THE CLERK: Board of Commissioners Public Meeting, Tuesday, December 6th, 2016. The time is 7:34.

Pursuant to the requirements of the Open Public Meeting Act (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), notice of this meeting was published in the December 24, 2015 issues of The Nutley Sun, The Star Ledger and The Herald News. A copy of this notice has been posted on the Nutley Town Hall bulletin board and a copy is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Commissioner Rogers.

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Here.

THE CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

THE CLERK: Commissioner Evans is absent/excused.

Commissioner Petracco.

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

THE CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Here.

THE CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for Commissioner Evans who is absent/excused this evening.

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay. Let's go around the horn.

Commissioner Petracco.

1 MR. PETRACCO: I was afraid you were going to say
2 that. I have -- I have a drive sober or get pulled over
3 crackdown for December 9th through January 1st and a transfer
4 in my budget, but that's all I have, I think.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Rogers.

6 MR. ROGERS: Mayor, I have nothing, but because of
7 that look that you gave me I will take Commissioner Evans'
8 resolutions. One is to authorize the issuance of not
9 exceeding \$9,188,000 bond anticipation notes, a refund
10 senior citizen property tax deductions for 2016, rescind of
11 Resolution Number 289-16, refund overpayment of property
12 taxes, authorize general capital improvement fund
13 appropriations, corrective action plan for annual audit
14 process, and authorize budget transfer in the amount of
15 \$30,000.

16 And that's it, Mayor. Thank you.

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner.

18 Commissioner Tucci.

19 MR. TUCCI: Yeah. I was just inquiring as to
20 whether or not I was eligible for the senior citizen
21 property tax deduction, but --

22 THE CLERK: Are you 65 or older?

23 COMMISSIONER ROGERS I'm 65.

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: He's 65.

25 THE CLERK: You are?

1 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: December 19 --

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: No, I'm not, but my friend is so put
3 him in.

4 (Laughter)

5 THE CLERK: Come in tomorrow. We'll take care of
6 you.

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Can I apply? Wow. Look at
8 that. There are benefits of getting --

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I'm on a fixed income. I've
10 got to -- I have a pension.

11 (Laughter)

12 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: It's great being a
13 commissioner, ain't it?

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: It sure is.

15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: All right. I have a budget transfer
16 in the amount of 74,200. I have a contract renewal with The
17 Soccer Factory not to exceed 45,000. I have a contract
18 renewal with Dujets Tree Experts not to exceed 40,000. I'm
19 awarding the risk manager contract once again to C. Walter
20 Searle Agency not to exceed 34,500. I want to also enter
21 into a contract with C. Walter Searle to continue doing our
22 accident and safety review work as part of the insurance work
23 for an amount not to exceed 10,000. I need an authorization
24 to advertise sealed bids for air conditioning, plumbing,
25 heating, and refrigeration. I need an

1 authorization to receive bids for recreation uniforms and
2 equipment. And I need an authorization to advertise bids
3 for electrical services. And that's all I have.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner.

5 I have a public hearing on an amendment to the
6 recycling ordinance which is just to standardize language
7 for the county so it complies with the county's recycling
8 ordinance. And I have a termination of a club license
9 liquor license, Nutley Masonic Temple, approve a raffle
10 license application --

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: There -- excuse me. There
12 -- what are they doing with that license?

13 THE CLERK: Just terminating --

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Just terminating it.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: The Masonic Temple?

16 THE CLERK: It took me a year to help them get it
17 and now they don't -- they don't want it.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Wow.

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Why, did they run out of
20 masons?

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I remember that year.

22 THE CLERK: Yeah.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right.

24 THE CLERK: Yeah.

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: It was very difficult. And

1 is there a reason why they don't want it now? Is it the
2 liability or --

3 THE CLERK: No. They just don't want to --

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And they're not transferring it
5 on --

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: But that's a club license,
7 right? That's not transferrable?

8 THE CLERK: It's a club license. That's right.
9 It's not. You have to have a club.

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Okay.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay. Approve various raffle
12 licenses, authorize budget transfers in the amount of
13 \$50,000, authorize to submit the CDBG applications for
14 funding for 2017, authorize to re-appoint Constable Chris
15 Mazzini and authorize to award a contract to Stanziale
16 Construction in the amount of \$155,774.80 for CDBG which is
17 the paving of Hancox Avenue from Union to Passaic. That's
18 all I have.

19 Madame Clerk, do you have anything?

20 THE CLERK: We just have the board of education
21 members coming later on to speak with us and the -- that's
22 it actually. Pretty easy.

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay.

24 ALAN GENITEMPO: I have two matters --

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: There was only one

matter

1 that I had for an executive session, but it was that
2 Commissioner Evans isn't here tonight.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: No.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What I need to get on the
5 record is the negotiations with the PBA. So I had
6 Commissioner Evans go over some of the numbers and so forth
7 and so on. So I know the PBA is anxious.

8 ALAN GENITEMPO: We should talk about this in the
9 executive session.

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, I'm just -- I just
11 want to get -- let me just finish. I understand. What I'm
12 saying is that as far as they're anxious to -- for us to
13 move on something so maybe at the next meeting we could --we
14 could bring it up for discussion. That's all. Not the
15 details.

16 ALAN GENITEMPO: Okay.

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I have -- I have one issue,
18 too.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I just didn't want them to
20 think that we're not moving on it. It's been -- I've been
21 absent. Now Tom's been absent, so that's what's been holding
22 it up.

