Bond Ordinance No. 3213

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR RECONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS STREETS AND SIDEWALKS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$350,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING \$332,500 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$350,000, including the sum of \$17,500 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$332,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued, are reconstruction of curbs, sidewalks and roadways, including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all pursuant to plans and specifications on file with the Township, which plans and specifications are hereby approved.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with the bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a). BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$620,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$589,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COSTS THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, as general improvements. For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$620,000, including the aggregate sum of \$31,000 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes.
