MAYOR SCARPELLI: You ready? Ready?

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I'm ready.

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Madam Clerk.

MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

Board of Commissioners Public Meeting, Tuesday,
April 4th, 2017. The time is 7:05.

Commissioner Rogers?

COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci.

COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Evans is absent
excused.

Commissioner Petracco?

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

MAYOR SCARPELLI: Here.

1 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for Commissioner
2 Evans. He's absent excused this evening.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Petracco, what do
4 you have on the agenda this evening.

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Let's see. That's that.
6 So, I have a public hearing I believe?

7 MADAM CLERK: Yes (inaudible). Yes. Public
8 Hearing.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, let's see where I'm
10 at.

11 MADAM CLERK: River Road.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

13 (Pause)

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Let me just see. Okay.

15 So, I have -- this says an introduction here. Oh,
16 and then I have to go out in public hearing. Okay.

17 I have, as you all know, I've been going back and
18 forth with the chief and all our professionals, traffic
19 safety, with this permit parking and also we just had a
20 couple streets added on down by River Road because they've
21 had a problem, an issue with it. We can't do it as a --

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, we're not doing permits
23 down on River --

24 SANDRA CARELLA: No.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- Highfield Lane, right? No.

1 SANDRA CARELLA: No.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: No.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Just the two-hour parking.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay.

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But I'm sure that's going
7 to lead to that also.

8 So -- and those are the two, I guess, we had to
9 introduce separately. So, that's why that's on there.

10 And, then, I have the public hearing tonight on
11 the one that we introduced on March 7th. I don't have that
12 in front of me here. But that's the -- (inaudible).

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Here it is.

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh.

15 SANDRA CARELLA: No. No, the River Road.

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you.

17 (Pause)

18 SANDRA CARELLA: That's the (inaudible).

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh, this is the River Road
20 one, yeah.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: This is actually -- was a
23 clerical error in the last time; is that correct? Wasn't
24 there an issue then we reintroduced it?

25 THE CLERK: We -- yes. We corrected it.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Because it was the west
2 side we listed --

3 SANDRA CARELLA: Right.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- instead of the north?

5 THE CLERK: Right. It was -- yes. It was just a
6 clerical error.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right. So, that's this
8 one.

9 And, then, I have the Edison Avenue. What are the
10 names of the streets. I don't have them in front of me.

11 SANDRA CARELLA: Edison and -- Edison Avenue,
12 Oakley Terrace --

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Uh-huh.

14 SANDRA CARELLA: -- and, then, the two-hour
15 parking discussion on --

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: White Terrace?

17 SANDRA CARELLA: (Inaudible) no.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: This (inaudible).

19 SANDRA CARELLA: Yeah. Just like
20 (inaudible).

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: This Highfield Lane.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Uh-huh.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And what's happening is
24 they sent us a petition. I don't know if you all guys got a
25 copy of it. But this -- you know, I think the best way to

1 go about this is just to keep letting them get the petitions
2 and, as they come in, to handle them on a case-by-case.

3 Because the problem with -- what's going to
4 happen, and our former chief and Commissioner Rogers, when
5 you were there at the police department, what this tends to
6 do is just push the problem down to the next street, you
7 know, until --

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We did East White Terrace,
9 right?

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: At some point?

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So, now, it's Highfield. So --

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- Nutley (inaudible) --

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And, you know what? I
17 mean, the thing is is that I -- you know, I guess, how do we
18 hope for this is that, you know, it becomes where it's just
19 too far for them to walk and, then, you know, they make
20 other arrangements --

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and hopefully another
23 bus stop will have a little bit more parking.

24 But, I have to tell you, it's definitely not a
25 win-win situation. So, it's --

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: No.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- we're going to make
3 some people happy --

4 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: You need to go on a case-by-
5 case basis. That's what (inaudible).

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: That's why I'm doing it
7 case-by-case and --

8 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Nothing wrong with that.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and just -- yeah. And
10 just to let you all know, if it needs to be changed, that we
11 could change it back. That's what we could do.

12 But the issue with the pilot program, which I
13 really wanted to do with the stickers, with the decals, was
14 there was no way that we can enforce it per --

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: But we --

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Alan you got involved with that also.

17

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- we have to do an ordinance
19 but that doesn't mean we can't --

20 ALAN GENITEMPO: You have to do an ordinance.

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- revisit it, right, at six
22 months or a year or whatever?

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. No, no, no. We
24 could -- the thing is --

25

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I mean, we have to do an
2 ordinance obviously to be able to enforce it. But, I guess,
3 my question is, you know, how long do we want to, you know,
4 based on what we said, do we want to come and revisit that
5 in six months or a year, and say; how's it working?