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I saw on here and I believe
24 it's still here, Commissioner Evans is looking to cancel some
25 balances.

1 THE CLERK: Did you get my e-mail.

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: No. But if I did -- if you
3 sent it maybe I just didn't read it.

4 THE CLERK: (Indiscernible).

5 (Laughter)

6 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I'm being honest.

7 THE CLERK: No. Frank said that he was going to give it
8 to you.

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. But that's the same
10 --

11 THE CLERK: (Indiscernible) an explanation.

12 That's the explanation that Ro gave me.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: What?

14 THE CLERK: Did you see that explanation that --

15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That explanation flies in the
16 face of everything she's been telling me for 17 years,
17 especially where you have various capital improvement. She
18 says, no, you need to be specific. Well, various capital
19 improvements is not specific and I don't know what these are
20 because we haven't had a printout because they were working
21 with the auditors and I understand that. All right. But --

22 THE CLERK: (Indiscernible) -- okay.

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- I would like -- if we could
24 defer this, Mayor, until I can get a better explanation. And
25 it's not --

26 ALAN GENITEMPO: Can I see that --

1 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Well, I know. It's not your
2 explanation, but --

3 THE CLERK: Yeah.

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- being that I went over the agenda I
5 saw that and I don't know what they're canceling because I
6 might have plans for some of those things that they're
7 canceling.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The only thing, in the e-mail
9 it said these were Section 20 expenses and not for
10 projects.

11 THE CLERK: Yeah.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: But I'm only going with what was in the
13 e-mail. I'm not going to vouch for that.

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Well, because I --
15 (Laughter)

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- I went through it, all
17 right, and that -- I hope that is the case, you know.

18 THE CLERK: But that's what she's -- that's what
19 she told me. That was her -- that's her wording, not mine.

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That they were all Section 20
21 -- I don't know about that.

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, maybe we should defer
23 it --

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Why don't we defer it at
25 least until Tom is here and we can talk about it and I can

1 get a better handle on what it is.

2 THE CLERK: Maybe you should call him on that.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah, I will. I will.

4 THE CLERK: That's the only explanation I can
5 give.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So --

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. No. No. I
8 understand.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So we'll -- we'll pull that
10 resolution until the next meeting.

11 THE CLERK: Okay.

12 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Okay. Thank you.

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And I -- while we're just
14 on the subject and I -- if I'm -- if I'm not -- if I'm not
15 talking out of turn, stop me. But it's -- I just want --
16 had a question because a business owner called me up and I
17 know you helped the specific one. I don't understand what
18 Passaic Valley -- maybe you would know this, too -- what --

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: You have the wrong
20 brother, but go ahead.

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, maybe you know
22 nothing about. When there's a change of use, right, why is
23 that they go by the chairs in a restaurant what the fee is
24 going to be for these restaurants? Is it --is it --

25

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: And I don't have an explanation
2 for that except that I guess there's some sort of
3 calculation on how much is going to be pumped into the
4 sewer system.

5 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Water in, water out.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So --

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Do you know what year they
8 came up with this?

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Oh, I think they've been
10 doing this.

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: It's a while, Al. It's a
12 while.

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Really?

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So it's not like ten,
16 twelve years? I mean, would you think it's longer than
17 that?

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: No. I think it's longer
19 than that.

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I think it's longer than
21 that. They might have -- they might have modified it ten,
22 twelve --

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Or increased it.

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. Probably increased
25 the fees.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Do you -- and the question
2 that I have, and it's just that I read just -- I got a copy
3 of the ordinance today I -- is it -- is there like an issue
4 with the sewage, Joe, that there's a volume of sewage that is
5 increasing and that's why they're starting to put these
6 stipulations on it?

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I think they've always -- I think
8 they've always done it and I think it's just a --well, what
9 -- listen, it's a way of raising money, right? I mean, so
10 they're looking to how they can capture some money. And the
11 fact that there's going to be an increase in what they're
12 handling down at the end run, that's what they've --
13 especially commercial accounts.

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I mean, because what's
15 gotten back to me like for these little pizzeria restaurants
16 --

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Oh, that's -- it's
18 expensive.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- it's very --

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It's expensive.

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- it's very, very
22 substantial and I know we all want to encourage business
23 here --

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: And there's nothing --
25 there's nothing we can do about it.

1 COMMISSIONER And I know it has nothing

2 PETRACCO : to do with you or --

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- your department either.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right. We inquired on one
6 business that came to us a couple of years ago. We
7 inquired, you know, is there anything we can do, anything --
8 no. There's nothing to do.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And what happens --

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It's statutory or --

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and what happens with
12 the --

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- whatever they want to
14 call it.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- with the residential
16 part of it? So if you build a new house and I'm -- I was
17 told that those fees are much lower than commercial.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah. We -- you have a --
19 some -- some fees, especially if you're running a new
20 service, are coming to the township, right? You know, a
21 sewer hookup, they're hooking up into the sewer. But I
22 don't know if there's probably some permitting fees that go
23 to the Passaic Valley Sewage also.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: These apartment buildings
25 that are being built, they're substantial as well?

1 ALAN GENITEMPO: They have to --

2 ALAN GENITEMPO: I think it's part of the
3 DEP processing (indiscernible) --

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: You know, there's an --
5 there's extension -- there's --

6 ALAN GENITEMPO: -- figure out how much
7 water per unit --

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- (indiscernible).

