I have a question concerning Resolution No. 32-7 and Resolution No. 33-17. Viridian Environmental Consultants. Which, in the pre-meeting, it was said that this was for removal of tanks. Could you, please, provide the location of the tanks for the change order for \$1,296 and also the tanks or the properties that fall under the

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contract for \$15,000?

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COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I can answer that. There are several. This is a -- this is cleaning up the paperwork and this is for the tank that was located here; all right, in this building. It was off on the side in the driveway. So, that's what the first ordinance is for and named the change order for \$1,296.25.

MS. LANDRY: And is that additional to the original contract?

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes, it is.

MS. LANDRY: And what was the original contract?

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: It was 44,935.

MS. LANDRY: So, it's now \$45,000 to remove one tank from the side driveway?

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: It was one tank. It was the excavation. It was getting rid of the soil, the contaminated soil and it was all the reporting and all the cleanup that -- that's associated with that as far as the paperwork is concerned.

MS. LANDRY: Okay. Thank you. And then the -COMMISSIONER TUCCI: The second one is to continue
the work and, primarily, now, we've achieved success in just
about all of the buildings with the exception of the Public
Works Department, the garage. So, we are concentrating on
that now to get rid of the tanks that are there.

I believe we still have an oil water separator 1 that's in the ground and we are beginning that process so we 2. 3 can be free and clear of this finally. 4 MS. LANDRY: Okay. So, these are additional contracts to the environmental contracts that we have entered 5 into for the Davis property and the Ciccolini property? 6 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: These have nothing to do with 7 those properties at this point in time. MS. LANDRY: We have additional environmental 9 contracts for those two properties then? 10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I know of no environmental 11 12 contracts for those properties. 13 14 MS. LANDRY: You don't know of any? 15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Nothing -- no. Nothing that 16 I'm dealing with right now on either the Davis property --17 MS. LANDRY: Okay. It is really second to none what the Nutley Police
Officers have done to engage with the students and our
children around this community to extend a hand of

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friendship to this kids that this way they know who their police officers are and, instead of running away from them, they will be running to them.

And just to make a really sound comment of what I learned today from the Governor and from the LEAD program, and maybe the Mayor will remember this, is when Governor Christie said to the sixth-grade class at Washington School; you are the most important people in the room. Not the reporters. Not the elected officials. But the children of the classroom, all the sixth graders.

And how do we beat these opiates and drug abuse and heroin, in this town and every town across this State and in America? By our children. And if we could convince our children not to try drugs and not to do them, that's how this epidemic will stop.

So, if there's a way that we could educate our children and, it starts at home, of course, of not to ever try drugs, recreational or for any other use, but to stay off them. Just think what 20 years from now what this State will look like.

So, again, Mayor, thank you. Commissioner Tucci, thanks for your support. Obviously, I know Commissioner Evans couldn't make it and, Steve, thanks for always being there for us in town.

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I'd like to say that the LEAD

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program under Commissioner Petracco, which he probably didn't want to say, but I'll say it; you've become a model for the rest of the State and I understand it's headed in that direction.

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And, I'll tell you what, Commissioner Petracco. I sit here and I remember when you took office. You really dug your feet in with regard to drug abuse. You really did. And you've been very consistent for the many years that you sat here. And you didn't let up. You did not let up.

And you started with the HOPE program and all types of other programs. So, I'll tell you what. It's just proud to be here sitting here with you and knowing what you've done to help the young children of the community after all these years.

So, God bless you for that. Thank you.

MS. LANDRY: Pennie Landry, 135 Lakeside Drive. The first thing I'd like to say is I'd like to congratulate

Commissioner Petracco, Mayor Scarpelli, Detective Padilla,

Sam Carella, all of those who were involved in having the

Governor come today to our Town and also for the great things that are being done with the LEAD program.

And to add to this, I'd like to say that I read an article today which touched me by an ER doctor and, basically, what he said was, he questioned why are we more worried about gluten than heroin. He said that heroin is now something that children of the middle and upper class

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should be warned about.

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Our state of mind in regards to heroin has largely been; I am as worried about heroin as I am about my son being eaten by a lion in my front yard. He continues, as an ER doctor, let me be the one to tell you the lion is in your yard.

I spoke with a 28-year old Nutley High School graduate two weeks ago. Seven of her classmates have died due to drug overdoses. In a small town like Nutley, seven from a graduating class is really high.

So, I agree with reaching out to the sixth graders. I also think that we need to expand our reach into our younger and our older adult population because, as Governor Christie explained today to the sixth graders, he explained that four out of five heroin users started with prescription drugs.

Since September, 2016, I have been coming here and attempting to meet with Commissioner Petracco and with the town leaders. I was so excited because finally Chief Strumolo (ph) had Detective Padilla call me and confirm that we had a meeting for Wednesday, February 8th.

I sent a confirmation email on Monday, February

6th to Detective Padilla and in it I stated that there would

be a Nutley parent joining us, a Nutley District staff

member, who had had her superintendent -- I mean, who had

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had her principal change her lunch so she could attend and then also another Nutley citizen homeowner, who works in New York, who would be joining us by phone.

I prepared an agenda that we all agreed upon and, unfortunately, yesterday, I received a call from Detective Padilla saying that the meeting had been cancelled. I asked him why the meeting was cancelled and he said that he would not send me an email stating why and that I had to discuss this with Chief Strumolo.

I sent two emails to Chief Strumolo and placed two calls to Chief Strumolo and was not returned. I also sent two emails to Sam asking to meet with Commissioner Petracco concerning this and I, as of this time, do not have a meeting date for myself and the three other adult women, homeowners of this community, who would like to be involved in some program.

So far, I have requested that the meeting dates for the municipal alliance meetings be made public and I was told that they are still being scheduled.

I have asked about other meetings where individuals, concerned citizens, can get involved and have gotten no response.

So, I am here pleading, begging with you, as our town leaders, that you open up, too; that there are many people in this community who want to contribute to programs
