COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 2014-04

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A DELAWARE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION TRUST FUND GRANT APPLICATION FOR SCHUTTE PARK IMPROVEMENTS - PHASE I

WHEREAS, the City of Dover intends to improve the land additions to Schutte Park that are the result of land dedicated by Stover Homes with the development of Nottingham Meadows, as well as the right-of-way associated with the former alignment of Wyoming Mill Road that will be acquired from the State of Delaware; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to request \$15,000 from the Delaware Land and Water Conservation Trust Fund (DTF) Grant Program to support completion of an American Land Title Association (ALTA)/American Congress on Surveying and Mapping (ACSM) Land Title Survey and Wetland Services to allow for land planning activities at Schutte Park to support expansion of recreation amenities; and

WHEREAS, the City has allocated \$34,700 of City funds for the purposes of this land survey, which will support the planning for the park expansion as well as efficient use of the Public Works Operations Area located at the southeast corner of the park; and

WHEREAS, the City assigns Ann Marie Townshend, Director of Planning and Community Development, to manage the project and coordinate the DTF Program requirements for reporting and reimbursements; and

WHEREAS, the City understands that parkland acquired or improved with DTF funding assistance will remain available to the public for outdoor recreation in perpetuity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council support the Delaware Land and Water Conservation Trust Fund (DTF) Grant application.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City shall abide by the requirements of the DTF Grant Program for reimbursements and stewardship responsibilities.
