 Developmental Center and the Woodbridge Developmental
4 Center. These are the only two developmental centers
5 currently available in northern New Jersey and would
6 devastate family members in the north who visit their loved
7 one if they were to close.

8 I am here tonight to ask you to pass a resolution
9 to keep both of the developmental centers open and send a
10 resolution to the Governor expressing your support in our
11 cause.

12 My daughter, Keisha Smith, has been a resident of
13 North Jersey Developmental Center for 27 years. I am angry
14 and saddened over the decision to close her home. I'm
15 deeply concerned about the future of her wellbeing and the
16 possibility of her being placed 100 miles, one way, from her
17 family and I am terrified over the adverse impact that such
18 a distance would have on my family's ability to keep a
19 relationship with our daughter.

20 Keisha is 42 years old. She's profoundly,
21 intellectually disabled. She has limited functional speech,
22 aggressive behavior issues. She suffers from epileptic
23 petite mal seizures and has experienced as many as 100 of
24 those seizures a day. And thanks to the care and the
25 medical treatment she has received at North Jersey

1 Developmental Center, her seizure activity is under control.
2 In fact, we have not seen her have a seizure in over ten
3 years.

4 There are not enough services in the community
5 that would be equal to or better than the services she
6 currently receives at North Jersey Developmental Center.

7 Developmental centers operate under the ICFMR
8 model of care. That is the intermediate care facility for
9 the mentally retarded which is the most comprehensive care
10 available for our most vulnerable population in the
11 developmental community. This care, this level of care, is
12 not available in community centers. In fact, community care
13 waivers are required from any parent who wants to place
14 their child, their loved one, in a group home. That
15 community care waiver in essence says, I give up my
16 daughter's right to receive the most comprehensive medical
17 treatment and care that she is currently receiving in North
18 Jersey Developmental Center.

19 Just to give you a little background, in 1999, the
20 Supreme Court ruled on a case known as the Olmstead decision
21 which decided that individuals should live in the least
22 restrictive setting so long as those services are available
23 in the community. The services are appropriate for those
24 individuals and they do not choose to live in community
25 placement -- well, they do choose to live in community

1 placements. Excuse me.

2 This is the State's basis for moving individuals
3 out of developmental centers. Yet all of the services in
4 the Olmstead decision are not being met. I agree and I
5 respect the Olmstead decision as it relates to those
6 individuals who have the desire and the functional capacity
7 to live in the community. They should live in the
8 community.

9 But every resident that lives in the developmental
10 center cannot live or survive in a community placement. My
11 daughter would not survive in the community group home. She
12 started in the community group homes and those placements
13 were not successful. Although well intended, the
14 individuals charged with her care could not deal with her
15 inability to express herself, her wants and her needs,
16 because of her limited speech. They could not handle her
17 aggressive behavior or the frequency of the seizure activity
18 she experienced on a daily basis. Giving her medication to
19 her twice a day was even more of a challenge for them.

20 I respectfully disagree with the State's
21 interpretation of the Olmstead decision and their belief
22 that everyone, regardless of their functional capacity, can
23 be cared for in a group home.

24 My daughter needs the type of care she received
25 for 27 years at North Jersey Developmental Center. If the

1 State closes North Jersey Developmental Center, she will be
2 transferred to another center 100 miles, one way, from her
3 family. Such a distance will drastically reduce my family's
4 ability to continue a close relationship with Keisha and
5 will cause her to regress.

6 This is the case for many of the individuals
7 living in Woodbridge and North Jersey Developmental Center.
8 Six of the seven developmental centers did a survey in 2009
9 of family members and guardians and 96 percent of those
10 chose the developmental placement over community.

11 I speak on behalf of my daughter because she can't
12 speak for herself. On behalf of my daughter and all of the
13 residents in developmental centers, I ask you to stand with
14 us to stop the closure of these facilities and pass a
15 resolution in support of keeping them open.

16 I also express to all of you tonight my sincere
17 thanks and appreciation for allowing me the opportunity to
18 tell our story -- tell my story. We need your help and
19 we're asking you to help us in our endeavor. Thank you so
20 much.

21 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you so much.

22 MS. SMITH: I have some literature I'd like to
23 pass up.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: I was just going to ask you if
25 you had any literature. That would be great. If you'd just

1 hand it to our Clerk.

2 (Pause.)

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Ms. Smith, thank you. We
4 apologize for taking a little while in the executive session
5 keeping you guys waiting.

6 MS. MARKS: Good evening and thank you for
7 allowing us to come. My name is Evelyn Marks and I live at
8 111 Passaic Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey. I am a resident
9 here in Nutley.

10 I have a son that resides in Woodbridge
11 Developmental Center. Steven's (ph) been there since he's
12 -- 23 years now. When Steven was a baby, maybe about two
13 and a half months old, he had a cold. I gave him baby
14 aspirin. Then he had a fever and then the fever was going
15 up and down. I had two doctors that came to the house.