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: There's water and sewer
11 permits that for any new development that have to be -- that
12 you're not going to increase it. If you're increasing you
13 have to pay a fee. You know, it's based on a calculation.

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. It's a formula. It's a
15 calculation that they do.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I don't know.

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I just know that it's discouraging
18 some people from, you know, extending their business or, you
19 know, even going into business. And it -- it's not just
20 unique to Nutley.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah. It's not --

22 (Everyone speaking all at once)

23 ALAN GENITEMPO: They're going to pay the same
24 percentage.

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. I know. I see two

1 things on here, construct multi-purpose facility, construct
2 --

3 THE CLERK: And you know what?

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- ball field.

5 THE CLERK: If you show me which ones tomorrow
6 I'll get more specifics for those.

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Okay.

8 THE CLERK: Okay.

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Thank you.

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. It's -- I remember
11 when I opened my business Passaic Valley came in. I guess
12 they thought they were going to hit a bonanza with a pool
13 store, water in, water out. And then I tell them that we
14 just fill them up and leave them there.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right.

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: We just add. We don't
17 drain them.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, it's getting to be a
19 very expensive --

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. It's expensive.

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- proposition for these
22 business owners all over town. Like I said it's not unique
23 to Nutley, but it's -- I got to tell you, I mean, it's --

24 SAL SCARPELLI: Especially if you're
25 opening up a new business that was not using any water.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, that's what it is
2 a shame, change of use specifically. But, again, it's --
3 I don't know if you could look -- I mean, I guess there's
4 nothing --

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, the last time we
6 looked into it two years ago they basically told us that's
7 -- that's the fee, nothing you can do about it.

8 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Is Passaic Valley self-
9 funded through --

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They are through the
11 (indiscernible).

12 ALAN GENITEMPO: It's an independent
13 government agency.

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah.

15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Uh-huh.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Member of municipalities.
17 Yeah.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Just so you know so is the
19 ABC I found out that myself, that they're generating -- they
20 are funded by the fines that they generate to -- which I
21 think is very interesting. Is that politically correct?

22 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That was good. Yeah. That
23 was good. You've come a long way.

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Counsel, what do you have?

25 ALAN GENITEMPO: (Indiscernible) executive

1 session for litigation and contract.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Okay.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: There you go.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We have a motion to go into
5 the executive for litigation and contract.

6 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Since you're looking at me I
7 move the motion.

8 COMMISSIOENR TUCCI: Second.

9 THE CLERK: Whereas Section 8 of the Open Public
10 Meeting Act (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), (indiscernible) --

11 (Everyone talking)

12 -- Board of Commissioners of the Township of
13 Nutley, in the County of Essex, State of New Jersey desires

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

7 THE CLERK: The time is 7:47. PAUSE

19 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Here.

20 THE CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

21 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

22 THE CLERK: Commissioner Evans is absent/excused.
23 Commission Petracco.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

25 THE CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye. Here.

2 THE CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for
3 Commissioner Evans. He's absent/excused.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Madame Clerk.
5 Bills.

6 THE CLERK: The bill is for Tuesday, December 6th,
7 2016. Public Affairs \$98,484.39; Revenue and Finance
8 \$11,166,392.28; Public Safety \$38,633.12; Public Works
9 \$640,857.18; Parks and Public Property \$741,161.03; total
10 payroll \$854,963.79 for a grand total of \$13,540,491.79.

11 I need a motion, please.

12 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Move it.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

14 THE CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

15 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

16 THE CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

18 THE CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.

19 COMMISSIOENR PETRACCO: Aye.

20 THE CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

22 THE CLERK: That's it for bills, Mayor.

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Public comment on agenda items
24 only. Read the notice.

25 THE CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

1 All persons addressing the board of commissioners
2 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone
3 and provide their name and address for the record. Unless
4 further time is granted by the board each person shall limit
5 their address to three minutes. All remarks to the board
6 and its individual members must be addressed to the Mayor.
7 The Mayor may defer citizens' comments to the appropriate
8 member of the board. Dialogue between citizens and others
9 addressing the board shall be allowed unless the mayor,
10 presiding officer or the majority of the membership of the
11 board shall determine that the interest of decorum and/or
12 the expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
13 adversely affected by such dialogue.

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
15 the board of commissioners on agenda items only?

16 MR. VERCELLI: (Inaudible), 78 Edison Avenue. I
17 have a concern on the violation (inaudible). I don't see
18 any leveling. (Inaudible) recycling here.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We have a public -- we have a
20 public hearing on that.

21 MR. VERCELLI: Okay.

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I --

23 MR. VERCELLI: I thought that was the start of it.

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: No. We'll start the public
25 hearing in just a minute. All right.

1 MR. VERCELLI: Oh.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So you can stay right there
3 because it's not going to be long. Sorry about that.

4 Anybody else on agenda items only?

5 Seeing none, any announcements, board of
6 commissioners?

7 The only thing I would like to say, I would like
8 to thank everybody, all your departments and all the
9 commissioners for all your help with the tree lighting
10 ceremony. It went flawlessly. It looks beautiful and I
11 want to thank you all for all your help because without you
12 we couldn't (inaudible) appreciate that.

13 Public hearings.

14 This is a public hearing on Ordinance Number 3349.
15 I'll open the public hearing.

16 MR. VERCELLI: All right. You want me to
17 do the whole spiel again or --

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Sure.

