17 our meeting tonight. Would anyone from
18 the public like to address the board?

19 (Break in audio)

20 Sure.

21 MADAM CLERK: All persons addressing
22 the Board of Commissioners regarding
23 community concerns should approach the
24 microphone and provide their name and
25 address for the record. Unless further

1 time is granted by the board, each person
2 shall limit their address to five
3 minutes. All remarks to the board and
4 its individual members must be addressed
5 to the mayor. The mayor may defer
6 citizen comments to the appropriate
7 member of the board. Dialogue between
8 citizens and others addressing the board
9 shall be allowed unless the mayor or
10 presiding officer or the majority of the
11 membership of the board, shall determine
12 that the interests of the quorum and/or
13 expeditious conduct of municipal business
14 are being adversely affected by such
15 dialogue.

16 Name and address?

17 MR. SZURA: My name is Jack Szura
18 and I'm from 173 Hillside Avenue. And
19 I'm just bringing attention to the
20 board -- some of you members are aware of
21 the problems that we're having. We live
22 on the corner -- in the area of Hillside
23 and Vreeland Avenue and we're subjected
24 to meetings that are being held at the
25 Trinity Church. This started back in

1 February when I approached the president
2 of the council and I requested a meeting.
3 And we can have a discussion about the
4 attitude and how -- how the associations
5 are -- at the meeting are abusing the
6 neighborhood. We've had urination on our
7 lawns. At the meetings there -- after
8 the meetings we're picking up cigarette
9 butts, soda cans, coffee cups. Foul
10 language is being used by them at
11 neighbors when we approach them about
12 blocking our driveways. We're confronted
13 with a situation that we really shouldn't
14 be. We pay a lot of taxes and we feel
15 that this does not belong in a
16 residential neighborhood.

17 We had a meeting with Elaine Wilson
18 who -- Elaine Miller (ph.), who is the
19 president of the association, and as a
20 result of it, we had an open meeting that
21 Commissioner Al Petracco came, John
22 Holland and Steve Rogers (ph.).

23 At that meeting, they had
24 representation from the A.A. and the N.A.
25 groups. Well, first of all, the meetings

1 are -- were held Monday through Friday at
2 12 o'clock and lasted till about 2. They
3 start arriving at 11 and sometimes they
4 don't leave until 3:30. They hang
5 around -- most of these people are
6 unemployed. We don't know their
7 backgrounds, we don't know their criminal
8 records, and we just don't like them in
9 the neighborhood and what they're doing
10 to us. They have no respect for the
11 property.

12 At the meeting, Steve Rogers was
13 appointed by the Public Safety as the
14 point person for this project and he had
15 negotiations with Elaine Miller, and the
16 result of it was that they would cease
17 all the meetings, Monday through Friday
18 at 12 o'clock, and the -- the meeting on
19 Wednesday evening at 7 o'clock.

20 About the middle of July, all the
21 daytime meetings were gone and we were
22 just left with the Wednesday evening
23 meeting. And (break in audio) --
24 contacted Steve, Steve made several
25 attempts to contact Elaine Miller -- she

1 didn't return her calls. John Holland
2 finally called and she returned a call to
3 John. At that time she said that she is
4 not going to give up the Wednesday
5 evening meetings.

6 We feel that this is an infringement
7 on our zone, and I'm not sure if they
8 have permits to do this. This is a non-
9 church function. They are charging money
10 for it. They're collecting an income.
11 There is no representation by the church.
12 They're given a key. The meetings are
13 being held by ex-A.A. people and ex-N.A.
14 people. There are no professional
15 counselors that are there. By them
16 having carte blanche to -- and access to
17 the building, we have no idea what goes
18 on before -- after the meetings. If
19 they're going to have a church meeting,
20 it should be someone from the church
21 there that's supervising. When we have a
22 complaint or a problem, we have to call
23 the police department. John Holland says
24 now as a result of budget cuts, his
25 department is experiencing a lack of

1 manpower. If there's an emergency in
2 town, it sometimes takes two or three
3 patrol cars. We have five cars usually
4 going out on one given time patrolling
5 the town. So, he tries to be as
6 cooperative as possible. He issues
7 summons when -- when they're blocking
8 intersections and you have the -- loses
9 your ability to cross Hillside Avenue
10 from Vreeland.