6 Because, in the meantime, what are you going to do
7 if you get other requests? Are we going to say; well, we
8 want to see what -- I'm asking. I'm not --

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Are we going to see how it's
11 working with -- there first or are we just going to take
12 them case-by-case and --

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. I mean, you know --

14 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- proceed down the road?

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Look. I was at length,
16 you know, with a lengthy conversation with the chief this
17 week. It took up a lot of our time, you know, going back
18 and forth, you know, especially with the decals and, you
19 know, I said to Tommy; the issue that we have as a board of
20 commissioners, and I know we're all on the same page, is --
21 what does that do to the overnight parking. Does that open
22 the door?

23 And Tommy's thing is; listen, guys. You guys
24 control it. So, if we don't believe in it, we -- at that
25 time --

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

2 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: -- we -- as it comes
3 up --

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I don't know if you've hear it
5 yet --

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- we say, no.

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- but I have one -- I had one
8 person already come to me and say; oh, are you guys going to
9 do overnight parking, too?

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I said; not as long as I'm here.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yep.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. That'll impact the
14 crime rate negatively.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: No. Well, I think as a
16 board of commissioners, Commissioner --

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- that we're all on the
19 same page that --

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah.

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- we do not want
22 overnight parking --

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Right.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- you know.

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I totally agree with that.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I mean, especially like,
2 you know, I own some properties in Lyndhurst --

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and it's a lovely town.
5 But I have to tell you, when it snows there, it's like a war
6 zone.

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.

8 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You know, with all --
9 because they don't get those cars off the street.

10 So, I think that, you know, what the chief's
11 comment was was that we just have to have the ability to say
12 yes to what we all agree on and say no to what we don't.

13 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You know, it's simple.

15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Well, wait. Are we going to
16 revisit this at six months or -- I'm sure you're going to
17 report on it.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. I mean, we're going
19 to --

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: After six months --

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- we're going to keep our
22 eye --

23 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- and say; listen, this at
24 six months this is where we're at. It's -- you know, this
25 is what we're encountering. It's good. It's bad. It's --

you know.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. Well --

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Negligible.

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- what's (indiscernible)
4 is that the decals are going to, you know, that we're doing
5 on that --

6 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Right.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- is then -- is going to
8 get down to the people on Nutley, you know.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Absolutely. And I agree with
10 that.

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You know. And that's
12 going to be the next step.

13 So, I don't know how you guys want to attack that.
14 I mean, do you -- are we going to just do Edison for now and
15 (indiscernible) --

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, I think --

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- or -- and, then, see
18 how it goes?

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- I would say, and this is only
20 my opinion, I would like to wait six months before we do any
21 other street just to get a clue of how it's going with
22 enforcement; with, you know, the time it takes for the
23 police to do it --

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- you know --

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, in the letter -- in
2 the letter our chief wrote, and, again, this is not a
3 priority like our two-hour parking --

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Uh-huh.

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and if we're not going
6 to add any manpower to that, you know, to enforce it, you
7 know, and, truthfully, really the only time we go, is when
8 we get a call, a complaint, you know, for the most part, you
9 know, unless it's --

10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I got -- excuse me, so, how
11 does this work? How does it work?

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: As far as --

13 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Let's say I live on Edison
14 and I get this.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So, right now, you're
16 getting a decal.

17 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Okay.

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So, what you're going to
19 have -- and I agree with this and I know --

20 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- we talked to that
22 little group after the meeting and you're onboard with --
23 they're going to get a decal. So, they're not going to be
24 prohibited to park on the street longer than two hours.

25 If they live there, in that area --

1 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Right. (Inaudible).

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- they're -- they'll get a
3 decal and when the police officer goes, if there's a call or
4 if they're doing enforcement there, if they see the decal in
5 the window, they're going to --

6 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Okay.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- they're going to say;
8 okay. That person lives on that street. He's okay.

9 The other thing that we talked about is that let's
10 say that, you know, on White East Terrace, right now,
11 there's a -- there's two-hour parking prohibited over there
12 because of -- with the bus stops they're doing there.

13 Now, what happens if a guy that's living on Edison
14 happens to jump on the bus there? We spent a lot of work
15 and time on this. It really gets involved. You know, and
16 he goes and parks over there. Now, in some communities that
17 we looked into, they use different color combinations. This
18 is one side of town, this and that. I do not want to get
19 involved in that.

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah. That's --

21 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: So, the decal is only for the
22 people that live on Edison and Oakley.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right now.

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Just there. It's not carte blanche for
25 anyone to park anywhere there's two-hours?

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: No. It's right --

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Two-hour parking?

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right now -- because we're
4 going to see how this works.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Right.