19 MR. VERCELLI: Anthony Vercelli, 78 Edison
20 (inaudible). Just in regards -- there's a lot of rules
21 (inaudible) violations, something like minimum 250, maximum
22 1,000 and/or jail time. But there's nothing in here about
23 warning letters --

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anthony, I can tell you
25 that --

1 MR. VERCELLI: -- (indiscernible) programs.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- running the recycling
3 department that our policy is not to be punitive. This --
4 this ordinance is being changed to comply with the county
5 ordinance so that it's standardized throughout the county.
6 We don't do anything punitive to enforce recycling. We
7 figure it's better to do it with a carrot than a stick. So
8 although there may be some things in here that are probably
9 unenforceable in my opinion, it's just to change the
10 ordinance to comply with the county so (indiscernible)
11 throughout the county, each municipality.

12 MR. VERCELLI: So is there any protection
13 (inaudible) enforcement agent if I leave my bin out at 7
14 p.m. at his discretion?

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Like I said I -- we've --
16 I've been doing recycling for eight years. We've never
17 fined anybody.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And I --

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It's not going to happen.

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- I don't think we've ever
21 locked anybody up for leaving a bin out yet, so.

22 (Laughter)

23 MR. VERCELLI: Well, I have --

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So I don't think you're going to
25 be the first.

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah. I wouldn't worry too much
2 about that.

3 MR. VERCELLI: Then why have it on paper?

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Like I said we have to comply
5 with the county ordinance. It's done by every municipality
6 --

7 MR. VERCELLI: Is every municipality different --

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: No. Every municipality is
9 --

10 MR. VERCELLI: -- and it's our choice?

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- standardized
12 (indiscernible). What it does do, though? Just come back,
13 Anthony. For commercial accounts it does give the county
14 authority to come in and fine people on commercial accounts
15 for not complying. If they're not recycling at all and have
16 the county recycling inspectors come in to some of the
17 commercial accounts and warn them and then fine them.

18 MR. ODRIA: I would just like to comment on this.
19 When you passed this and finalized it you all have authority
20 to impose those 250 to \$1,000 fines. And -- oh, Michael
21 Odria from 133 High Street. You all -- if this gets passed
22 you all have the power to impose these fines and also
23 imprison people if this -- this ordinance gets passed. You
24 will have the power to do that, correct?

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: True.

1 MR. ODRIA: Absolutely correct?

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: True.

3 MR. ODRIA: Okay. That's what I wanted the
4 people to know in this town. I just wanted to make sure.
5 All right.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else want to be heard on
7 Ordinance Number 3349?

8 MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive. My
9 question concerns the recycling coordinator. On our Nutley,
10 New Jersey.org website it states that the recycling
11 coordinator for the municipality of Nutley itself, Raro (ph).
12 On the NJ.gov DSHW recycling website it says that the
13 municipal recycling coordinator for Nutley is Patty Davis
14 recycling coordinator. And on the ordinance it requires that
15 if anyone for instance has a disability and is unable to
16 follow the new ordinance due to a disability or whatever, to
17 contact the township recycling coordinator and submit
18 documentation saying they cannot recycle.

19 So I guess I'm looking for clarity as to who is

20 Nutley's recycling coordinator? Do we have one or two?

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Sal -- Sal Ferraro is the
22 recycling coordinator. The website you quoted before, NJ
23 what --

24 MS. LANDRY: Dot gov. That's the State of New
25 Jersey --

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- is out of date.

2 MS. LANDRY: Well, okay. Well, it says it was
3 the 2016 because it was also --

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Out of -- out of date.

5 MS. LANDRY: Okay. Well, can I make a request
6 that someone contact the State of New Jersey --

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We will -- we will contact the
8 state, but obviously we have no control over what they put on
9 their website.

10 MS. LANDRY: Oh, okay, because it was all
11 municipalities for all townships. Okay.

12 And I understand that this is about tonnage, that
13 a certain amount of money is provided through the tonnage
14 grant from our recycling which was called the Recycling
15 Enhancement Act and that 60 percent of the money collected
16 is distributed through the annual recycling tonnage grants
17 program to municipalities.

18 The last number that I was able to find was the
19 2007 Nutley tonnage award grant and it was for \$29,585.64.
20 And according to the law it says that all grant monies
21 received by a municipality shall be expended only for its
22 recycling program. Therefore, the grant dollars you receive
23 from the recycling tonnage grant must be used exclusively
24 for recycling purposes. Purchasing items made from
25 recycling content which are not used for recycling purposes

1 are not eligible. While no specific exhaustive list exists,
2 they do list some things which are acceptable.

3 So my question is for the tonnage grant for 2015
4 how much did Nutley receive for 2015?

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I don't have that number, Ms.
6 Landry, but I can tell you that the tonnage money goes into a
7 trust account --

8 MS. LANDRY: All right.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- used for recycling, not used
10 for (inaudible).

11 MS.LANDRY: And how -- and in what way is it
12 used for recycling?

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: To purchase the recycling
14 bins that we give away. Also to fund the calendar that we
15 send out.

16 MS.LANDRY: Fund a calendar?

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The calendar for the recycling that
18 you get every year in the mail.

19 MS. LANDRY: Could we save that money and just
20 put it on the website? Have we looked --

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Not every --

22 MS. LANDRY: -- at doing that?

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Unfortunately, not everybody is
24 -- has a computer or accesses the website. So we still send
25 that out by mail.

