So, we had talked about -- and remember when we through that the anticipated increase, excluding the 825,000, would increase the municipal rate by roughly \$148. That's what this third quarter resolution anticipates because I have no choice to anticipate anything else because there's -- I can't get any level of assurance yet from the Governor's Office.

I do understand that the Governor is working through adjustments to the budget to fund the pension payment that he committed to and, so, therefore, no one's willing to give a -- give a opinion one way or the other. So -- and the last conversation was, you know, maybe not until July.

So, given that, we need to issue third —quarter tax bills, right? By statute, we have to do that. And we've done it in the past. So, it's -- yes. I'm preparing a letter to go out with the -- with that for the taxpayers. But, if it does comes through, right, then, the fourth-quarter rate would be lower and we would reflect that revenue gain.