11 And we are appealing to you as a
12 neighborhood and what can you do to help
13 us? I notice that there's something on
14 the agenda today where a permit was
15 granted to Grace Church for some kind of
16 a social activity. A permit should be
17 given to -- or applied for by these
18 people. I had a meeting with Pat
19 Intindola and at the direction of -- of
20 Commissioner Evans, he sent out a letter.
21 And I'm unaware of what the response was,
22 and all I know is that we have -- we have
23 a serious problem and we would like to
24 correct it. And it's come to a point
25 that we're relying on the commissioners

1 and to see if you can help us out.

2 COMMISSIONER EVANS: So thank you.
3 That was very clear and very helpful.
4 The letter you referred to was sent out
5 by Pat on August 10th. It was addressed
6 to Pastor Enstrom, who is the new pastor
7 -- been here for three weeks -- very new
8 to the property. He had a -- already
9 he's had a conversation where
10 we -- we don't -- you do need to file an
11 application for a permit to have those
12 activities with the code enforcement
13 department. We have not had one on file,
14 so he advised the new pastor that she has
15 to come in to file that -- that
16 application that's required as part of
17 our zoning. That has not taken place
18 yet, but that is going to happen. She
19 also was made aware at the time of just
20 the things you raised about the litter,
21 the language, the loitering, and the fact
22 that there doesn't seem to be any
23 responsible representation on the present
24 at the time that the meetings were being
25 held.

1 From my understanding, she's already
2 agreed that if they do continue that
3 meeting, that the organization, the
4 A.A./N.A. will have to have
5 representation on property. We also
6 advised them of the fact that because
7 this is the way this church is
8 constructed without any reasonable
9 parking for the neighborhood, that it --
10 that their behavior is inconsistent with
11 what we want to have in our neighbors --
12 in our neighborhoods.

13 So that -- just, that gives you an
14 update on the progress that has been made
15 so far since we became -- became aware of
16 it. It's not finished. But I want you
17 to know that that action is being taken.

18 MR. SZURA: Well, I -- I appreciate
19 that and as neighbors we appreciate it.
20 But you mentioned application -- is
21 that -- does that mean zoning
22 application?

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yes.

24 MR. SZURA: And if it becomes a
25 zoning issue, do the neighbors then have

1 an opportunity to voice their objection
2 to it?

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: If it's -- if
4 it's not allowable under our current
5 zoning -- all right, so churches are
6 allowed to have meetings in their church
7 basement, in their premises. So if it
8 falls outside of that, then it -- then
9 they would need to go for a zoning --
10 board of adjustment application to, in
11 effect, get a variance to do that. We
12 haven't gotten that far yet. We just
13 have to have them come in and sit down.

14 MR. SZURA: The meetings that are
15 allowable -- that is for church business
16 or is that for outside organizations?

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Many churches
18 have it for outside organizations; they
19 allow their premises for the use. We
20 make them come in and sit down and fill
21 in an application so we know what it is;
22 also to make sure that they don't
23 overload their space and make sure it's
24 within their criteria. So, I can't give
25 you more than until we sit down and

1 understand what they're going to do. But
2 they've been advised already of the
3 complaints that you have raised, and we
4 have asked them to reconsider the
5 direction of where they're going.

6 MR. SZURA: I appreciate that.

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Okay.

8 MR. SZURA: Who (inaudible).

9 Thank you.

10 DR. MITRANO: My name is Dr. Melanie
11 Mitrano and I live at 160 Hillside
12 Avenue. We're been working together as a
13 neighborhood on this, and it was our hope
14 that we could have a say in whether or
15 not the church does get a permit for this
16 and we were hoping that they would --
17 they would be required to go for a
18 variance because at least they've having
19 to ask permission or ask, you know, the
20 neighbors to come forward.