1 MS. LANDRY: We send it to every home?

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI : Every home.

3 MS. LANDRY: Eight-thousand homes. Could we opt
4 out of receiving one on --

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: If you would like to opt out,
6 we can take you out of the list. Sure.

7 MS. LANDRY: Okay. I mean, it would be nice, I
8 mean, because it's an expense that we could put into --

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's paid for out of --MS.

10 MS. LANDRY: -- something --

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- that grant that's
12 provided to promote recycling.

13 MS. LANDRY: Okay. And when was the last time we
14 won one of the state recycling awards because I notice they
15 have awards every year? When was the last year?

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: 2013.

17 MS. LANDRY: '13? Okay. So you don't --

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We won several awards that
19 year.

20 MS. LANDRY: So you don't know -- do you know
21 how much we -- the tonnage grant was in --

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I don't -- I don't have that
23 off the top of my head, Ms. --

24 MS. LANDRY: Is it -- is that information
25 anywhere available to taxpayers?

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We can get that to you.
2 Sure.

3 MS. LANDRY: Could I call you?

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: You can call me. You can
5 e-mail me.

6 MS. LANDRY: Okay. So we have two things. We're
7 going to possibly contact the state and take Ms. Patty Davis
8 off as recycling coordinator, and we are going to look at
9 having citizens be able to opt out of receiving a recycling
10 calendar paid for by the grant money, and you're going to
11 provide me, if I call or e-mail you, with the tonnage amounts
12 for the last couple of years.

13 Thank you.

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: You're welcome.

15 Anybody else like to be heard on Ordinance Number
16 3349?

17 Seeing none I move we close the public hearing.

18 COMMISSIOENR TUCCI: Second.

19 THE CLERK: Commissioner Rogers.

20 COMMISSIOENR ROGERS: Aye.

20 saying as far as not (inaudible) at that
21 (inaudible) taxes.

23 recycling program. However you decide to promote that,
24 whether it's (inaudible) obviously informs people, giving
25 away recycling bins helps people comply. Those are the

1 things (inaudible).

3 wanted to be clear on that, that it's not -- what a lot of
4 the grants that Nutley gets, you know, we get quite a few in
5 (indiscernible) departments and especially in public safety,
6 those grants -- that grant money is not necessarily for
7 salaries or what we would like to offset our tax burden on.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They offset some costs of the
9 recycling (inaudible) that, but the grant money may also
10 offset some of the costs. So it may actually (inaudible).

24 and provide their name and address for the record. Unless
25 further time is granted by the board each person shall limit

1 their address to five minutes. All remarks to the board and
2 its individual members must be addressed to the Mayor. The
3 Mayor may defer citizens' comments to the appropriate member
4 of the board. Dialogue between citizens and others
5 addressing the board shall be allowed unless the mayor,
6 presiding officer or the majority of the membership of the
7 board shall determine that the interest of decorum and/or
8 the expeditious conduct of municipal business are being
9 adversely affected by such dialogue.

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
11 the board of commissioners this evening?

12 MR. ODRIA: Michael Odria, 133 High Street.

13 Govern -- I'm sorry. Wrong word. Mayor
14 Scarpelli, a couple of weeks ago you asked me about my
15 property taxes from 1999. I'm here to give you the
16 clarification because I finally got my OPRA.

17 1999 I ended up paying \$5,803 that year. By 2003
18 it went down to \$5,180 that year. After that it skyrocketed
19 130.6 percent. I just wanted to give you that clarification
20 because since you asked me that question publicly, I did not
21 forget. And I just wanted to let you know I followed
22 through on my part.

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Michael.

24 Anybody else like to address the board of
25 commissioners this evening?

1 MR. ALESSIO: Good evening. Carmine Alessio, 81
2 East Center Street.

3 I was here a month ago and I was talking about the
4 empty lot next door to me (inaudible) addressed it with the
5 tax assessor as being an empty lot, but it's basically used,
6 rented out as a transit station to a couple of contractors
7 who dump debris and all of that (inaudible), whatever they
8 do. They're contractors. They -- they store blocks and
9 trailers.

10 And they were issued a variance in order to park
11 the trucks in the rear back part of the lot which I believe
12 is illegal because I -- the last time I was here I stated
13 some state statutes that basically say that when you
14 purchase the property, okay, you have to show some -- a site
15 plan to revitalize it, not just hold on to the property and
16 speculate that maybe you can hang onto it to do this type of
17 dumping activity.

18 So the last time I was here I wound up talking
19 about the statute, New Jersey SA 55:19-78 which falls under
20 the nuisance law. Okay. It's -- and it's deemed to be a
21 vacant property for the purpose of this section. That's --
22 that's just the category of the law.

23 And I -- I left off with that. But -- and I did
24 talk to Commissioner Evans who happens to be -- well, he's
25 in charge of code enforcement privately numerous times. And

1 this is like the second time I've been here and he hasn't
2 been here. I hope he's -- everything's okay. But I really
3 doesn't -- don't think it matters if he's here or not
4 because when I spoke to him I feel that his department
5 should have jumped on this initially instead of like doing
6 absolutely nothing. Okay.