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: We're going to do it there
7 but, let me just say this before I forget.

8 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: All right. Go ahead.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But, in the future,
10 because I'm sure that those people now are going to come to
11 us at the next meeting and say; well, I want the decals,
12 too.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Right.

14 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But what happens like when
15 the guy from Edison, Mauro, goes and parks on White Terrace
16 and, you know, from the chief's advices, he's like; listen,
17 if they're Nutley residents and they're parking there, I
18 would let it go because that's when you're going to have a
19 lot of --

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Hard to enforce --

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh, yeah. A hardship and
22 you're going to have cops instead of taking care of our town,
23 they're going to be like, you know, marking tires and trying
24 to figure all this stuff out.

25 So, I think it should be more consistent. Decal,

1 if the guy's a Nutley resident, and he's jumping on the bus,
2 I think we should waive that.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Right.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: And, just a question on
5 procedural, are you like going to do like license plates so
6 that, you know, a guy's -- or are you just going to say, a
7 guy says; listen. I need three. I got three cars. Are you
8 going to -- how are you going to --

9 SANDRA CARELLA: There's three cars. It's
10 three cars.

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: How do we -- is it in the
12 ordinance?

13 SANDRA CARELLA: (Inaudible), right. No. We have
14 an application that we're going to -- and we modeled them
15 after a few different towns.

16 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So, we can take a license plate
17 numbers --

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: And permit three -- yeah.

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- or something like --

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: (Inaudible) --

21 SANDRA CARELLA: And they have to have
22 verification that they live there. I mean, it's a whole --

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So, it's a -- do you have
24 an application or --

25 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I have a question for

1 counselor as you're looking at that.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Okay.

3 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Are there any possible chances
4 of discrimination and legal issues that we could run into?

5 ALAN GENITEMPO: I don't know about the word
6 discrimination. But I think the concern that you may have is
7 you may be not effectuating the purpose that you want.

8 If someone on Edison, as the Commissioner says,
9 wants to park on East White Terrace, and now he's clear to --
10 he or she is clear to do so, you've defeated the whole
11 purpose of letting the residents park on their own street if
12 it's going to work the next time.

13 So, you know, I think you might have cross
14 purposes here. It might be difficult. I think --

15 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: What if we put the name of
16 the street on the sticker? I know, it's -- it sounds
17 complicated but --

18
19 ALAN GENITEMPO: You could do that.

20 SANDRA CARELLA: Well, it will be on the
21 sticker.

22 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Oh, it will be. So, Edison
23 will have Edison --

24 SANDRA CARELLA: Yes.

25 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: -- so

--

1 ALAN GENITEMPO: Oh, okay.

2 SANDRA CARELLA: Yes.

3 ALAN GENITEMPO: Well, that makes it
4 easier to enforce then.

5 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: -- all right. That solves
6 your problem.

7 SANDRA CARELLA: Yes.

8 ALAN GENITEMPO: So, if someone from Edison parks
9 on East White Terrace, they would not be exempted from the
10 --

11 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. So, they'll just be
12 exempt from the two-hour parking on the street that's
13 designated. Not --

14 ALAN GENITEMPO: That's what I think. I don't
15 know if that's what --

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Well, that's not what I'm
17 hearing.

18 ALAN GENITEMPO: Yeah. But I'm not sure if the
19 Commissioner --

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: What are you -- I'm sorry.

21 (Laughter)

22 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Or your color code, you know.

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. No. I actually --
24 Sam was just saying about putting Edison Avenue.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's the -- I think we got the

1 kiss method here. Getting is simple.

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: (Inaudible).

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I think the simpler, the
4 better.

5 I don't think that we're going to put the
6 street --

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: But, if you get the permit
8 and -- if I live on Edison.

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: And I get a permit. And you
11 say; okay. Here. You're awarded a permit. All right.

12 And, then, I take the bus to go to wherever on
13 River Road and I park on East White; is my permit good over
14 there on East White?

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, that's exactly --

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: (Inaudible) --

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- what we talked about.

18 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Is it good on Rhoda?

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: That's --

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: So, it's not so it's good
21 (inaudible) it's good anywhere where they --

22 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah. You see that --

23 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It may be.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But I --

25 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I mean, it's a start.

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Let's -- I think that's why --

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I don't want to read too much
3 into this either.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah.

5 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I -- let's give it a chance.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Let's give it a chance.

7 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Let's give a shot.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Let's give it a start. Let's give
9 it a start and see --

10 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: But I don't see our attorney
11 smiling here.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: But I would be -- I would like
13 to see --

14 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah. We see (inaudible).

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- before we expand it, at least
16 a trial period here.

