COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 2012-05

**A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2010-07 WHICH VACATED AND ABANDONED CERTAIN ALLEYS AND STREETS SITUATED IN THE CITY OF DOVER.**

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2010-07, adopted by City Council on August 9, 2010 vacated and abandoned the following streets and alleys: and

- Area #1        The 100 block of North Governors Avenue Alley West
- Area #2        The southern portion of the 200 block of North Governors Avenue Alley East
- Area #3        A portion of the unit block of North Bradford Street
- Area #4        The unit block of Fulton Street
- Area #5        A portion of the unit block of Cecil Street
- Area #6        A portion of the 200 block of North Bradford Street
- Area #7        The northern portion of the unit block of North State Street Alley West

WHEREAS, the timing of the abandonment was such that the City would maintain ownership and maintenance of the subject streets and alleys until such time that they are physically altered by construction in accordance with a site plan approved by the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2010-07 was to be effective upon the filing of a revised plot plan of the aforesaid streets and alleys; and


WHEREAS, the applicant for the alley and street abandonment has requested that the street and alley abandonment and transfer of ownership occur immediately to allow the consolidation of the parcels and filing of the revised plot plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DOVER, IN COUNCIL MET:**

THAT Resolution No. 2010-07 be amended by deleting Section 4, Paragraph 1 - Timing of Abandonment and deleting duplicate Section 4 - Effective upon the filing of a revised plot.
