Take Protective Measures

- Secure locks on all windows
- Install quality dead bolts on all doors
- Avoid displaying quality goods in windows
- Install solid construction doors and tempered glass windows
- Brightly illuminate all entrances with vandal proof fixtures
- Leave empty cash register drawers open
- Trim shrubs and trees that can conceal persons away from windows and doors
- Secure ladders and tools that could aid in gaining entry
- Install an alarm and check it regularly for failure
- Make frequent bank deposits
- Be aware of suspicious persons
- Do not work alone
- Maintain "key control". Issue keys stamped "do not duplicate" and re-key or install new locks when an employee leaves
- Post shoplifting prosecution policy, use a secure check cashing system, request ID's with credit and debit cards and install surveillance cameras

**If you SEE something,
SAY something!**

Take control of what happens in your business community and lessen your chances of becoming a victim.

Through BUSINESS WATCH, you will be making crimes against yourself and your fellow business neighbors as difficult as possible.

Business Owners working together can deter crime by:

- Communicating with each other and law enforcement.
- Sharing crime proofing methods.
- Reporting suspicious activity.
- Developing a telephone tree system to quickly share information regarding criminal activity.
- Developing signals to alert adjacent businesses when help is needed.
- Displaying BUSINESS WATCH signs.
