

RESOLUTION NO.2005-45

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING DONATION OF PERSONNEL AND
EQUIPMENT FROM GEORGE WALKER

RECITALS:

1. Mr. George Walker has offered a charitable donation to provide volunteer personnel and equipment to demolish most of an existing swimming pool and related decking.
2. Any donation, whether monetary or property must be accepted by a majority of the City Council, as provided in Ordinance No. 1019.

RESOLVED:

1. A Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Othello and Mr. George Walker has been executed, which includes:

The City of Othello shall:

- A. Throughout the term of this memorandum, provide oversight and direction for Mr. Walker to perform the tasks identified.
- B. Provide Department of Labor and Industries volunteer insurance on Mr. Walker and all other volunteers.
- C. Obtain all necessary permits and permissions to permit the demolition and disposal of materials contemplated by this memorandum.
- D. Indemnify and hold Mr. Walker, and his volunteers harmless from all claims for damage arising from the volunteer work performed by Mr. Walker and his volunteers. The provisions of this Subsection shall survive the expiration, revocation, or termination of this memorandum of understanding.

Mr. George Walker shall:

- A. Provide a list of all volunteer workers to accomplish this task, together with the hours and days of work, so those workers may be covered by volunteer Labor and Industries insurance.
- B. Perform the demolition substantially as directed by the City's Public Works Director and will begin the project when mutually agreed upon by the City's Public Works Director and Mr. Walker, but shall be accomplished no later than September 2006.

2. The City of Othello hereby accepts the volunteer personnel and equipment to demolish most of an existing swimming pool and related decking from Mr. George Walker, in the approximate value of \$2400.
