WHEREAS, Essex County Victims' Rights Weeke April 22 through April 28, 2012 - and Essex County Police Week - May 13 through 19, 2012 - offers us all the opportunity to promote strength in unity by assisting and advocating on behalf of crime victims and their families and supporting the efforts of local level law enforcement agencies in our communities; and

WHEREAS, a just community seeks to heal the wounds that crime has caused, acknowledges crime's impact on individuals, families, and neighborhoods, ensures that crime victims, including those officers killed in the line of duty, are treated with fairness, dignity, and respect as they navigate and interact with the criminal justice system, and empowers them to reengage fully in society; and

WHEREAS, the voices of victims throughout New Jersey have, for almost three decades, been instrumental in changing laws, policies, and attitudes to promote a place that is free from violence and an America where crime victims are consistently provided supportive services to help them to cope with the trauma of crime and victimization; and

WHEREAS, Essex County Crime Victims' Rights Week provides an opportunity for our county to recognize the foundation of crime victims' rights- fairness, dignity, and respect – and to recommit ourselves to honoring those values by ensuring that all victims are afforded their legal rights and provided assistance as they fact financial, physical, and psychological impact of crime; and

WHEREAS, Essex County Crime Victims' Rights Week also provides residents the opportunity to reflect on the impact of crime and terrorism upon people and our entire county and strengthens our resolve to ensure that victims' needs are identified and addressed expeditiously; and

WHEREAS, we, collectively, recognize that justice isn't served until crime victims are served and that crime victims' rights are an integral component of the statement "justice for all". Further, we value our right to be free from violence in our workplaces, to be safe in our homes, to send our children to drug-free and violence-free schools, and to live our lives in peace in our communities; and

WHEREAS, we, the citizens of Essex County and its elected officials, believe that victims of crime should have the right to be full participants in the criminal justice process and be provided with comprehensive case status information, and that offenders should be held fully accountable for their criminal actions; and

WHEREAS, as we carry the State's crime victims' rights movement into 2012 and beyond, we publicly acknowledge and pledge to "Extend the Vision" and support laws and policies that reflect that criminal justice should be inclusive of the rights of those who have been injured by the cruel actions of criminals, and build communities where the legal rights of crime victims are honored, respected and, most importantly, enforced; and

WHEREAS, Acting Essex County Prosecutor Carolyn A. Murray operates the highly efficient Essex County Prosecutor's Office of Victim-Witness Advocacy, which is celebrating its 30th anniversary, and serves as a model throughout the state in providing direct, one-on-one services for tens of thousands of County residents who are victims and witnesses of crime annually, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, resolve April 22 through April 28, 2012 as ESSEX COUNTY CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS WEEK and May 13 through 19, 2012 as ESSEX COUNTY POLICE WEEK and urge all citizens and agencies, public and private, to support the enforcement of crime victims' rights and services in Essex County through participation in local and state activities commemorating those rights and salute the service of all Essex County law enforcement officers who work diligently to keep our communities safe and violence free.

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, January 24, the Commander-in-Chief of our Armed Forces reminded all Americans that, "Above all, our freedom endures because of the men and women in uniform who defend it," and that "this generation of heroes has made the United States safer and more respected around the world."; And

WHEREAS, the President, further promised, "As they come home, we must serve them as well as they've served us. That includes giving them the care and the benefits they have earned... And it means enlisting our veterans in the work of rebuilding our nation."; and

WHEREAS, National Guard and Reserve forces today total over 1 million service members and represent 48 percent of our total military force; while every day around the globe, thousands of men and women in uniform including dedicated members of the National Guard and Reserves, risk their lives and make great sacrifices to defend our national interests, serving extended tours away from their homes, families and jobs; and

WHEREAS, at the same time, we are now seeing unprecedented levels of unemployment and underemployment among members of the Guard and Reserve, as up to 22 percent of Guard and Reserve members face unemployment; and

WHEREAS, in this time of economic uncertainty, the Employer Support Guard and Reserve (ESGR) is focusing on connecting employers with the talented pool of service members and their spouses, with the intent of facilitating meaningful employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, to further this goal, the New Jersey ESGR has launched an Employment Initiative Program (EIP), which is a collaborative effort with federal agencies including the Department of Labor (Veterans Affairs), the Department of Veterans, the Small Business Administration and the Office of Personnel Management; and

WHEREAS, the goal is to enhance the employment process and serve as an effective resource for service members and employers. ESGR is also partnering with Employer Partnership of the Armed Forces (EPAF) through EIP with a high-tech and high-touch approach; and

WHEREAS, for almost a year now, the United States Chamber of Commerce has also endeavored to find employment for our returning veterans and the spouses of those who continue to serve, at home and abroad, with its Hiring Our Heroes Program; and

WHEREAS, the Hiring Heroes Program is a nationwide effort to help veterans and military spouses find meaningful employment, in partnership with the Department of Labor Veterans Employment and Training Service (DOL VETS), to improve public-private sector coordination in local communities, where veterans and their families are returning every day; and

WHEREAS, despite those efforts, the unemployment rate for veterans of our Armed Forces in our Nation and in our State continues to exceed the over-all rate; and

WHEREAS, in order to take the lead on advancing the EIP to the next level, the New Jersey ESGR has enlisted strong and positive support from corporate leaders, the New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce, US Dept. of Labor/VETS and the New Jersey League of Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, it is incumbent on all of us to prove that New Jersey cares for the men and women in uniform who risk their lives and make great sacrifices to defend our national interests; and

WHEREAS, this employment initiative can be New Jersey's way of saying thank you to the men and women who made great sacrifices to protect our nation's freedom; and

WHEREAS, local officials throughout the State of New Jersey, working together through the League of Municipalities, and with the New Jersey ESGR, their local and State Chambers of Commerce, and local business leaders can help to advance basic fairness to our vets and their families by pursuing one simple goal: to allow America's over one million unemployed veterans and military spouses to follow their dreams, instead of spending their lives just trying to catch up;