7 Now we're going to talk about the Nutley
8 ordinances. A public officer is in violation of C-
9 40:48(2),(3). This is in reference to the use of the
10 property there. 40:48-2.12(s), Title 40, states that the
11 municipal and county ordinances to regulate maintenance,
12 security and upkeep of certain residential property which is
13 not being enforced.

14 I OPRA'D and I tried to stay on top of this to
15 follow through because this has been like this since 2002.
16 And nothing seems to get done. It just, you know, I go make
17 my complaint and because the person there has a special
18 interest, the Cafones (ph), they seem to get away with
19 running property to the ground. I guess their agenda is to
20 chase me out so maybe they can get my property. But I'm
21 just surmising that. I -- I can't think of any other reason
22 why they're -- they would be getting away with actually
23 dumping debris, grass, stench, storing trailers and all of
24 that stuff like I initially complained about.

25 Which is a violation on the code enforcement for

1 not enforcing it. The owner was given notice of the
2 violation. Public officials never followed through. This
3 notice constitute proof that the property is vacant and it
4 falls under abandoned. It's not actually abandoned, but
5 like I said before it's used seasonally and it's open 24
6 hours a day, used as a -- as a -- kind of like a municipal
7 parking lot for the people to park their cars next door and
8 there's night activity there like I stated at the last
9 meeting, but I only get five minutes of time and I'm trying
10 to like get it all through with the help of Mayor Scarpelli,
11 maybe he can let me go over a couple of seconds. I would
12 really appreciate that.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It's getting late, Mr. Alessio

14 MR. ALESSIO: Anyway, Mr. Mayor, the property is a
15 vacant lot and abandoned. That's the category it falls
16 under, the subsection of C-46:10(b)-51. Okay. 40:48-
17 2.12(s) public officer is guilty of not imposing a municipal
18 fine.

19 Now fines don't really mean, you know, aren't the
20 way to go. You -- it's supposed to -- you're supposed to
21 deal with your -- you know, people who purchase property and
22 try to work things out. That's what I've been trying to do
23 for the past 16 years is try to be -- do the right thing.
24 But now I'm forced to come over here and spill my guts out,
25 which I'm -- I'm -- this is only the beginning. Okay.

1 That's my whole point is fines are on everything,
2 but after 14 years like I said something has to be done
3 here. I'm getting all of the varmints. I went through
4 this, the vernom (sic), mice, all of that stuff. Okay.

5 So the day after I left this meeting the last time
6 I noticed a flatbed dropping a trailer in the back rear part
7 of the lot, okay, a stationary trailer. So it seems to be
8 that they're storing equipment back there now. And it's not
9 getting any better. Okay. Every time I make a complaint it
10 seems that all -- well, it doesn't even (indiscernible).

11 But they -- they seem to be vindictive in moving
12 closer to my fence which when they get back the illegal
13 variance which I call illegal because I believe and know it
14 is that they were supposed to camouflage the area so that
15 you couldn't see all of this stuff back there. Besides
16 there's no bathroom back there and, you know, it's a little
17 annoying to see, you know, what they do there when they've
18 got to go to the bathroom.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Wrap it --

20 MR. ALESSIO: But anyway --

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Wrap it up, Mr. Alessio.

22 MR. ALESSIO: It's -- I'm going to wrap it up now.
23 Okay. So like I said, the code enforcement sent Frank
24 Gabriel down there. He's taken pictures of my property. So
25 I go out there. I says, well, what are you taking pictures.

1 You can do anything you want. I said, they undermined my
2 wall. The tree that's dead over here is hanging, falling
3 over the trailer because Mr. Cafone won't move the trailer
4 so I can trim it because I live there, you know. In fact,
5 it could fall on the trailer. I got the police reports and
6 that that they don't want to move the trailer in spite of me
7 asking. That's what I surmise. Okay.

8 Now when the tree falls, that's okay because, you
9 know, what's on your side you cut. But it looks like hell.
10 Okay. And I -- and there's mosquitoes there. A month and a
11 half ago I went to the health department, spoke with Mr.
12 Rogers. They sent a worker down there. Wham, Bam, nothing
13 gets done. The county comes down there. Okay. I call the
14 county and this person had the telephone and on a voice mail
15 and he thought he hung up, but he's saying, I'm not getting
16 involved in this guy's problems, what do you think of that,
17 you know, and I'm hearing all of this. You know, it's like
18 -- it's like --

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Mr. Alessio.

20 MR. ALESSIO: You know what? We have to drain the
21 swamp right here in Nutley and make sure that the
22 Petraccodiles (sic) do not come back because I'm not --

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you.

24 MR. ALESSIO: -- getting anywhere --

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Mr. Alessio.

1 MR. ALESSIO: -- with this.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Wait. Wait. Wait.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's enough.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What guy don't come back did he
5 say?

6 MR. ALESSIO: The Petraccodiles.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: The what?

8 MR. ALESSIO: The Petraccodiles.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What is that?

10 MR. ALESSIO: When you drain the swamp you got to
11 get rid of the people who are making the mess.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Alessio that's enough.

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So are you saying that --
14 are you saying that I'm making a mess here Carm?

15 MR. ALESSIO: No. I'm not -- did I say that?

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh, I thought you said the Petracco
17 --

18 MR. ALESSIO: Oh, was it -- I thought -- I'm
19 sorry.

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Alessio, that's enough.

21 MR. ALESSIO: Maybe crocodiles.

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Good night. That's enough.