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: So, it'll work out all the --

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah.

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Because there's going to be, you
21 know, some hiccups. We just know it.

22 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: We just want answers, you
23 know.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh, no. Listen.

25 ALAN GENITEMPO: My concern is that we're

1 not going to enforce it because someone's a Nutley resident,
2 which I could totally understand. What prevents someone on
3 Alexander from saying; I'm a taxpayer. I'm a Nutley
4 resident. I want a sticker to park somewhere, you know?
5 And that's where you're going to -- you may have a difficult
6 time enforcing it.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well -- but, you know
8 what, Alan? I think that's what the chief was -- his
9 comments were was -- where we have to, as a board of
10 commissioners, say; no. We're not allowing that.

11 ALAN GENITEMPO: Yeah. No. If you limit the
12 stickers to a particular street, you have better control over
13 where they're going to be allowed to park. That might be a
14 better way to go.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So, you're saying put
16 named -- put the --

17 ALAN GENITEMPO: Put the street on it. If you're a
18 resident of Edison, your sticker says Edison and you --
19 that's where your exception is, on Edison.

20 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: That's where you --

21 ALAN GENITEMPO: So, you could park -- the whole
22 idea is to park in front of your house, right? So, you're
23 not -- you're not --

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Well, I mean, I'm only -- I can
25 only talk from a practical point of view and I'm certainly

1 not the chief or -- but, you know, if, say, you know, two
2 years down the road and we have fifteen roads with this
3 going on. That's going to be, I think, a nightmare for the
4 police officer trying to check and see to make sure that
5 they're on the right street and just ---

6 SANDRA CARELLA: Well, that's why Bloomfield did
7 color coordinated like certain streets --

8 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.

9 SANDRA CARELLA: -- were yellow; certain streets
10 were -- like Edison would be yellow. Oakley would be orange.
11 But, then, we figured to start that, it would be (inaudible)
12 --

13 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Well, it's a start. But, as
14 the counselor said, what's going through my mind is the
15 person who lives on Edison needs to get the bus on East White
16 Terrace or wherever and they park their car there, then
17 you've got 40 cars --

18 SANDRA CARELLA: Right.

19 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: -- you know, I mean, I'm
20 obviously I'm exaggerating. But --

21 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Right.

22 SANDRA CARELLA: It defeats the purpose of
23 (inaudible) --

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Well, that came up with
25 the chief.

1 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Steve and that was one --
3 and what his recommendation was that if we make it too
4 complex, then it's going to be a burden.

5 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yeah.

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: He recommended --

7 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Okay.

8 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- at the time, he
9 recommended that, you know what, if you're a Nutley
10 resident, and you're parking on that street, you're a Nutley
11 resident. Let's let it go.

12 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Okay.

13 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And see where this takes
14 us.

15 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Okay.

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: At the time -- you know, I
17 think -- I do think like if you start putting street names
18 on there, or color code it --

19 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Right.

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- and you got different
21 shifts there, I mean, you know, we could get through it but,
22 again, I don't want to have a cop, you know, studying this.
23 I want them --

24 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: (Inaudible) for an hour,
25 yeah.

1 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- you know what, over a
2 parking thing.

3 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: It makes sense.

4 Hey, look, it's a -- you could always change it.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: And this is --

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: -- this is why sometimes, I
8 mean, you know, I know the residents came here with a
9 petition and it sounds easy, right? Well, why can't you
10 just do it?

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: No.

12 MAYOR SCARPELLI: It's not easy.

13 ALAN GENITEMPO: Well, let's look at the
14 ordinance because I think it answers the question.

15 It says; resident's vehicles that have obtained
16 and display a resident parking permit decal shall be exempt
17 from the two-hour limit parking from 8 a.m. to 6, only on
18 such street where the vehicle is registered and after
19 complying with the following provisions.

20 So, if there -- and you have to produce proof of
21 registration.

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Oh, Tommy put that in.

23 ALAN GENITEMPO: So, that will -- that
24 should limit them only to the streets on which they live.

25 So, if they park on East White Terrace and someone from East

1 White Terrace --

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Okay.

3 ALAN GENITEMPO: -- complains, they would get a ticket.

4

5 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: (Inaudible) --

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. So, we'll start it
7 like that then.

8 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: (Inaudible).

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: But it's not simple, right?

10 It's --

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Listen. It's easy for us
12 to sit here in suits and ties. We're not the cop in the
13 rain getting out of the car --

14 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Right.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- of the car and all that
16 stuff. But, you know what? The cops are pretty happy right
17 now. So, we're going to --

18 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: They should be.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- get our biggest bang out -- for our
20 buck out of them.