21 I think it would be a big mistake to
22 just grant them permission out of hand
23 without having the input of the people in
24 the neighborhood. These Narcotics
25 Anonymous and Alcoholics Anonymous

1 meetings have been going on six times a
2 week for years and I've lived there for
3 fourteen years and it's just become an
4 unbearable situation. There's no parking
5 lot for this church. There's limited
6 street parking. There are enormous
7 number of attendees, now more so than
8 ever with the economy, many people out of
9 work, and it's putting an overwhelming
10 burden of congestion on -- on us. I've
11 had my driveway blocked so many times
12 I've had to call the police. I've
13 actually missed work because I couldn't
14 get my car out of my own driveway, and
15 it's not an easy thing to call and get a
16 car removed. It takes time and in the
17 time that it would take to do that, I
18 missed work. And I lost money because of
19 that.

20 These are also very unsavory people
21 that are coming into our neighborhood. I
22 am a mother; I have a young child. These
23 are addicts. Some of them maybe are
24 trying to better their lives, but the
25 great majority of these people are

1 convicted criminals that are there
2 fulfilling parole requirements. And
3 these are transient people. These are
4 not the same people coming day after day,
5 week after week. And therefore, they
6 don't have respect. We -- we've
7 talked -- the church has talked to them
8 very times about having respect, about
9 behaving properly. It doesn't have any
10 effect because who's here today is gone
11 tomorrow, and then somebody else comes
12 in. And it's a new crowd of people.

13 Many of these people that are there
14 to fulfill their parole requirements --
15 they don't even attend the meeting. They
16 go, they check in, and then they sit
17 outside and they smoke and they hang out
18 in front of our homes, and literally it's
19 during the meeting. It's -- it's just
20 adding insult to injury.

21 Many of these people, too, as
22 parents in the neighborhood of young
23 children -- we want to know if these are
24 sex offenders. We've asked the church
25 for the statistics and that should be

1 public information. They have to this
2 day never provided it. I don't allow my
3 child to go outside when these people are
4 here. And for a onehour meeting, where
5 they come an hour early and they leave
6 two hours late, we're living like
7 prisoners in our own home. I can't let
8 my child walk down to ShopRite for me to
9 get me some milk. I can't have him ride
10 his bike with his friends because I don't
11 know who these people are, and I'm
12 afraid, I'll be honest with you.

13 The people that attend these
14 meetings -- they're not Nutley residents.
15 The pastor, the church board members --
16 they're not Nutley residents. We've met
17 with them; we know where they live. They
18 live in Cedar Grove, they live in
19 Bloomfield, they don't live here. The
20 people running the meetings -- they're
21 not Nutley residents. We sat with them;
22 we asked them. They're not professional
23 counselors, they're not social workers,
24 they have no professional credentials.
25 They're simply addicts themselves.

1 These meetings are unsupervised by
2 the church officials. No one from the
3 church is ever present to assume
4 responsibility. I've had problems when
5 these meetings have gone on. I've called
6 the church. I've walked over to the
7 church -- there's no one there. It's
8 just carte blanche; it's just a free-for-
9 all. The church is obviously getting an
10 income, but it's at our expense.

11 Basically, we have this problem with
12 loitering, as Jack said. It's never just
13 for that one hour, and in the summer
14 weather, in the nice weather, it's --
15 it's even worse.

16 We've appealed to the chief of
17 police. Not to repeat what he said, but
18 he has very limited resources. There's
19 only so much he can do. Not only that,
20 but I think I speak for all the neighbors
21 when I say that we're exhausted by having
22 to constantly maintain this kind of
23 vigilance and call the police all the
24 time. We don't want to have to do that.
25 We just want to be secure, that our

1 neighborhood is safe and we just have a
2 normal -- a normal quality of life free
3 from this kind of nuisance. We pay this
4 lot of taxes; I don't want to constantly
5 be on the phone to the police.