23 MR. ALESSIO: I'm sorry.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: If you have something to say I
25 would be glad to talk to you anytime you want. If you want

1 to step outside we could have that conversation, too.

2 MR. ALESSIO: What are you referring to?

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: No, because if you're referring to
4 me --

5 MR. ALESSIO: The Petraccodiles I said.

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What is a Petraccodile?

7 MR. ALESSIO: It's a -- it's a part of the family
8 of the crocodiles. They keep -- they --

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So then you weren't referring to
10 me?

11 MR. ALESSIO: No.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: All right. That's enough, Mr.
14 Alessio.

15 MR. ALESSIO: But they're Petraccodiles.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's enough.

17 Anybody else like to address the board of
18 commissioners this evening?

19 MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive.

20 Would it be possible to disclose which board of alliance --
21 board of education municipal alliance members were present in
22 the backroom executive session meeting prior to this meeting
23 because it was announced in that meeting that you were having
24 a meeting with the board of ed municipal alliance?

25

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I could tell you who is
2 scheduled to come.

3 MS. LANDRY: Okay. And -- but they weren't here?

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Are you talking about tonight?

5 MS. LANDRY: Yes.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

7 MS. LANDRY: Yeah. Tonight.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We're going to executive session
9 after this meeting --

10 MS. LANDRY: Okay.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- and we're going to meet with
12 they're calling themselves MC squared now, so --

13 MS. LANDRY: Upson Square?

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They have a different name than
15 Municipal Alliance. They've changed the name --

16 MS. LANDRY: To what?

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: MC squared. I don't know
18 exactly what the M and the C --

19 MS. LANDRY: MC squared and what would that be?
20 Who are the members of MC squared?

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: They are Mr. Kucinski (ph), Mr.
22 Carnicella (ph), Mr. Ferraro (ph) and Ms. Sherman. And then
23 Ms. Yeamens (ph) who is the (indiscernible) will be here and
24 the superintendent will be calling in.

25 MS. LANDRY: Okay. And the purpose of the

1 executive session?

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Genitempo (ph).

3 MR. GENITEMPO: Property acquisition and contract.

4 MS. LANDRY: Property acquisition and contract.

5 MR. GENITEMPO: We're still -- we're still
6 involved in property acquisition.

7 MS. LANDRY: And this is property acquisition
8 different from the Davis property and the Ciccolini (ph)
9 property.

10 MR. GENITEMPO: (Inaudible) reveal that. That
11 would be revealing (inaudible).

12 MS. LANDRY: Okay. So you had said before it was
13 different. Now you're saying you can't reveal it.

14 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm not saying it is different or
15 it isn't different. I can't reveal it otherwise --

16 MS. LANDRY: Okay. So have we actually completed
17 purchase of the Davis property and the Ciccolini property?

18 MR. GENITEMPO: The township has completed the
19 purchase. Correct.

20 MS. LANDRY: Okay. So then you're meeting with MC
21 squared about property acquisition.

22 MR. GENITEMPO: Correct.

23 MS. LANDRY: So I could probably assume since the
24 other two properties have been purchased that this is new
25 property, correct?

1 MR. GENITEMPO: Wish I could tell you. But when
2 we --

3 MS. LANDRY: Okay.

4 MR. GENITEMPO: -- can tell you we will tell you,
5 I promise.

6 MS. LANDRY: Okay. Thank you very much.

7 Well, I'm glad they changed their name because the
8 next thing is about the Nutley municipal alliance as it
9 relates to the governor's council on alcoholism and drug
10 abuse which funds the municipal alliance for Nutley.

11 The committee members as I was given by our town
12 clerk for the 2014 19 grant cycle and the grant cycle was
13 for a total award of \$44,000, the OPRA for current members
14 of the municipal alliance committee are Alphonse Petracco,
15 Thomas Strumolo (ph), Russ Lazovick (ph), Lisa Casilli
16 (ph), Dana Mellillo (ph), Michael Padilla (ph), Rich Spector
17 (ph), Adam Jernick (ph), Reverend Jill Finski (ph), Johnny
18 Carino (ph), Gary Lewis, Anthony Iannerone (ph), Linda
19 Diacheysn (ph), Felicia Gardner, Hasimi Kujack (ph) and
20 Sandra Carella (ph).

21 Now I spoke with two members on this list who said
22 that they were not aware that they were members and they had
23 never attended a meeting. I also sent three e-mails to
24 Commissioner Petracco who I believe the municipal alliance
25 falls under, but he did not have time to meet with me before

1 this meeting which is why I am here.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Excuse me (inaudible) --

3 MS. LANDRY: Part of the Governor's council -- I
4 have five minutes. Part of the Governor's council on
5 alcoholism and drug abuse states that there are certain
6 criteria for building the municipal alliance committee in
7 order to receive funding. And it did -- the program does
8 have a coordinator. Sam Carella is paid \$3,300 as a stipend
9 to make sure that the program follows what the state
10 outlined insofar as the Governor's council on alcohol and
11 drug abuse for receiving these funds and for building the
12 program within the municipality.

13 So I am just here asking you, Mayor, that we take
14 a look at the municipal alliance committee. We look at its
15 composition because at one of the previous meetings Ms.
16 Carella did state that the municipal alliance was only
17 township employees and I would like to see us open that up
18 and have a municipal alliance committee that reflects the
19 way that other municipalities set theirs up, and I did send
20 links to other township municipal alliances and how they're
21 set up and how they're run to Mr. Petracco, but he did not
22 respond.

