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MADAM CLERK: Thank you, Mayor.

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UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Second.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you. Okay. Our first order of business is ones that I have tonight. Ordinance Number 3223. Before I read it, I'll just make a few brief statements. This is an ordinance to change the table of organization of the police department to one chief, three captains, six lieutenants and 16 sergeants.

Through my due diligence, I see, by doing this, we get more police coverage and we save the taxpayers some money. There's been a little back and forth with the exact dollar amount that that saves but there's still a savings to the taxpayers and I believe in this economy, the taxpayers need to be heard and considered first and we still don't give up any police coverage, we actually get more.

The ordinance number is Number 3223 and it's a number -- an ordinance qualified in the Township of Nutley Code, Chapter 49 entitled Establishments and Organization of the Police Department.

I move that this ordinance be passed to a second meeting and advertising letter sent together with the notice required by law and that further consideration of said ordinance for final passage by a vote of commissioners to be held at its second meeting on December 18th, 2013.

I move the ordinance.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Before I vote, I like -people tell me to explain why I'm voting and what I'm
voting. I don't know. I don't know if this will save
taxpayer dollars. I haven't seen it. I'll leave that -the money and the financial end of it to the experts on this
Board.

I am an expert in law enforcement so I feel I'm qualified to make some judgments and if I'm to make a prudent decision on this ordinance, it'd be in the best interest of the people. I believe that before I can ever support an ordinance such as this -- because it will have profound impact on our township in years to come -- that I would need to look at a strategic plan that includes future patrol methodologies, manpower requirements to implement those methodologies and command requirements to ensure that the plan is adhered to.

I'd like to see a comp stat analysis of criminal activity in the Township of Nutley and not limited to the FBI UCR but including all of those client categories that are not on the uniform crime brief report and, more importantly, I think when we shape an ordinance that's going to have such impact on our community, we need to look at a predictive analysis of future crime trends for the township because without predictive analysis of crime trends, we're

not going to really know definitively what our manpower needs are going to be and what type of command structure is going to be worked within that predict -- that -- those crime trends.

I also believe -- and I've learned this from my near 40 years experience on a police department and traveling around the country and myself working on a review of the South Boundary (ph) Police Department many years ago -- that a top to bottom review of the present command structure as it relates to supervisory needs. I'd like to know -- I do have some idea -- what the supervisor to subordinate equation is. Do we need three captains? Do we need two captains? These decisions can't be made at least by me unless I have these questions answered, a top to bottom analysis of the financial requirements necessary operate an efficient and effective police department with a force and command structure capable to protect the people of the Township of Nutley.

I'm not -- like I said, I'm not an expert when it comes to finances. We have a very capable, real good expert on this Board of Commissioners that I suppose could look at this and come up with those answers and there is something very important I believe we cannot miss, any of the input from the commanders in the police department and, in particularly, the police chief. I'd like to hear from him.

I'd like to hear his recommendations. He's had over 45 years experience in the police department and what we would need from his is his professional assessment of the police department's present needs and force structure.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Commissioner, just let me interrupt you one second, although respectfully. I just want to be clear, tonight is an introduction and then if this passes, it goes into a public hearing where a presentation like that could be made. So by voting tonight for this ordinance, all's it does is it passes it for passage — for final passage where it's open for comment from the public and (indiscernible 7:39:24) as a commissioner but right now if you wanted to vote yes on this, this doesn't mean that this ordinance is passed. I just want to be clear on that.

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Sure, sure. But, Mayor, I -- look, I -- we've had discussions. I respect anyone's position on anything.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: But what I'm sharing with the public is why I'm voting no. Thank you.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers, you're voting

no?

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Voting no.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans?

 potential savings that we might anticipate, not to mention,

 you know, what that would do to morale in the department.

 - MAYOR PETRACCO: I vote yes and I will try this ordinance again. I will give everyone the information that they are seeking over and over again. I vote yes. Thank you.

So until I can do a side-by-side with the current structure

versus what the proposed structure is, my vote is no.

- MADAM CLERK: Mr. Hawkins, for the record, the ordinance, I have three no's, two yeses so the ordinance is not (indiscernible 7:43:42).
- MAYOR PETRACCO: Okay. Then move on to resolutions. Commissioner Rogers.
- COMMISSIONER ROGERS: First resolution is 293-12, National Hand Washing Awareness Week, where the township is joining a national campaign to heighten awareness of hand washing.
- Whereas, according to the Center for Disease
 Control and Prevention, hand washing is the single most

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important action that one can take to prevent the onset of
illness;

Whereas the need for all individuals as a public health imperative to routinely wash their hands every day transcends all ages and demographic categories;

Whereas the Centers for Disease Control eliminates -- I'm sorry, estimates that 48 million get sick, 128,000 hospitalized and three dozen people die each year from foodborne illnesses, if food facility workers follow the law of practicing good hand washing, disease may be preventable;

Whereas the common cold is responsible for millions of lost school days each year and work days yet the simple act of hand washing can dramatically reduce the spread of infection and the number of sick days;

MAYOR PETRACCO: Aye. Thank you. That closes our business portion of the meeting. Is there anyone that would like to address the Board this evening? Hello, fine sir. State your name and address for the record.

MR. MOSS: My name is Robert Moss. I live in Bloomfield at 17 New Street and I would like permission to address the commissioners on Assembly Bill 2586. This bill provides — this bill exempts non-public institutions of higher learning from all provisions of the municipal land use law. That means no zoning, no planning board and this bill is posed by, among others, the New Jersey League of Municipalòties. However, in visiting different municòpalities recently, it appears that the League has only approached those communities that presently are home to a college such as Bloomfield, South Orange and so on and I believe this is a mistake. This bill is very terse and contains no limitations. It's a very brief bill.