16 One morning when I went into his room to take him
17 out of the crib, he was laying on his side this way and when
18 I touched his body he was stiff. I picked him up. I had to
19 roll him over and I picked him up. I went into the kitchen
20 and sat down on a chair. And I literally had to take his
21 legs and push them down on my lap.

22 I called the doctor and the doctor came. He had
23 some rounds to make and after the rounds, he came to my
24 house. And he looked at Steven and examined him and he had
25 to take him into baby's hospital in New York City. And on

1 the way over, he started to convulse.

2 Then, after that, when he was in the hospital, his
3 -- they found water on the brain. They had to do a spinal
4 tap. At the end result it was he had haemophilus
5 meningitis. It was a bacteria that went in through his ear
6 and damaged all the brain cells to all the part of his body.
7 Around two o'clock in the morning, the doctor came out and
8 told me my son wasn't going to live.

9 Well, when I look back now, I realize that little
10 boy was fighting for his life and now I have to fight for
11 him because he can't get up here and speak and tell you I
12 don't want to move. I want to stay where I am.

13 Steven is profoundly retarded. He can't speak.
14 He can't walk. He has -- he can feed himself but as far as
15 anything else, no. At Woodbridge, they have an oval. When
16 I go down there, I take him out and walk him around outsidee
17 And when I stop, he rocks and -- and he rocks in the
18 wheelchair. He wants me to walk with him some more.

19 I love to see him smile and when I talk to him and
20 tickle him a little bit, he laughs and he's very happy there
21 and I want to see that he can stay there.

22 Please help us not to close these places. My son
23 can't go into a community living either.

24 MAYOR PETRACCO: Are these -- excuse me one
25 second. Are both these places the same place that you speak

1 of?

2 MS. MARKS: One's in Woodbridge and one's in
3 Totowa.

4 MAYOR PETRACCO: One's in Woodbridge and where's
5 the other one?

6 MS. MARKS: One's in Totowa.

7 MAYOR PETRACCO: I'm sorry.

8 MS. MARKS: That's okay.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Where was it? Where is that
10 other town? Oh, Totowa.

11 MS. MARKS: Totowa.

12 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Go ahead, continue.

13 MS. MARKS: Okay. All right. Thank you very much
14 for your time.

15 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. And thank you for coming.

16 MS. ST-AMAND: Thank you for the opportunity to
17 talk. My name is Joanne St-Amand. I live in Cranford, New
18 Jersey. I'm the president of the parent's association at
19 Woodbridge Developmental Center and I have a sister who's 58
20 years old who lives at Woodbridge and who's been there for
21 38 years.

22 So just to give you a little background. The
23 State operates seven developmental centers and, like Deborah
24 said, they chose to close the only two centers in North
25 Jersey, leaving us no choice but to go to South Jersey if we

1 choose to stay in a developmental center. So that's why
2 we're really fighting.

3 We need more -- we obviously need more services
4 and we definitely need more group homes. We have over 8,000
5 people on the waiting list. But to close these centers and
6 to move 600 people out makes no sense when we have a waiting
7 list for services. We need both. We don't need to cut
8 anything back.

9 The developmental centers -- the people in the
10 developmental centers are your most profoundly,
11 intellectually disabled. They represent about five percent
12 of the entire population of the disabled people. So we're
13 talking about, really, the minority of those individuals.
14 Most of the individuals that could thrive in the centers
15 have left the centers already. There's been this movement
16 ever since the 80's and they've slowly been transferred out
17 of the centers. So what you have left are really
18 profoundly, intellectually disabled --

19 Not only that, but their average age is in the
20 50's. We're not talking about children. We're talking
21 about adults. And, at Woodbridge, we have people in their
22 70's and I'm sure we have the same thing at North Jersey
23 Developmental Center.

24 So, you know, again, whatever you can do to fight
25 this. To leave us no centers in North Jersey is just

1 inhumane. It's just unethical. It's a train wreck waiting
2 to happen. So anything that you can do --

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: I have a question and if any of
4 the other Commissioners like to join in --

5 What is the reason -- why are they closing the
6 centers? Is it just fiscal or is it --

7 MS. ST-AMAND: I -- it's a hard question to answer.
8 First they said it was because of cost. But we have
9 documents that show that individuals, like my sister, and
10 the others at the centers, would actually cost more going
11 into the community because now you're forcing all those
12 services onto your local municipalities, your emergency.
13 There's no on-site doctors at these places. Everything goes
14 to the ER we're at the centers.

15 Then they said it was Olmstead but Olmstead
16 doesn't say you have to close centers. It says you have to
17 be in the most appropriate place.

18 Then they say it's the quality of care. But it's
19 demonstrated that the developmental centers provide very
20 good quality of care.

21 So, you know, privatization. I don't really know.

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Do you have a question?
23 Go ahead.

24 MS. ST-AMAND: Thank you.

25 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

1 MS. ST-AMAND: Anything you can do for us, we
2 appreciate it.

3 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you for coming.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good evening.