23 Thank you for listening.

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner, do you want to
25 address --

1 MS. LANDRY: Thank you.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- Ms. Landry?

3 MS. LANDRY: It doesn't need to be addressed.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, I would like to -- I would
5 like to make a comment --

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's not your choice.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you.

8 MS. LANDRY: (Indiscernible).

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you, Mayor. Not a
10 problem. When did you send me the e-mail?

11 MS. LANDRY: (Indiscernible).

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Ms. Carella. Sure.

13 MS. CARELLA: (Indiscernible Carella, 19 Dogwood
14 Lane. I responded twice, Pennie. I told you he was not
15 (inaudible). Twice. Okay. Excuse me. Twice. Okay. Oh
16 (inaudible).

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: She --

18 MS. LANDRY: And who are you?

19 MS. CARELLA: I said my name.

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: She stated her name. But
21 --

22 MS. CARELLA: Yes, I gave my address.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So, anyway, we'll be glad
24 to look into that for you. As soon as I'm feeling better
25 and done with my radiation, Pennie, I'll be glad to get back
to you.

1 It will be several weeks, though. Okay.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thanks, Commissioner.

3 MR. ODRIA: I'll make this quick because I know
4 you guys got to do something. Mayor Scarpelli, can you
5 please ask Mr. Genitempo --

6 ALAN GENITEMPO: State your name.

7 MR. ODRIA: Oh, I'm sorry. Correct. Michael
8 Odria, 133 High Street. After observing this
9 conversation, please ask -- Mr. Mayor, please ask Mr.
10 Genitempo why won't he tell the people, especially the
11 homeowners in the Town of Nutley, if the board of ed is
12 looking to acquire more property.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, do you want to answer
14 that?

15 MR. GENITEMPO: Sure. Sure. (Inaudible) understand the
16 purpose of executive session?

17 MR. ODRIA: Somewhat.

18 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm -- well, the purpose is to be
19 able to discuss confidential matters that may impact the
20 town, but have to be done in confidential session because if
21 it gets out it could affect the ability to negotiate a deal,
22 to obtain property. If someone found out that we were
23 looking to purchase or maybe obtain a property with the
24 board of ed, wouldn't that make the property perhaps more
25 valuable to someone and buy it out from under us? So do you

1 see the reason why we can't always reveal everything in
2 public session?

3 When the time comes where we can reveal it to the
4 public we will as we have constantly. And we produce our
5 minutes. We produce the minutes of the meeting. When it's
6 not confidential anymore like we did with the Davis
7 property, like we did with the Ciccolini property we reveal
8 it. That's the purpose of executive session.

9 MR. ODRIA: Okay. The reason why I'm concerned is
10 because when this town purchases a property you purchase it
11 with our tax dollars.

12 MR. GENITEMPO: I know, Mr. Odria. We use tax
13 payer funds (indiscernible) money to purchase property. Of
14 course that's what we're going to do.

15 MR. ODRIA: And what I'm trying to do is do my best
16 to help you guys to do nothing that will allow our property
17 taxes to go up next year.

18 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm sure --

19 MR. ODRIA: And when --

20 MR. GENITEMPO: -- (indiscernible) appreciated.

21 MR. ODRIAS And the only reason why I could see
22 us buying more property for our board of ed for some school
23 or something else is probably because we're building more
24 apartments in this town which is forcing our overburdened
25 public school system to burst. So we're going to need more.

1 What I'm trying to say is I'm just tired of all
2 these new apartments being built. (Indiscernible) want to
3 keep it so that it doesn't affect our property taxes because
4 they keep going higher and higher every year because, you
5 know, (indiscernible) it's going to be 12,000, then 20,000 a
6 home, then 30, then 33,000, then when does it end. That's
7 why I'm concerned.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Mr. Odria. Can I have a motion
to go to executive session?

9
10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Motion to move to executive session

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

12
13 THE CLERK: Whereas, Section 8 of the Open Public
14 Meeting Act (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975) permits the exclusion
15 of the public from meeting in certain circumstances; and

16 Whereas, the public body is of the opinion that
17 such circumstances exist; and

18 Whereas the board of commissioners of the Township
19 of Nutley, in the County of Essex, in the State of New
20 Jersey desires to proceed to closed executive session; and

21 Now therefore be it resolved by the Board of
22 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, moving to closed
23 executive session to discuss contract negotiations and
24 property acquisition.

25 Be it further resolved that at the time when such

1 discussion may be disclosed to the public shall be when and
2 at such disclosure may be made without adversely affecting
3 the Township of Nutley pending and/or anticipated legal
4 personnel contractual matters and other matters within the
5 exceptions provided for by statute.

6 Commissioner Rogers.

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

8 THE CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

10 THE CLERK: Commissioner Petracco.

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

12 THE CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

14 THE CLERK: The time --

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We will be coming back on the
16 public record, but no action will be taken, just for the
17 record.

18 THE CLERK: The time is 9:43.

19 (Pause)

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Need a motion to adjourn.

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Motion to adjourn.

22 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Second.

24 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

25 THE CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

1 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

2 THE CLERK: Commissioner Petracco left at 11:35.

3 Commissioner Scarpelli -- Mayor Scarpelli.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

5 THE CLERK: And the time is now 11:35.

6 (Whereupon, at approximately 11:35 p.m. the
7 meeting concluded.)
