

23 Now THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of
24 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley in the County of
25 Essex, New Jersey that Jack Kane's substantial

1 accomplishments with the Veterans of Foreign Wars be hereby

3 2012 was adopted on the 1st day of May, 2012; it is desired

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of

11 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Second.

12 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

13 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

15 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

16 MADAM CLERK: Deputy Mayor Evans?

17 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

18 That's all I have.

19 That concludes the formal portion of our meeting.

20 If you will approach the podium this evening for the open
21 section of our meeting.

22 MADAM CLERK: All persons addressing the Board of
23 Commissioners regarding community concerns should approach
24 the microphone and provide their name and address for the
25 record.

1 Unless further time is granted by the Board, each
2 person shall limit their address to five minutes.

3 All remarks to the Board and its individual
4 members must be addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer
5 citizen comments to the appropriate member of the Board.

6 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing
7 the Board shall be allowed unless the Mayor or Presiding
8 Officer or the majority of the membership of the Board shall
9 determine that the interests of decorum and/or the
10 expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
11 adversely affected by such dialogue.

12 Name and address?

13 MR. FISHER: David Fisher. 22 Lynn --

14 MADAM CLERK: That was David Fisher (indiscernible
15 - 7:53:05)e

16 MR. FISHER: Correct.

17 MADAM CLERK: And your address?

18 MS. FISHER: 22 Lynn Road.

19 MADAM CLERK: Lynn Road, okay.

20 MR. FISHER: Which is as of today if you guys
21 (indiscernible - 7:53:15)

22 MALE SPEAKER: I'm having a little difficulty
23 hearing you. Speak closer to the mic if you can.

24 MR. FISHER: Okay. Sure. No problem.

25 I was here last month and I tried to tell them

1 I've been in this town for 22 years. I've had potholes in
2 front of my house for 22 years and it's gotten to the
3 problem where you're patching pothole on top of patch hole
4 (ph). The street potholes and there's one in the middle you
5 patch in a pothole. It just gets beyond ridiculous.

6 So the infrastructure on the top of the road is
7 really not being taken care of. I just ask for it just to
8 be patched. The right of my house, the left of my house,
9 (indiscernible - 7:53:59) it's fine. It's just the 50 foot
10 stretch in front of my house because everybody makes u-
11 turns, whatever the problem is. It's really just in front
12 of my house.

13 Now, here's the problem. There was a water main
14 break I'm sure everybody is aware of in Lynn Road. That was
15 in front of my house. I believe it was because the
16 infrastructure that wasn't taken care of on top of the road,
17 I didn't know it would have damaged the infrastructure under
18 the road. I had to deal with that.

19 So what I would like to do is just have that patch
20 of road taken care of so I don't have to deal with it
21 anymore. Because if you could see the pictures, as of
22 today, this is this afternoon, the dirt is still on the
23 road. I can't get out of my car and get in my house without
24 having dirt on my feet.

25 I've hosed it down and asked the town to have

1 street cleaners. That picture was after the street cleaner
2 left. I still have dirt in my road that I can't. It's --
3 this is -- I don't know what to do anymore.

4 I don't know if to go to the county or the State,
5 but the road has to be fixed. If I don't -- can't get it
6 done here --

7 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Thank you.

8 Commissioner Scarpelli?

9 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Yeah, Mr. Fisher, you
10 were here last month and the next day we had the street
11 sweeper out there and sweep up and pick up some of those big
12 rocks that you complained about that hit you.

13 Actually they went out there once and I went and I
14 didn't like the way it was done and I had them come back and
15 they were -- did it two or three times until it was clean.

16 Thursday we had a water main break up there. Most
17 of that, that's been swept a couple times today. That's
18 kind of like stains from the color that's there. We had a
19 storm over the weekend that kind of washed it all over the
20 place. We'll send them back up there again tomorrow to try
21 to sweep that.

22 As far as repairing that roadway, it's budgetary
23 at this point. It's not going to be done before the end of
24 this year and hopefully we can get that done in the spring.

25 I know what you're talking about, it's a patch,

1 but it's a big patch and hopefully we'll have that in place
2 for the spring time.

3 MR. FISHER: Thank you. I appreciate your time.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Would anyone else like to
5 approach the Board?

6 MR. SCHNAPP: Yes. My name is Gary Schnapp (ph).
7 Gary Schnapp, S-C --

8 MADAM CLERK: And your address, please?

9 MR. SCHNAPP: 281 Park Avenue.

10 MADAM CLERK: 281 Park Avenue?

11 MR. SCHNAPP: Yes.

12 MADAM CLERK: Okay.

13 MR. SCHNAPP: Can I begin? I would like to
14 respectfully address my remarks today to Mayor Petracco and
15 the commissioners of the Township of Nutley regarding the
16 gravity of the truck traffic issue on Park Avenue between
17 Fayick (ph) Avenue and Washington Avenue.