5 MAYOR PETRACCO: Good evening, sir.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible - 8:34:02)
7 32930 South Broad Street, Trenton, New Jersey. I'm the
8 political legislative representative for the American
9 Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFSCME,
10 and I represent AFSCME workers at Woodbridge Developmental
11 Center and North Jersey Developmental Centers.

12 And I'm here to ask you, the Nutley Town
13 Commissioners, to help the family, guardians and workers
14 fight to keep Woodbridge Developmental Center and North
15 Jersey Developmental Centers (indiscernible - 8:34:25)
16 residents of Woodbridge Developmental Center and North
17 Jersey Developmental Center are your citizens. They need
18 your help.

19 They are the least able to care for themselves and
20 that's why we're here asking you to stand with them to save
21 their homes. Many of them have lived at Woodbridge
22 Developmental Center and North Jersey Developmental Center
23 for decades and know no other home.

24 The State's plan to move the residents into
25 community group homes is ill conceived and deadly, as stated

e

1 by former Deputy Director of the New Jersey Division of
2 Developmental Disabilities for 32 years, Bernie White. He
3 said that moving the residents from Woodbridge into the
4 community setting would result in a 47 percent higher death
5 rate than them remaining in the centers. These statistics
6 are gathered from States where this has already been done,
7 like California and Ohio.

8 And, if that were not reason enough, one of the
9 family members and one of the residents of AFSCME CWA or
10 (indiscernible 8:35:20) workers at Woodbridge Developmental
11 Center of North Jersey Developmental Center live in your
12 City and are taxpayers and voters in your township of Nutley
13 and they do shop here and they spend a good part of their
14 combined developmental center income of approximately \$91
15 million in your City, (indiscernible 8:35:36) \$50,000 by
16 your resident.

17 I say that because the Governor's Task Force
18 determined that finances lost to the cities would not hurt.
19 I ask you, can anybody stand to lose any part of \$91 million
20 in these hard economic times? Or have the City support the
21 added costs of group homes placed in your City with the
22 added police, emergency services, fire and rescue that they
23 require?

24 We're here asking you to stand with the residents
25 of Woodbridge Developmental Center and North Jersey

1 Developmental Center by passing a resolution in support of
2 keeping Woodbridge Developmental Center and North Jersey
3 Developmental Center open. But not only them, all of the
4 developmental centers as other city councils have done for
5 the residents of developmental centers.

6 We're asking you to send that resolution to the
7 Governor and your State legislative delegation and we're
8 asking you to sign our petition tonight. And I thank you.

9 MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Is there anyone else
10 that would to address the Board of Commissioners?

11 Seeing no one, I need a motion, move to adjourn.

12 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Second.

13 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

14 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: "Aye".

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: "Aye".

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

18 COMMISSIONER EVANS: "Aye".

19 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

20 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: "Aye".

21 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Petracco?

22 MAYOR PETRACCO: "Aye".

Department of Public Works progress of work in the Road/Recycling Division for the month of March 2013 is as follows:

All Public works equipment was serviced and repaired by our Mechanics.

We picked up recycling throughout the township, consisting of plastic, paper, aluminum, mixed glass and clear glass and brought it back to the garage where it is separated and put into bins.

Once recyclables are loaded, they are put into large carting containers and brought to various places, such as:

Newspaper to Galaxy Recycling, Jersey City, NJ
Co-Mingled to Galaxy Recycling, Jersey City, NJ

This occurs several times a week.

Potholes around the township were filled in with hot asphalt. Also, large patches of asphalt were laid down, where needed.

Reflectors are placed on all dead end barricades throughout the township.

Dead end barricades were painted throughout the township.

On days and nights of very heavy rain, we work with the police Department on flooded streets so we may maintain all catch basins, clearing them of debris to prevent flooding of streets. This procedure is done all winter with the Police and during snow season also.

We assist the Police in vehicular accidents, cleaning up debris left by the accidents.

We try to assist the departments when we have the manpower. We pick up loose leaves and leaves in bio-bags, when required, all around the township, with the help from the Water

Department and the Parks Department. Commissioner Joseph P. Scarpelli--Page 2 Department of Public Works progress of work in the Road/Recycling Division for the Month of March 2013.

On Mondays and Fridays, we divided up the work load by picking up the recyclables at the condos, located at various areas throughout the town and doing work on our roads, such as filling in potholes, using winter mix, weather permitting cleaning off tops of catch basins and also inside them.

The Road Department also carts several containers of debris to Bergen County Utilities Authority, North Arlington, NJ for the Clean Communities Department and the Parks Department.

MONTHLY STANDARD PROCEDURES are as follows:

Newspaper is brought to Jersey City, NJ several times a week.

We empty litter baskets, every Monday and Friday located in all the parking lots, well area, town hall area and garages.

On Mondays and Fridays, we also send out our sweepers to clean around the Town Hall, Public Safety Building and Parking Lots.

We maintain the appearance of parking lots by picking up loose leaves and debris. Our sweepers are sent out every day to various areas in town to keep our streets as clean as possible. This also starts early in the morning.


We pick up all salt barrels.