21 (Laughter)

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Sorry. I had to throw
23 that in.

24 (Laughter)

25 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I'm a riot.

1 (Laughter)

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER 2: So, (inaudible)
3 application.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: So --

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Rogers -- do you
6 have anything else on the agenda, Commissioner?

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I think I have some
8 resolutions --

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Oh, okay.

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- as well.

11 Okay. I have an appointment of -- on Adriana
12 Russo (ph) as our interim administrator at the municipal
13 court for one year. She's taking Patti Conroy's (ph) place,
14 unfortunately, for our court system.

15 And I have authorized to advertise for sealed bids
16 for the purchase of police and crossing guard uniforms --

17 MADAM CLERK: And equipment.

18 ALAN GENITEMPO: And equipment, as she
19 said.

20 MADAM CLERK: I'm sorry. Yeah. And
21 equipment. It's in the resolution.

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Okay.

23 ALAN GENITEMPO: But it should be there.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And the bids will be
25 opened and read on Wednesday, April 26th at 3 p.m.

1 And that's all I have. Thanks for the time.

2 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Can I just ask one more
3 question about your court administrator?

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yes.

5 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Why are you doing a one year
6 interim?

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: You know what, when I
8 read this today --

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Just to see --

10 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: -- today --

11 SANDRA CARELLA: I think that came from the
12 judicial that -- because Joanne got that wording from them.

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: So, Al Restaino wanted that?

14 SANDRA CARELLA: I guess unless we --
15 because she got the wording directly from that.

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I know there's conflicting
17 rules because --

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah.

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- we talk about that, you know, and
20 that (inaudible) --

21

22 SANDRA CARELLA: Oh, we've had to because I wrote
23 something.

24 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: -- the court rules and the
25 civil service rules and --

1 SANDRA CARELLA: She got it directly from
2 them. So, I assume that that's their law.

3 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Okay. It's a good answer.

4 SANDRA CARELLA: She has to also be fine with all her
5 certifications and that has to be done within the first
6 year of her employment.

7 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. I don't think she's
8 fully certified.

9 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Oh, she doesn't -- she's not
10 fully certified?

11 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: That's why the --

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Because she's (inaudible)
13 she was a deputy. She's almost done.

14 ALAN GENITEMPO: -- their naming her as an
15 interim, an interim administrator.

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Oh, okay.

17 SANDRA CARELLA: So, she has to get all
18 her --

19 ALAN GENITEMPO: So -- which you're allowed to
20 under the rules as long as you're performing the
21 certifications.

22 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Uh-huh.

23 SANDRA CARELLA: So, that's probably another reason why they
24 would make it a year.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay. That makes sense.

1 Thank you.

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: And that's all I have.

3 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you, Commissioner.

4 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yep.

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Commissioner Rogers, since you
6 have nothing on the agenda, would you take Commissioner
7 Evans' resolutions?

8 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yes.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you.

10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: You're welcome.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I see he's got an authorization
12 to issue a duplicate tax certificate for Block 101, Lot 4;
13 authorization to refund 2016 senior citizen property tax
14 reductions; authorize to grant full property tax exemption
15 for a disabled vet; a temporary appropriation, emergency
16 temporary appropriation for the budget and a temporary
17 appropriation for the water utilities.

18 Commissioner Tucci?

19 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yeah. I was just asking
20 Commissioner Rogers if we're eligible for that senior
21 citizen property tax deduction.

22 (Laughter)

23 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I just got my AARP card
24 out. COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I think you got it when you were
25 50. Who are you kidding?

1 ALAN GENITEMPO: I think your income --

2 (Laughter)

3 ALAN GENITEMPO: I think your income's too high.

4 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: You had it. That card's
5 yellow, Steve. Come on.

6 ALAN GENITEMPO: Your town salary puts you over
7 the top.

8

9 (Laughter)

10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: That's it. You don't have
11 an income.

12 (Laughter)

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Your town salary puts you
14 over the top.

15 (Laughter)

16 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: You (inaudible) the right
17 income.

18 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: All right. I have a shade
19 tree report for March. I have an award of contract to
20 Viridian Environmental Consultants and this is the
21 underground storage tank saga that's continuing and,
22 hopefully, coming to an end soon.

23 I have an authorization for sealed bids for a
24 tractor, a loader, and a backhoe. Actually, it's a Kubota
25 with all these different attachments.

1 And, then, I have -- let's see, one, two, three,
2 four, five resolutions that I will consolidate, if it's okay
3 with everyone, to salute and congratulate our Nutley Jaycees'
4 Business Man of the Year, John Monaco; Civic Affairs
5 Recipient, Linda Buset; our Educator of the Year, Lynn
6 Zazzali; our Public Safety and Health Award Recipient,
7 Marianne Zurawski; and our Outstanding Young Man of the
8 Year, Salvatore Scarpelli.