6 Right now, the people from the
7 church have refused to speak any further
8 with us. They do not return our phone
9 calls. We've approached them with
10 graciousness and respect at all times,
11 and they have just closed the door in our
12 face. They feel they have the right to
13 do as they please. We disagree. We
14 think that we have homeowners' rights.
15 We're in a residential community and we
16 want our commissioners to help us. We
17 have an election year coming up and it
18 matters and it's going to be noticed
19 because the people that are going to
20 these meetings are not going to be the
21 voters of Nutley because they're not the
22 residents of Nutley. We're the residents
23 of Nutley and we need your help and we
24 really ask for it. Thank you.

25 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Thank you --

1 whether you're facing an election year or
2 not, we heard you. Second is, that, it's
3 very important and also to understand is
4 that as a municipality, we have actually
5 done a lot to deal with the financial
6 challenges that we face. But all of the
7 commissioners, those that are present and
8 not -- we have not made any decisions
9 that would reduce the police presence
10 that has been available to Nutley for the
11 last thirty plus years. So while there
12 are five cars on the street -- there's
13 always been five cars on the street, and
14 that has and will not change.

15 So, I understand the point that we
16 have to be careful, but also we haven't
17 made any decisions that would risk the
18 safety of the Township but at the field
19 level. This -- other decisions but they
20 were not made in that -- that particular
21 area. I just want to make sure you're
22 clear on that.

23 Thank you. Yes?

24 MR. MITRANO: My name is Ralph
25 Mitrano. Most of you guys know me. I've

1 been in business in Nutley a long time --
2 I own a realty and development company, a
3 construction company, I have (ph.)the
4 Wishing Well Florist.

5 If this was a normal businessperson
6 in the town, the building department
7 would be coming on -- down on them like a
8 ton. One of my tenants had to go for a
9 variance because she had a dance studio.
10 Schools have to go for a variance in any
11 zone. This is technically a school.
12 That's what we were told at the A.A.
13 meeting -- they're learning something so
14 they need to go for a variance.

15 I think there's a solution to the
16 whole thing. At that meeting, they said
17 they had nowhere to go. But we have a
18 white elephant on Bloomfield Avenue, the
19 old Assembly of God Church. I don't see
20 why the town can't -- if they're
21 interested, offer a helping hand. Let
22 them have their meetings there. There's
23 an off-street parking lot; there can be
24 supervision, and it would be end the
25 solution.

1 I mean -- they said they've drawn a
2 line in the sand. This is all over
3 money. You have a church, that most of
4 them are non-residents of the town that
5 need money. They told us at the meeting
6 that the church is in dire need of money,
7 and that's why they're doing this. Well,
8 you know, the neighborhood is paying
9 large taxes. Let's eliminate it, offer
10 them a night at week over at the white
11 elephant. At least it gets to be used
12 instead of being a mothball. I talked to
13 the commissioner about it, I talked to Al
14 about it, I think they're both in
15 agreement that, you know, this is an
16 offer, so they can't say that we're --
17 we're not just throwing them out into the
18 street.

19 My grandson is two doors away from
20 this, and what I've seen going on there
21 for the last years -- I don't want it to
22 continue. So, if you guys could help
23 out, I really would appreciate it, but I
24 don't want to see you drag your feet.
25 Because this has been going on -- we were

1 promised by the chief that this was taken
2 care of and it never was. This is not
3 something we want swept under the rug, so
4 we want this taken care of. And again,
5 it is an election year coming up and
6 people don't forget. Thank you.

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Thank you.

8 Just -- the code enforcement office
9 became aware of it on August 9th and on
10 the morning of August 10th the letter was
11 sent to the pastor advising him of the
12 need to come in and speak. All --
13 whether we go for an application or not,
14 it turns out to be a variance that starts
15 with the communication to come in to the
16 department. So, we became aware of it,
17 we're taking that action, so stay tuned,
18 because we're just at that early stage.
19 And I appreciate your comment on us
20 (indiscernible) location --

21 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Deputy Mayor,
22 if I might?