Under this bill, not this year, maybe not 2013, but any of these private or religiously-run schools can buy property anywhere they find a building center --

MAYOR PETRACCO: Let me just interrupt you. Do you have a copy of the bill?

MR. MOSS: I have it on a memory stick.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Why don't you talk to my

assistant? I'll look at the bill. I'll circle it to the commissioners and then if you'd like to come back to the next commission meeting, I reserve -- notice the players and, you know, we can go from --

MR. MOSS: And I also have it written down without some of the legal references to other bills if you'd like me to read it.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Is it long?

MR. MOSS: It's very short which is one of the problems.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Go ahead.

MR. MOSS: Unless I can't find it in which case -okay. A private institution of higher education organized
as a nonprofit corporation and then there follows a lot of
references to other laws so we can define who's covered. So
such an institution shall be exempt from the provisions of
Public Law 1979, et cetera, which is the municipal land use
law to the same extent as a state college organized under
New Jersey Statutes 18A:Q et cetera. That's the whole bill.
There is a statement with it which explains that this bill
would place the private schools under the same limitations
as the public schools and what those limitations are,
according to the bill statement are defined in the court
case in 1972, the New Jersey Supreme Court -- I've lost my
own notes -- Records versus Paluso (ph)a What that decision

did for the schools -- and the bill wants to apply it to private schools -- is the restrictions are very minimal.

They quote two examples. One was you can't park down a very high intensive use in a crowded district unless you provide parking. So that's one of the things that would be considered unreasonable. On the other hand, the court was very specific that an impact on the schools is not unreasonable, it's perfectly allowed. In fact, that's what the case is all about.

MAYOR PETRACCO: This is for higher education, correct, colleges?

MR. MOSS: Right, colleges and post -- and graduate and so on. So I -- and I am almost done. The Paluso case was about records and just Kiscatero (ph) and the court was very critical Kiscatero for using zoning to limit Mary Stevens' house and for the purpose of reducing the school population. So that is an example of an impact that would not be considered unreasonable, it would be considered okay under this law the way it's written in their statement.

MAYOR PETRACCO: How could we help you here in Nutley?

MR. MOSS: I would urge the commissioners to pass a resolution and, like I said, I don't the League has approached you. This bill and a sample resolution all

League of Municipalities. I would urge the commissioners to contact them. I can leave my contact information if it would be helpful but the League can provide you with every information and it's not that they don't want you to act, they just emphasized, like I said, towns like South Orange, Bloomfield, Caldwell and so on. They're already home to colleges.

So a resolution opposing this, I believe, would be helpful. It passed the senate, unfortunately, almost unanimously.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Yeah?

MR. MOSS: It's before the assembly now and I think it still can be stopped. I think it's a very dangerous bill.

MAYOR PETRACCO: Comments? Sure.

UNIDENTOFIED SPEAKER: Who are the sponsors?

MR. MOSS: I don't have them by heart. I think assembly representative Gibbon over in Montclare is one.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, Gibbon? Okay.

MR. MOSS: Yeah, Tom Gibbon. I just looked today. Unfortunately, I -- I'm actually new at this so I don't have any of this memorized and it's readily available on the legislative website. He's one. He's not the only one and there's a bunch of co-sponsors. In the assembly, there's

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

Ordinance No. 3223

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE CODIFIED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NUTLEY CODE, CHAPTER 49, ENTITLED ESTABLISHMENT AND ORGANIZATION OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the Township of Nutley, that Chapter 49, section 2, entitled Organization, be hereby AMENDED in its entirety to read as follows:

49-2. Organization

There shall be established within the Police Department the following table of organization:

A. Department Superior Officer complement. The complement of superior officers within the Police Department shall be determined by the Director of Public Safety up to the following:

(1) Chief of Police:

(2) Police Captains: 3

(3) Police Lieutenants: 6(4) Police Sergeants: 13

- B. Department Structure. The Department shall be divided into three divisions, a Patrol Division, Investigations Division, and a Services Division.
 - (1) The Patrol Division. The Patrol Division shall consist of three shifts; a day, evening, and night. In addition to the Division Commander, there shall be assigned four Lieutenants, nine Sergeants, and such civilian dispatchers as may be required.
 - (2) The Investigations Division. The Investigations shall consist of the Criminal Investigations Bureau, the Youth Aid Bureau, and the Professional Standards Unit. In addition to the Division Commander, there shall be assigned four Detective sergeants and such Detectives and other officers as may be required, in conformance with policy established by the Director of Public Safety.
 - Criminal Investigations Bureau. The Criminal Investigations Bureau shall consist of a day and evening shift. The hours shall be as established by the Director of Public Safety. The Criminal Investigations Bureau, shall, in addition to investigative responsibilities, develop and implement crime prevention and Neighborhood Watch programs.
 - 2. Youth Aid Bureau. The Youth Aid Bureau shall, in addition to investigative responsibilities, develop and implement programs to deter young people from unlawful conduct and substance abuse. These programs may include, but are not limited to; a Junior Police Academy, Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE), School Resource Officers (SRO), and Police Youth Organizations (PYO).
 - 3. Professional Standards Unit. The Professional Standards Unit shall ensure that Department personnel develop and maintain the knowledge, skills, and abilities required for effective performance of their duties through the implementation of a comprehensive, continuous training program. The unit shall also be responsible for the Department's Internal Affairs function.
 - (3) **The Services Division**. There shall be assigned to the Services Division, such Command, Supervisory, and other personnel as may be required. The Services Division shall consist of Personnel Administration, Records management, Crime Analysis, Police Information Technology, Facilities and Equipment, Fleet Management, and Evidence and Property Control.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this ordinance shall become effective after passage and publication pursuant to the law.