9 And that's all I have.

10 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody know that last guy?

11 (Laughter)

12 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: I think I saw him once. I
13 don't know.

14 (Laughter)

15 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: A good looking guy. Very
16 smart.

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: He takes after his mother.

18 (Laughter)

19 MAYOR SCARPELLI: That's what she said.

20 (Laughter)

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I have an authorize for a
22 contract with Paul Ricci and the Ricci Planning for the
23 Zoning Board of Adjustment; authorize and approve various
24 raffle licenses and authorize to -- for sealed bids for
25 purchase of asphalt.

1 That's it. Madam Clerk.

2 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor. We have, this evening,
3 we have minutes from March 7th and March 10th to be approved
4 and for communications The Nutley Hockey Booster Club wants
5 to do an event on a Sunday as well as the Knights of
6 Columbus. They're requesting permission to hold a Sunday
7 raffle.

8 And that's it for -- on my end.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Genitempo?

10 MR. GENITEMPO: I have nothing.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: All right. It's in your packet
12 is the Historic Preservation Ordinances. There was lots of
13 questions that we had on the last meeting. So, I asked
14 Mr. Genitempo to reach out to the Historic Preservation
15 Committee to come to the next meeting so if we have any
16 questions, that they could answer them, you know, and I
17 think that's the best -- rather than moving forward with
18 this, I think we need some questions answered first.

19 Do you agree?

20 MR. GENITEMPO: I am. I haven't heard back but
21 I'll try to set it up for the next meeting.

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Okay.

23 MR. GENITEMPO: I'm assuming you want to do it in
24 a conference session.

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Conference session.

1 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Mr. Mayor, I'd like to have
2 literally a five-minute executive -- and it will be five
3 minutes, involving a sensitive public safety issue.

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: (Inaudible).

5 MR. GENITEMPO: It could be a security issue.

6 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: So, you have a security --
7 yeah, okay.

8 MR. GENITEMPO: Yeah.

9 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Motion.

10 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Yes.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Second?

12 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Second.

13 MADAM CLERK: WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open
14 Public Meeting Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 permits the

17 AND, WHEREAS, the public body is of the opinion
18 that such circumstances exist.

19 AND, WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the
20 Township of Nutley, in the County of Essex, State of New
21 Jersey desire to proceed to a closed executive session.

22 AND, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board
23 of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley will move into
24 closed executive session to discuss security. Al? Alan?

25 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Security, yeah.

1 MADAM CLERK: Security.

2 MR. GENITEMPO: Security issues, yes.

3 MADAM CLERK: Security issues.

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a time when such
5 discussion may be disclosed to the public shall be when and
6 such disclosure may be made without adversely affecting the
7 Township of Nutley (inaudible) and/or anticipate legal
8 personnel (inaudible) and other matters within the exception
9 provided for by statute.

10 Commissioner Rogers?

11 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

13 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

14 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

15 Commissioner Petracco: Here. Aye.

16 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Seven twenty-six.

19 (Whereupon, the meeting was adjourned for executive session)

20 (Public Meeting Session Begins)

21 (Pledge of allegiance)

22 MADAM CLERK: Where is the light?Where's
23 the lights? Is there a light?

24 (Pause)

25 MADAM CLERK: No light?

1 (Pause)

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Madam Clerk.

3 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

5 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: The Knights of Columbus Holy Family
9 Council is requesting permission to hold a Sunday Raffle on
10 August 6th, 2017 at 1 o'clock at the Holy Family Church on
11 28 Brookline Avenue.

12 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Move it.

15 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

16 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

17 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

18 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

20 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

21 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

22 MADAM CLERK: And that's it for communications,

23 Mayor.

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Reports. Commissioner Tucci.

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Yes. I have a shade tree

1 report for March of 2017.

2 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Thank you. Bills, Madam Clerk.

3 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor. Bill list for Tuesday,
4 April 4th, 2017; Public Affairs, \$79,410.21; Revenue and
5 Finance, \$2,404,097.27; Public Safety, \$42,441.84; Public

13 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

14 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

16 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

17 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

19 MADAM CLERK: And that's it for bills, Mayor.

20 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Before we get to public comment,
21 we have three boy scouts here today and we'd like them to
22 stand up. They're here to get their merit badge and observe
23 a meeting. So, thank you guys for coming. And I hope you
24 have an enjoyable day listening to us. Thank you.

25 (Applause)

1 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Public comment on agenda items
2 only. Madam Clerk, please read the notice.

3 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

4 All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners
5 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone,
6 provide their name and address for the record.

