With the solar stuff, which I believe youere speaking about, we read about it pretty much as you read about it, and the board president was here to talk about it a bit, and some of the information that you just read in the papers is a bit misleading.

Theyère looking to float, from what I understand, a seven million dollar bond ordinance. All right, it's going to be a referendum, all right? And theyère

allegedly going to get back 500
thousand -- whatever -- or some odd
dollars a year which will not initially
directly go to offset their bills,
because you're anywhere from five to
seven years to pay back the equipment.
The reason the township, which included
the board of education and all of the
buildings -- this body included them
right from the beginning.

And, the plan that we were following was because we felt it was one town, it's one tax dollar, and it was the smart and the right thing to do. Unfortunately, we're not part of that bond issue. I'm not even sure that that's a good idea at this point and time with so many people hurting and us pinching pennies on this side -- I'm not so sure that that's the smartest thing to do, although I am a very (indiscernible) opponent, as are the other commissioners here of solar energy and conservation and a coordinated comprehensive plan.

I'm not so sure that what's being

proposed is that. All right?

MR. MAGNIFICO: Well, if they produce, and we allow them to produce and the solar company that works with them, enough energy, they can sell it to the town at a reduced price. And, we can save money.

UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Well, actually they sell it back to the energy company. They get the extra credits on the S-racks and that would go to offset -- you're absolutely right. But, again, that's not going to happen for anywhere from five to seven years, until all of the hardware is in fact paid off. So, it's not like you're going to receive, you know, a half a million dollar reduction on the board of education side immediately.

What we've done on this side, okay, and I'll be sending a letter to the board of education, is we joined the sustainable energy meeting, which is a group similar to what the (indiscernible) is where a bunch of communities get

together and go out in a reverse auction, all right, to get the best price on electricity and natural gas.

We've gone out already on electricity, we saved eighty-five thousand dollars, okay, which was the projection -- it was eleven percent off our electrical bills. Gas -- we're going out again, because the number that came in wasn't as attractive as it should've been. We were involved with public services -- direct energy installment program. We're retrofitting all of our buildings. We have two buildings that have already been done.

All right, and we're going to go in to complete the remainder of the buildings to save another ten to fifteen percent off of our energy bills. So, we're going to save, without putting any money out right now, in excess of 100 thousand dollars a year, all right, off of our energy bills.

MR. MAGNIFICO: Right.

UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: All

right, and if and when the time comes, hopefully it's when, not if, that there will be money available to actually pay for the hardware to put the solar panels up and the thermal panels -- at that point and time, all right, when things are financially a lot better, I believe would be the appropriate time to move forward, all right, and do something in that area.

Not to add any additional expense on top of what we already know we're going to -- to see down the line. And again, without knowing what are A numbers going to be and, you know, at this point, it's still projections that the board will get more money, but we're not exactly sure what's going to happen and what the cost associated with just operating both the district and the township are going to be.

MR. MAGNIFICO: To (indiscernible) the thing that you said we should let the people of the town know. Because, like myself, it's a lot of them are older --

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UNIDENTIFIED COMMISSIONER: Let the people know what, Jack, what the board is doing?

MR. MAGNIFICO: Not what the board -- what we're trying to accomplish to cut back on the expenses of living in Nutley -- under the town of Nutley. In this particular case, it happens to be the --

we've attempted to do that. We speak
about it in public. We put out different
releases and we notify everyone as best
as we can, I mean, through, you know,
electronic information, through the
newspapers. I mean, I don't know what
else we can do. If you have a
suggestion, I'll be happy to entertain
it. I mean --

MR. MAGNIFICO: My suggestion, I guess is a (indiscernible) because I am going to be housebound for awhile and I just -- sitting and watching and getting all this news, and I'm sorry to bring it up to you and ask you questions, because

I'm not as sure of them. And that's what I'm asking them. You know, I've been here a long time and I want to see my grandchildren live here, et cetera, et cetera. Thank you very, very much. And thank you very much, commissioner, for coming to the V.A. -- to the Veteran's Council meeting --


