STAY CALM

Listen Carefully

- Give as much information as possible!
- Answer all the dispatchers questions the best you can.
- Tell the dispatcher if there is anything (like weapons, persons or situations) that may be a problem for the officers, firefighters or medics responding to the scene.

Increase awareness of driver's speed

Routine checks by Public Safety Officers, of senior citizens enrolled in this program
- **Senior Watch Call Program**
Automated calls are made to the senior citizens enrolled in this program