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Absolutely.

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I hear what
25 you're saying, and as one of your

1 neighbors, I live around the corner from
2 where all of this is going on, and I've
3 witnessed the parking problem that's
4 there. We have a close -- they park
5 close to the curbe I've witnessed
6 firsthand the litter problem, the public
7 urination, the neighborhood intimidation
8 that I witnessed firsthand just driving
9 up Vreeland Avenue. All right? The
10 congestion that they create in the
11 neighborhood, and they were -- I believe
12 they were offered the ability to park in
13 the municipal lot which they have not
14 taken advantage of.

15 What's happening here is -- you have
16 what's basically a commercial enterprise
17 with that rate and volume of people in a
18 residential neighborhood. It's unfair.
19 It's an imposition. It's an imposition
20 to all these folks here; it's an
21 imposition to us on Colonial Terrace and
22 everyone else. Ralph, I have to take a
23 little exception to your comment about
24 the white elephant on Bloomfield because
25 we do use the annex building for many,

1 many things, and what I'm not looking to
2 do --

3 It's a great -- a great suggestion.
4 I'm not sure about the location though.
5 I'm not looking to transfer the problem
6 from our neighborhood to the neighborhood
7 off of Bloomfield Avenue, but we have --

8 MALE SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Right. We have
10 other areas that available to them that I
11 have no problem offering to them because
12 what's happening there is a disgrace.
13 And everyone's right. We all pay a lot
14 of taxes and we don't do it always
15 willingly, but we do it because there's a
16 certain quality of life here that we
17 expect. What the church is doing, it's
18 impeding and imposing upon our quality of
19 life. That's unfair. If there's a
20 permitting process that they have to go
21 through, well, then I want to go on
22 record now, and I'll be happy to do it if
23 and when there's a meeting or any type of
24 public gathering, to go on record being
25 against it. I think it's wrong in this

1 neighborhood and I think it's wrong in
2 every other neighborhood in this town.

3 I think they should have been better
4 neighbors and if they're having money
5 issues -- we all have money issues. We
6 deal with it every day. We deal with it
7 as a government, we deal with it as a
8 business, you deal with it as residents.
9 All right? They need to work out their
10 money issues, but at the same time we
11 can't allow ourselves to stand by and to
12 let them do just what they want. What
13 they're doing is totally, totally wrong,
14 and it needs to be moved. We're all for
15 rehabilitation. We're all for helping
16 people with problems that want to help --
17 that help themselves. There's some
18 excellent points made tonight about
19 convicts fulfilling parole of
20 requirements here and if there are any
21 sex offenders going there. I mean, we're
22 notified when sex offenders move into a
23 neighborhood and within so many feet of a
24 school, but that's something that we
25 should know. All right? And again, I

1 can't emphasize enough, and I have -- I
2 have relatives right on the street, three
3 houses down, I live five or six houses
4 down, I know all of these folks here. My
5 granddaughter walked up Vreeland Avenue
6 from Maple. All right? And it's wrong,
7 because what's happening there is -- it's
8 an intimidation factor from people that
9 are not Nutley people. And they need
10 help -- Nutley's a very caring and
11 compassionate place. We want to help,
12 but this is the wrong location and it
13 shouldn't be done in our residential
14 neighborhoods.

15 (Break in audio).

16 MALE SPEAKER 1: If this is a
17 violation and they do not have a permit,
18 are they allowed to continue with the
19 meetings without having a permit while
20 the process goes on in applying for one
21 in zoning?

22 MALE SPEAKER 2: Shouldn't be.

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: No.

24 MALE SPEAKER: Okay. Thank you.

25 MR. BUREAU: Jim Bureau (ph. @, 250

1 Hillside Avenue -- just another quick
2 question. I'm a little confused about
3 maybe where it stands right now and maybe
4 what we need to do just to be diligent or
5 vigilant or both. They're in the process
6 of a permit or they're being -- they've
7 been given a letter to say they need to
8 go through a permit process, and yet it
9 sounds like there might not be any
10 recourse that the community has if it's a
11 permit process versus if it's a variance
12 process. So, maybe just give us some
13 clarity as to how we stay in the loop at
14 the point of decision -- permit,
15 variance, whatever gets done there.