7 Unless further time is granted by the Board, each
8 person shall limit their address to three minutes.

9 All remarks to the Board and its individual
10 members must be addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer
11 citizens' comments to the appropriate member of the Board.

12 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing
13 the Board shall be allowed, unless the Mayor, presiding
14 officer or the majority of the membership of the Board,
15 shall determine that the interests of decorum and/or the
16 expeditious conduct of municipal business are adversely
17 affected by such dialogue.

18 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
19 the Board of Commissioners on agenda items only?

20 State your name and address for the record.

21 MR. DEFILIPPIS: It looks like it's just me.

22 Good evening, Mayor Scarpelli and members of the
23 Board of Commissioners. My name is John Defilippis. Madam
24 Clerk, if I can give you a hand with that, it's
25 D-E-F-I-L-I-P-P-I-S.

1 MADAM CLERK: Thank you.

2 MR. DEFILIPPIS: And I'm at 101 River Road here in
3 Nutley.

4 I am the president of the Board of Directors of
5 the Sleepy Hollow Condominium Association and I just want to
6 thank Commissioner Petracco for drafting this ordinance. I
7 believe it's Ordinance 3353, if I'm not mistaken. The
8 parking on River Road, that is a major, major safety issue
9 for our residents. So, on behalf of our community, I want
10 to thank you for drafting this ordinance.

11 And I just wanted to ask about the process from
12 here. I have had conversations with Ms. Pettas (ph) and,
13 thank you, again, for being so dutiful and following up and
14 communicating with me.

15 MS. PETTIS: No problem.

16 MR. DEFILIPPIS: I believe this will take effect
17 in 20 days; is that correct?

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I believe so.

19 MR. DEFILIPPIS: Okay. And, if it takes effect in
20 20 days, what would be a reasonable timeframe for you to
21 install the signs and the yellow curbs. Could that be done
22 in May or would it take longer than that?

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Yeah. We actually work
24 with DPW with that. So --

25 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Yeah. As soon as -- as soon as

1 the ordinance is passed, we get the work order. We make
2 sure the 20 days are up and, then, it'll be done, you know,
3 within that time period.

4 MR. DEFILIPPIS: With -- you mean after the --
5 after the 24th.

6 MAYOR SCARPELLI: After the 20 days. After the 20
7 days.

8 MR. DEFILIPPIS: After the -- okay. So, is May a
9 reasonable expectation? Only because I'm going to get
10 questions from residents here.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: The yellow curbs, as soon as it
12 gets warm and we can paint. But certainly the signs will go
13 up.

14 MR. DEFILIPPIS: Okay. Thank you very much.

15 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thanks for coming out. We
16 appreciate it.

17 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else want to be heard on
18 agenda items only?

19 Seeing none, can I have a motion to close the
20 public comment?

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Second.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

23 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

24 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

1 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

3 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

4 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

5 Board of Commissioner announcements.

6 Commissioner.

7 MAYOR SCARPELLI: I have two announcements. One,
8 this Saturday, April 8th, we will have rigid plastic
9 recycling. Those are the big plastic items, sliding boards,
10 kitchens that go outside, the chairs that you may sit on
11 during the holidays outside. That will be in parking lot one
12 -- or parking lot eight.

13 And, then, shredding day will be April 15th,
14 apropos. Come out and have your bank statements, your tax
15 forms, anything of a sensitive nature and it will be
16 shredded by a reputable shredding company and you don't have
17 to worry about those private matters.

18 Anybody else? All right. Let's go to ordinance
19 introductions. Commissioner Petracco.

20 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you.

21 My first ordinance introduction is the one that is
22 regarding Edison Avenue and Oakley Terrace. After a lot of
23 review with my administrators in public safety and our chief
24 of police, the recommendation has come out to move forward
25 with this decal and only on these two streets for now.

1 Review it for six months and then come out with some
2 findings and see how -- if it needs to be tweaked or if
3 anything needs to be studied further, at that point, and see
4 how we move forward through the whole Township.

5 So, this is Ordinance Number 3356, an ordinance to
6 amend an ordinance codified in the code of the Township of
7 Nutley, Chapter 228, entitled vehicles and traffic,
8 particularly Article IX Angle and Permit Parking, Section 32
9 entitled Permit Parking.

10 I move that this ordinance be passed to a second
11 reading and advertised in The Nutley Sun together with the
12 notice required by law and that further consideration of
13 said ordinance for final passage by the Board of
14 Commissioners to be held at its second reading on May 11th,
15 I believe.

16 MADAM CLERK: May 2nd.

17 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I'm sorry.

18 MADAM CLERK: May 2nd.

19 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: May 2nd, 2017. I move the
20 ordinance.