18 The Citizens for a better Park Avenue, which I --
19 who I represent, are respectfully insisting that this
20 commission get the trucks off of Park Avenue, be they
21 publicly or privately operated and owned and fix the damage
22 to the road next to the Park Ridge Condominium complex.

23 And to be more precise, to truly fix this damage
24 properly so that there are no further noise problems, Park
25 Avenue should be completely repaved from one end to the

1 other.

2 The patch job that was completed by the Public
3 Works Department two years ago in front of the Park Ridge
4 Condos had completely fallen apart in the short span of
5 time. And I have photographs here, which illustrate this
6 damage. So -- I'll give them to you at the end.

7 A few years ago truck traffic next to the Park
8 Ridge Condo community was a major issue also and that's when
9 it all started. I presented a petition to the Mayor at the
10 Public Affairs Office, to Commissioner Scarpedali and to the
11 policeman in charge of traffic safety in Nutley, Nicholas
12 Lerue (ph).

13 This petition was signed by 23 Nutley taxpaying
14 citizens who by signing this petition express a demand that
15 trucks stop using Park Avenue as a thru street.

16 A short time later, the damage in front of Park
17 Ridge was poorly patched and the truck traffic stopped on
18 Park Avenue.

19 How much the town commissioner's actions were
20 responsible for the favorable turn of events and how much
21 this was a result of truck drivers not wanting to damage the
22 fresh patch on the roadway is unclear to us. But either
23 way, this has been a more than pleasant one and a half year
24 interlude of peace and quiet on Park Avenue.

25 Now, the trucks have come back. the main culprit

1 are the recycling trucks from Commissioner Scarpelli's
2 Public Works Department. These trucks are especially noisy
3 by construction and that they have a special additional
4 compartment on the rear of the trucks made from overlapping
5 metal strips that shake violently every time the truck hits
6 the road damage in front of Park Ridge Condo community, no
7 matter how fast they're going and from both directions.

8 It feels as though the drivers of these trucks are
9 purposely flaunting the right we residence have to a
10 peaceful and habitable existence. Or perhaps they're just
11 being lazy and irresponsible about how they treat their
12 fellow Nutley citizens.

13 Either way, they have returned to cause a problem
14 that they were purposely avoiding for two years. That's
15 right. For two years they found another way to get to their
16 destinations besides going down Park Avenue. So we all know
17 that such a route exists.

18 I would like to add that there are town ordinances
19 being -- noise ordinances being violated by such truck
20 generated noise through our residentially zoned street. I
21 can present these ordinances upon request by the
22 commissioners.

23 So again, I Gary Schnapp, my wife Monica, our
24 neighbor, Sherry Sulkin (ph)☺, who is also affected by this
25 noise, especially in the summer when she has to open her

1 windows for ventilation. The other three neighbors I
2 represent from the Park Ridge condo community are the
3 Hartman's, Mr. Decastro, Mr. Rodriguez and all of the 23
4 signatories to the above mentioned petition are hereby
5 demanding that truck traffic, especially from the recycling
6 department and the public works generally be removed from
7 Park Avenue until this road is completely repaved. Even if
8 that is two years or more in the future as Ms. Sulkin
9 reportedly was told by Mr. Scarpelli.

10 This could be done with traffic coordinated
11 (indiscernible - 8:00:52) Park Avenue traffic rerouting
12 proposal, which has been in the works for at least three
13 years now. But it should just get done. We are all
14 taxpaying citizens who individually pay \$9000 a year in
15 property taxes alone and who as a condo community pay
16 collectively, \$50,000 a year. And this, in spite of falling
17 home values.

18 We have elected this body of commissioners to make
19 our lives better in Nutley. We look forward to a positive
20 outcome in this matter.

21 I'm just going to present the pictures real quick
22 and then I have one more issue.

23 These pictures will show how the asphalt patch in
24 front of Park Ridge from a year and a half ago is already
25 severely cracked, dented and broken.

1 In regard to a second issue -- in regard to a
2 second issue, the Park Ridge Condo community would request
3 that the trees -- trees belonging to the neighboring
4 apartment complex, the Graylock (ph) Apartments that are
5 growing right behind us be pruned or trimmed in accordance
6 with town statutes.

7 These trees are growing so far above our homes
8 that they are a hazard to the integrity of our condominium
9 structure.

10 A recent storm on October 31st, 2011, large
11 sections of these trees fell on my backyard -- our backyard
12 and would have truly injured anyone occupying a yard,
13 perhaps, seriously.