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yep. To -- to
17 just a point, is that part of the
18 confusion for you is that I haven't
19 stated what the zoning code actually
20 allows and doesn't allow, and that's
21 because I don't -- I don't know it off
22 the top of my head and I don't have a
23 book here. So -- so, one, Pat Intindola
24 and Dave Barien (ph.ø) are all over it,
25 and so the first process was the letter.

1 They do have to make application to let
2 us know exactly what they're -- they're
3 doing. We are well -- we were already
4 aware of what you raised as -- as
5 complaints, and advised the church about
6 it and spoke to this new pastor directly.
7 So I'm a little confused about who's been
8 involved historically plus now -- now
9 who's going to take the lead so we'll
10 clear that up with the pastor, who is
11 going to make the decision. So that's
12 the first step.

13 So once I get an -- they get an
14 application, we can say okay, does this
15 comply or doesn't it with our zoning. If
16 it complies with our zoning and it's
17 allowable by a church because it -- the
18 zoning is governed by what the town
19 master plan is, then they could -- then
20 there's no reason not to give them a
21 permit to do that, all right, because it
22 complies with what the town says that it
23 would -- it's comfortable doing. What's
24 happening -- what we're hearing tonight
25 is they're abusing it, right, they're

1 above and beyond what you would think
2 would be normal for a church

3 The things that I heard tonight are
4 that are -- that are irresponsible is to
5 have the meeting with no one in a
6 position of authority to control it. If
7 these people are supposed to be in the
8 meeting, then they shouldn't be outside
9 the meeting. When the meeting's over,
10 the person in the authority should make
11 them leave -- all right. We know about
12 the parking complaint and there shouldn't
13 be an instance of someone blocking a
14 driveway or, you know -- that should
15 never happen. So, we're aware of those
16 things and we just became aware of that,
17 and all of that is being brought to the
18 church and I agree with Commissioner
19 Tucci -- Tucci -- there's nothing in our
20 code that says for the betterment of the
21 church, we will allow the neighbors to be
22 abused. That doesn't exist, so -- so as
23 we go through that, if it's clear that
24 this doesn't belong there, it won't
25 belong -- it won't be there. All right.

1 It just has to -- well, from a zoning
2 standpoint it's just that first
3 conversation and they haven't submitted
4 anything yet so I haven't seen what
5 they're saying they want to do, all
6 right.

7 So it's just that -- so I share with
8 you where we are and we'll stay on and I
9 assure you that to the code department,
10 we will stay on it. I also assure you
11 that I will follow up with Commissioner
12 Petracco because instances of loitering,
13 doing the behavior, the profanity and
14 disrespectful behavior to the residents,
15 that's enforcement and there's no reason
16 why that shouldn't be enforced.

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Mr. Scarpelli?

18 DR. MITRANO: Will there be a
19 meeting tomorrow night or not?

20 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I -- I just
21 became aware of that -- that fact. I
22 have to call Pat and Dave, which I will
23 do as soon as this meeting concludes.
24 And so, I don't -- my sense is that
25 without a permit for it to be there, then

1 it should stop. And that's what I'll be
2 asking Pat to do. It's been going on for
3 some time --

4 DR. MITRANO: I'm there for fourteen
5 years. He's there for a lot longer,
6 so --

7 COMMISSIONER EVANS: So, I'm not
8 sure, you know, if it's -- if there was
9 actually something filed way back when
10 and it just evolved around it.

11 DR. MITRANO: I think that what's
12 happened is that, you know, when I first
13 bought my house fourteen years ago, it
14 wasn't this kind of frequency and it
15 wasn't this kind of volume of attendance.

16 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah.

