

WHEREAS, John J. Friedman was an active and valued resident of the City of Dover who demonstrated his commitment to his community through his participation in a variety of local organizations, including the Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce, the Rotary Club, the Inner City Cultural League, Community Partners of the Air Force Association, Delaware Veterans Post 2, and the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks 1903.
