## Heavy Trash Days on April 5 & 12

### Recycle Electronics and Shred Documents, too!

The Town's Spring Heavy Trash Day event will be held on two consecutive Saturdays in April: the 5th and 12th, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. both days. The event is free and open to Town of Plainfield residents only.

Residents may deposit acceptable items in designated dumpsters at the Town garage located at 986 S. Center Street. No hazardous waste, tires, building materials, or yard waste will be accepted. This event is provided to Plainfield residents in an effort to help keep our community clean.

The Department of Public Works is working to arrange for an electronics recycler to be on site as they did last year to accept televisions, computer monitors, fax machines, computer peripherals, DVD players and VCRs, camcorders and cameras, iPods/MP3 players, and many other types of electronic equipment (but no satellite dishes). They expect to have them available both days.

Ray's Document Destruction will be nearby in the Plainfield Community Middle School parking lot (enter on Longfellow Lane) on both days, also from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., to shred documents residents would like to dispose of.

Also on April 12, the Town will participate in Hendricks County's annual Spring Clean-Up. Locally the Town will host volunteers picking up trash along roadways and ditches in an effort to keep trash and debris out of our waterways. Commercial property owners are also encouraged to do a widespread clean

To fill out an application, go to the Town of Plainfield website ([www.townofplainfield.com](http://www.townofplainfield.com)). From the bar across the top, select Classifieds and then Employment Opportunities. Scroll down to the bottom of the page to find the available positions. Clicking on a position you are interested in will take you to a page that has a description of the job and what the essential duties and responsibilities are. If you wish to apply, click the “apply” link on the upper right hand corner of the page. Then create an account and fill out the application. ## Tox-Away Days for 2014 Announced

The Hendricks County Solid Waste Management District will provide five Tox-Away Days in 2014; one more than past years. The events are an opportunity for Hendricks County residents to properly recycle or dispose of household hazardous wastes, medical sharps, unwanted medicines, tires, appliances, computer components and electronics.

The 2014 Tox-Away Days will be held as follows:

- April 12th at the Brownsburg High School—enter from Odell Street
- May 17th at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds—enter from East Main Street
- July 26th at Hickory Elementary School in Avon—enter from State Road 267
- September 20th at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds—enter from East Main Street
- October 18th at Plainfield Middle School—enter from Longfellow Lane.

The events are open from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and are available to Hendricks County residents only. Regulations prohibit businesses from using the events.

Common examples of household hazardous wastes include: cleaners, antifreeze, fluorescent light bulbs (including CFLs), herbicides, pesticides, pool chemicals, oil-based paints and stains, fuels, mercury-containing items, medical sharps, batteries and adhesives. All household hazardous wastes are accepted free of charge and will be recycled or disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner.

### **PLAINFIELD RESIDENTS PLEASE NOTE:**

*The Town provides for the disposal of unwanted medications throughout the year. We have a drop off box at the Plainfield Police Station, 1075 W. Main St., for disposal during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). Prescription and over-the-counter medicines are accepted. All medications should be kept in their original containers. Individuals may choose to black out or remove their personal information from the container labels, but all information pertaining to the drug itself should remain intact and readable. Also please note that no illicit drugs, syringes, lancets, needles, or thermometers are accepted through the program.*