17 DR. MITRANO: And it's just
18 ballooned, and -- and this past year with
19 the bad winter we had, where we couldn't
20 even park our own cars on the street, it
21 was unbearable.

22 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah.

23 DR. MITRANO: And, you know, not
24 only is there profanity, but some of my
25 neighbors here have teenage daughters and

1 I -- and I will speak for myself -- I
2 have literally come out of my door,
3 walked to my car, and gotten in my car,
4 and been verbally abused with sexual
5 comments from these men because I'm --
6 I'm wearing a skirt and heels and I'm
7 going to work. I don't want to hear
8 that. I'm pretty sure this man doesn't
9 want his daughters to hear that. It's
10 beyond even more than we've even told you
11 tonight.

12 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Thank you.

13 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Mayor?

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Commissioner
15 Scarpellè?

16 MR. MITRANO: I hate to play --

17 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here, we --

18 MR. MITRANO: -- to play Russian
19 roulette, but I have one last question.
20 You just got this department and I've
21 been in the town long enough to know how
22 variances work, how if there's a breach
23 of code enforcement, how you could put it
24 off for ages and ages and ages. This is
25 normal. I mean, you're laughing because

1 you know, too. You're in business.
2 Could we get a time frame? I mean,
3 they're in breach of so many building
4 things here. Okay. Your building
5 department -- I've talked to Pat about
6 this, okay. Number one, it's a school.
7 You need a variance for a school. Number
8 two, it's not zoned. It's in
9 residential. They're not arguing the
10 church, the funerals, the worship, or
11 whatever. They've put this up with
12 this -- it's beautiful. They don't care
13 about that. This is one particular
14 thing.

15 Is there a way to get some sort of a
16 timeframe from your department? I'm
17 waiting from Commissioner Scarpelli's
18 department for over a year on another
19 issue that's in your department now, and
20 it's being put off. That's why I'm
21 curious. Could we get a time frame on
22 this particular matter?

23 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Which issue is

24 --

25 MR. MITRANO: Forget about the other

1 issue. I'm concerned with this issue
2 right now.

3 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Well, this one,
4 I'm -- when this meeting is over, I will
5 be speaking to David Barien and Pat
6 Intindola. I'll make them aware of these
7 facts because you've added more facts to
8 then what we knew before this meeting
9 occurred.

10 MR. MITRANO: Well, he's -- he's
11 aware of what's going on. You had a
12 meeting with Jack Szura, and, you know,
13 he's -- he's fully aware of it.

14 COMMISSIONER EVANS: Yeah. So --

15 MR. MITRANO: How -- how soon can we
16 expect --

17 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I need to -- in
18 all honesty, I need to talk to Pat about
19 what -- can I shut them down right now,
20 pending the application process.
21 Submitting the application and doing the
22 zoning review will not take -- take long.
23 That could be done, you know, in a day,
24 my view. And then it would be up to them
25 if they chose to go to a variance. It's

1 a church, so I got to consider what's
2 the, you know, what we're allowed to do
3 with the church. And I'm only being a
4 little bit vague because I don't know --
5 I haven't read that particular aspect of
6 the code. I will, but I can't give you
7 that. But I will assure you that before
8 the week is out, you'll hear from us.

9 MR. MITRANO: Okay. That's good
10 enough

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Mister, perhaps
12 pending that application by the church,
13 which I don't believe this is part of the
14 church function, all right --

15 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I have a
16 question --

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- maybe and I
18 know you have to research it --

19 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I have to
20 research it.

21 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- and I know
22 you hear what they're saying. Maybe we
23 could have zoning consider issuing a
24 cease and desist order until we get a --
25 a full explanation as to exactly what's

1 going on.

2 COMMISSIONER EVANS: We should
3 have -- that's exactly my (indiscernible)
4 call tonight.

5 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Excelente

6 COMMISSIONER EVANS: I don't know
7 the answer to that and I don't want to
8 speculate on it, simply because, you
9 know, I think it would be wrong to do so.
10 But, we will have that conversation.

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Greate Thank
12 you.