21 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Second.

22 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

23 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

24 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

25 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

1 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

2 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

3 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

19 WHEREAS, the anticipated term of the contract is
20 January 1st, 2017 through December 31st, 2017.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of
22 Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
23 State of New Jersey, authorizes the contract with Ricci
24 Planning to assist the Zoning Board of Adjustment with
25 respect to applications submitted.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the business
2 disclosure entity certification and determination of value
3 will be placed on file with this resolution, and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a notice of this
5 action shall be printed in The Nutley Sun in accordance with

24 on premise 50/50 cash raffle; License No. 24-17 on premise
25 merchandise raffle; License No. 25-17, night at the races;

1 all to be held Friday, May 12th, 2017.

2 And Knights of Columbus No. 14712, Holy Family
3 Council, License No. 26-17, off premise merchandise raffle
4 to be held Sunday, August 6, 2017.

5 WHEREAS, the applications have been reviewed and
6 approved by the Municipal Clerk and the police department.

15 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

16 That concludes the business portion of the
17 meeting. Madam Clerk, please read the notice.

18 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Mayor.

19 All persons addressing the Board of Commissioners
20 regarding community concerns should approach the microphone,
21 provide their name and address for the record.

22 Unless further time is granted by the Board, each
23 person shall limit their address to five minutes.

24 All remarks of the Board and its individual
25 members may be addressed to the Mayor. The Mayor may defer

1 citizens' comments to the appropriate member of the Board.

2 Dialogue between citizens and others addressing
3 the Board shall be allowed unless the Mayor, presiding
4 officer or the majority of the membership of the Board shall
5 determine that the interests of decorum and/or the
6 expeditious conduct of municipal business is being adversely
7 affected by such dialogue.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Would anybody like to address
9 the Board of Commissioners this evening?

10 MR. DEFILIPPIS: John Defilippis, 101 River Road.
11 Once, again, I want to thank you for drafting the parking
12 ordinance. And, while I'm here, I'd like your cooperation
13 on another issue that is affecting the residents of Sleepy
14 Hollow.

15 Something that's been going on for many years and
16 still is not resolved and I'm hoping that I can work with
17 you gentlemen to resolve it.

18 In the back of Sleepy Hollow, the west end of
19 Sleepy Hollow, there's a fence and, then, there's a steep
20 hill that leads up to the recycling plant here in Nutley.

21 Now, that hill, that's the property of the town.
22 And there are a number of trees on that hill that often are
23 not trimmed in a timely fashion. Also, we get a lot of
24 trash from the recycling plant that gets blown down and
25 accumulates at the bottom by the fence.

1 I have pictures on my phone that I can show you
2 the entire landscape at this point today is littered with
3 trash and it is a quality of life issue for our residents
4 and I was hoping that someone can be appointed maybe to get
5 in touch with me. They can meet me on site. I can show
6 them, you know, the issues, the problem and, you know, we
7 can work with them, towards a resolution.

8 But it's something that's been going on for a long
9 time and I'd really like to resolve it permanently if at all
10 possible.

11 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Mr. Defilippis, I know that
12 Commissioner Tucci and I, you know, in a joint effort, make
13 an effort to clean that area periodically. It's very windy
14 up at the park. Stuff does blow around but I can tell you,
15 you know, now that the winter's over, we will definitely
16 address the trash and recycling that's blown over there.

17 MR. DEFILIPPIS: Okay. So, is that something that
18 maybe we can get on a routine schedule of sorts to -- I
19 understand it's not maybe at the top of the list of
20 priorities of the town. But it is a quality of life issue
21 for us.

22 MAYOR SCARPELLI: We understand the issue from
23 your point of view in having to look at that and we
24 certainly will, you know, make every effort to do that
25 periodically.

1 MR. DEFILIPPIS: Okay. Well, we have our annual
2 meeting next week and residents are going to ask me about
3 it. Again, what's a reasonable timeframe to expect workers
4 to come and clean that area?

5 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Two to three weeks.

6 MR. DEFILIPPIS: Two to three weeks. Okay. Thank
7 you.

8 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Anybody else like to address the
9 Board of Commissioners this evening?

10 Seeing none.

11 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: I make a motion to close.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

13 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Rogers?

14 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: Aye.

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci?

16 COMMISSIONER TUCCI: Aye.

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Before I vote, I just
19 wanted to ask the boy scouts back there; how did you enjoy
20 our meeting? And if you could get through this, you can get
21 through anything. I promise you. But it was nice to see
22 you guys. Aye.

23 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Scarpelli?

24 MAYOR SCARPELLI: Aye.

25 Good night everybody.

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