14 The trees also cause costly damage to the fence of
15 our Park Ridge neighbor, Ms. Rodriguez. In a worst case
16 scenario, the upper most portion of these trees could have
17 come crashing down on our roofs during another bad storm or
18 hurricane possibly destroying our roofs, breaking our
19 windows and seriously injuring the occupants of our condo
20 community including our neighbor's children.

21 Our neighboring complex use a landscaping company
22 called Valley Crest. This company has a tree pruning team
23 and they have informed me that they can prune these trees
24 for as little as 1500 -- that is \$1500.

25 Again, I urge the commissioners to act as quickly

1 as possible to prune these trees to prevent possible damage
2 an injury.

3 That's it.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: We thank you for your letter
5 tonight. (Indiscernible - 8:03:51) with regard to trees,
6 those trees are tall so they date back probably to well over
7 150 years.

8 MALE SPEAKER: Right.

9 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: They predate any construction
10 or mapping even as the town itself. Generally what happens
11 with trees if it's splitting a property and if it's in the
12 rear of property, the Township doesn't go on private
13 property to prune trees. That's a private matter and that
14 each property owner takes care of their tree.

15 So if you're looking at a tree leaning over onto
16 your property even though the trunk of the tree might be on
17 a neighbor's property, that portion that's on your property,
18 you're well within your right to prune it. It's not the
19 Township's responsibility to prune a tree on private
20 property.

21 MR. SCHNAPP: (indiscernible - 8:04:43)

22 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: There isn't a height
23 restriction on the tree that we have that I'm aware of.

24 Commissioner Tucci is not here tonight. He's with
25 -- his the (indiscernible - 8:04:59) tree department will --

1 we still have some governance on that.

2 (Indiscernible - 8:05:02) is there anything that
3 you have?

4 MALE SPEAKER: My understanding is if the health
5 of the tree is an issue, in other words if it's a dying tree
6 or a dead tree, under our tree ordinance we can require that
7 it be taken down. But otherwise, it -- like you said it is
8 an issue between two private property owners. We can't --
9 we don't have the resources to go around and trim
10 everybody's trees.

11 MR. SCHNAPP: (Indiscernible - 8:05:29) falls and
12 damages our (indiscernible - 8:05:30)

13 MALE SPEAKER: It's an insurance matter. It works
14 out between insurance companies. Generally it's an act of
15 God or (indiscernible - 8:05:45) but I would think the
16 owner, the other property owner whose tree the property is
17 on, generally their insurance company would represent them
18 on that matter, but it would not be the Township.

19 MR. SCHNAPP: (indiscernible - 8:06:02) property
20 protection -- trees so -- (audio fading in and out).

21 MALE SPEAKER: Well, from a Township standpoint,
22 is there any legal position?

23 MALE SPEAKER: No, I mean, there is. I'm not
24 going to sit here and give you legal advice, but there are
25 certain legal rights that you would have and I can't cite it

1 off the top of my head with respect to private property and
2 the maintenance of trees between property owners. You know,
3 I might suggest you know, have you notified them that this
4 is an issue?

5 MS. CORELLA: (Indiscernible - 8:06:45) after that
6 storm. (Indiscernible - 8:06:54) it's not (Indiscernible -
7 8:07:12)

8 MALE SPEAKER: Yeah, for the record. I need you
9 on the record.

10 MADAM CLERK: Yeah.

11 MS~~e~~ CORELLA: Sandra Corella (ph)

12 MADAM CLERK: Thank you.

13 MS~~e~~ CORELLA: 19 Dogwood Lane.

14 MALE SPEAKER: Thank you. Commissioner -- we'll
15 address the roadway and we'll talk to our recycling truck
16 drivers but that is the main road to get to the recycling
17 area, but we'll see what we can do to alleviate some of the
18 traffic there.

19 MR. SCHNAPP: Can they go down Center (ph) Street
20 for the time being?

21 (Indiscernible - 8:07:58)

22 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANSE Anyone else like to address
23 the Board?

24 MALE SPEAKER: Motion to adjourn.

25 MALE SPEAKER: Second.

1 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

2 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

3 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

4 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

5 MADAM CLERK: Deputy Mayor Evans?

6 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

7 (Meeting adjourned at 8:08 p.m.)







BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ACQUISITION OF VEHICLES IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$55,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING \$52,200 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Nutley, New Jersey as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$55,000, including the sum of \$2,800 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$52,200 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued, is the acquisition of vehicles for the Public Affairs Department, including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all pursuant to plans and specifications on file with the Township, which plans and specifications are hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with the bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8(a). The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale, and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description,

the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained, and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Township of Nutley is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. Any grants or moneys received by the Township for any purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof are hereby appropriated for said purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof and shall be applicable either to the direct payment of the cost of such purpose or to the payment or reduction of the obligations issued or authorized herein. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Township may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 5 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and bond anticipation notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$52,200 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$5,500 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
